ABOUT ARMY DEPLOYMENT FORCE

The Army Deployment Force (ADF) is a high readiness unit that provides Army specialised capabilities for a full spectrum of operations. ADF is also deployed for Peace Support Operations (PSO) and Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) missions.

You will be trained to provide rapid response to terrorism by supporting the Special Operations Task Force and Island Defence Task Force. Much of the training for the Guards formation will also come into play as you develop in your role here.

ROLES AND SPECIALISATIONS

As an ADF Operator, you would undergo a gruelling 14-week Combat Qualification Course (CQC), designed to train and prepare you to undertake the spectrum of ADF operations. Your physical endurance, mental toughness and combat proficiency will be tested throughout the course. After qualifying as an ADF Operator, you will be given opportunities to hone various specialisations such as medical skills, operating drones and military platforms.



ROLES AND SPECIALISATIONS

ADF was formed as a rapid-response unit, ready to respond swiftly and decisively to a full spectrum of operations in Singapore and abroad. It has specialised capabilities for a range of operations, including Homeland Security Operations, Peace Support Operations, and Humanitarian Aid and Disaster Relief. Living up to its motto, "Always Ready!", the unit stands ready to respond whenever called upon.

ADF also works closely with key partners such as Special Operations Task Force and Home Team agencies, like SPF and SCDF, to support counter-terrorism and civil contingency missions.



COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS

IS THERE WORK-LIFE BALANCE IN ADF GIVEN THAT IT IS AN OPERATIONAL UNIT?

ADF Operators generally have work-life balance. However, due to the operational nature of the unit, there will be occasions where extended hours are required, especially during operations and high-intensity training such as live firings and field exercises. We emphasise proper planning and team cohesion to help manage work-life integration.

DOES JOINING ADF GUARANTEE AN OVERSEAS DEPLOYMENT?

While ADF had participated in various peace support operations and humanitarian assistance and disaster relief missions overseas over the years, overseas deployment opportunities are opportune. Beyond overseas deployment, ADF also undertakes various local operations to ensure Singapore's security and sovereignty.

HOW DOES THE CAREER PROGRESSION LOOK LIKE IN ADF?

Career progression in ADF follows similar frameworks used across the Army, based on individual performance, conduct, and appointments held. There are numerous opportunities for capable ADF Operators to take on leadership and specialised roles within and outside of ADF.
