Senior Manager (Training Development) @ Pivotal Learning

Adrian started off his outdoor career working with commercial camp vendors as a freelance instructor. He then joined Republic Polytechnic's (RP) Adventure Learning Centre where he managed the daily operations of the challenge course there. After a few years, he was accepted for a teaching position in the Diploma for Outdoor and Adventure Learning (DOAL) where he was module chair of the Challenge Course Management module amongst other DOAL modules. Through this stint at RP, Adrian discovered a new interest in learning design and decided to join the Centre for Learning Systems at SAFTI where he worked on revamping soldier training in the SAF. He then decided to return to the outdoor industry by taking up a position at



Outward Bound Singapore (OBS) as a training consultant. At OBS he conducted courses including the Challenge Course Instructor (CCI) course for many External Freelance Instructors (EFI) and outdoor educators working in challenge courses today.

Adrian is also an avid climber, and he is a sport climbing and abseiling instructor in the Singapore Sports Climbing and Mountaineering Federation (SSCMF). He regularly conducts the federation's course for the public to introduce new climbers to the sport as well as the Instructor Training Course to train up future climbing instructors. He also volunteers to organize regular Community of Practice (COP) sessions for the instructor community and works on special projects with the federation to improve the quality of climbing instructors in Singapore.

Adrian's involvement with the challenge course has evolved over the years from participant, to instructor, to trainer, to manager, to programme designer. The next challenge for him is to develop himself as a reviewer and that is what he is working towards with his experience in the industry.

Attendees will receive a hard copy of the supporting documents, a list of Operation Reviewers who have been accepted to provide Operation Reviews, a list of Professional Inspectors that can provide Professional Inspections, and a digital copy of the Operation Accreditation User Manual.

ACCT's Accredited Operation presentation includes information about the program, how to get ready, what to expect in the on-site review, and what we are looking for in the additional documentation.

Raymond started his career outdoors at Changi Sailing Club as an Activity Executives after completing his national service in 1999, where he took charge of organizing sailing courses, races and sailing trips to venues such as Pulau Rawa in Malaysia.

Raymond continued his passion for the outdoors when he joined Outward Bound Singapore (OBS) in 2000 as an instructor in 2000. He served the first few years at SPARKc (a campus under the care of OBS that conducts courses for children aged 10

to 14 years old). He was fortunate to join the pioneering staff batch at SPARKc, that developed new children programme & curriculum, and operationalized the campus.

He was later appointed as Unit Head in managing instructors to ensure safe delivery of all OBS programme, including the selection of new instructors and placing them through six months of intensive training. At OBS, he also took charge of leadership and experiential programme design and marketing to schools and various institutions. He also trains outdoor leaders, which includes staff from Outward Bound centres in the region.

Raymond was transferred to People's Association Water Venture in 2009 to manage all eight water venture outlets across Singapore. His key achievement included the development of a new specialized mega club house at Marina Bay before he returned to OBS in 2013.

Raymond has been appointed Assistant Director (Safety & Quality Audits) who oversees the development of OBS Safety Governance Systems which includes safety compliances and audits. His key projects include developing the OBS Risk Management Framework and promoting safe work culture, using a customized Culture Safe survey tool.

Her passion for training and development continue to spur even after leaving the armed forces. 



The Indonesian government recognised the SWG as part of its national standards in 2019, making the SWG officially the world's most cost-efficient stand-alone sanitation system.


