- Establish and develop national standards for installation, operations, training and certification of most common OAE activities;
- Develop Sector Skills Framework for the professional development of OAE practitioners;
- Promote adoption of and compliance to the national standards and schemes by sector stakeholders; and
- Continue to engage with the OAE community and propose schemes, resources, pathways and other enabling structures to support growth and transformation of the sector

- 2. Thriving sector that strives to be exemplary in professionalism, continuous development, and designing and delivering quality OAE programmes.

- 2. Increasing awareness, understanding and knowledge of the future of the OAE sector

- Safety experts in the sector
- OAE leaders and advocates, driving high safety & quality
- Desire to contribute and co-create solutions
- Sectoral guidelines and support such as whistleblowing recruitment, risk framework, etc.
- New partnerships, adoption of technologies, cross industry collaborations and innovations
- Aspiration to uphold higher quality standards
- Continuous learning opportunities such as attachments, immersion programme, etc.
