

AGC ANNUAL STATISTICS 2025

2025 was a demanding yet fruitful year for the Attorney-General's Chambers (AGC) – with the highlight of the year undoubtedly being AGC's hosting of the 30th Annual Conference and General Meeting of the International Association of Prosecutors (IAP) in September 2025. Singapore welcomed over 450 delegates, including 50 Attorneys- and Prosecutors-General, from 90 countries and jurisdictions. The participants shared best practices and discussed the challenges of the world today where offenders leverage technology, innovation and efficient organisation to commit and conceal their misdeeds. Importantly, the IAP Conference provided a valuable opportunity to strengthen ties among prosecutors around the world, enabling them to collaborate in the fight against transnational crime amid an evolving and increasingly complex environment.

Forging Stronger International Ties

Beyond the IAP Conference, AGC deepened cooperation with like-minded foreign counterparts through several key initiatives. AGC renewed its partnership with Indonesia's Attorney General's Office through the renewal of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on Cooperation and signed a declaration with its regional counterparts, establishing the ASEAN Prosecutors- and Attorneys-General Meeting and creating new avenues for regional collaboration. Additionally, the signing of the ASEAN Treaty on Extradition will strengthen the legal framework for cross-border cooperation in our region. Looking ahead, AGC will continue building relationships with its counterparts through upcoming events including the Commonwealth Association of Legislative Counsel Conference 2026, where delegates will engage in robust discussions on how legal drafters can meet the challenges of an evolving legal and socio-political landscape while upholding core drafting principles and practices.

Remaining Steadfast in Domestic Priorities

Even with a year marked by international engagements, AGC maintained focus on domestic priorities. AGC's prosecutors stepped up efforts to fight crime, in particular the rise of scams, and took firm positions in areas such as drink driving, child abuse and animal abuse, ensuring that the criminal justice system protects the vulnerable and defenceless.

Another significant milestone in 2025 was the publication of the 2024 and 2025 Revised Editions of Subsidiary Legislation, which is part of AGC's ongoing universal revision of Singapore's laws to make our laws more readable, remove obsolete provisions, and bring consistency and clarity to our legal framework. 2025 also saw Singapore's first-ever Deferred Prosecution Agreement (DPA) case since the legislation for DPAs was introduced in 2018, marking a milestone in corporate accountability and bolstering Singapore's reputation as a trusted financial hub. As the nation went to the polls in May 2025 to elect its Fifteenth Parliament, AGC's officers provided round-the-clock legal support to ensure the smooth conduct of free and fair elections.

Adapting for Future Excellence

The challenges facing AGC have grown in complexity – from global instability and digital crime to the transformative impact of artificial intelligence (AI). As AI reshapes the legal profession, AGC has proactively developed bespoke AI tools tailored to its unique operational requirements. AGC's prosecutors now utilise AI-powered tools for drafting replies to representations and preparing statements of facts, while AGC's legal drafters and treaty negotiators continue to experiment with tools for Bills, contracts and treaties. While technological advances can improve efficiency, they cannot replicate the essence of a Legal Service Officer's work – knowing the business of Government, serving Singaporeans with integrity, and guarding the values of our legal profession and public service. These human qualities remain irreplaceable especially in today's complex socio- and geo-political environment.

Conclusion

As we commemorate the bicentennial anniversary of the Second Charter of Justice in 2026, I am confident that AGC will continue to serve Singapore's interests with distinction, upholding the rule of law while adapting to meet tomorrow's challenges with the same dedication and professionalism that defined a remarkable year.
