

MANAGING EL NIÑO & HAZE RISKS IN YOUR OAE PROGRAMME

Understand and mitigate risks to keep your programme on track

July – October 2026: Extended High-Risk Period



BE VIGILANT

El Niño events increase heat stress and haze risk significantly



Step 1 – Before Your Programme

- Update risk management plan
- Screen participants and staff for vulnerabilities
- Train staff on heat and haze responses protocols
- Ensure Emergency Action Plan (EAP) is in place



Step 2 – During Your Programme

- Monitor WBGT and PM2.5 in real time
- Watch both staff and participants closely for signs of distress
- Apply no-go criteria when trigger points are reached



Step 3 – After Your Programme

- Debrief staff after the activity
- Inspect all equipment post-activity
- Update risk management plan with lessons learnt
- Share observations with the OAE Council
