

ARTS AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES IN 2024

In this edition of Culture Bytes, we highlight key statistics on arts and cultural activities in 2024¹ with a focus on live performing arts, entertainment, and heritage events as published in the [Singapore Cultural Statistics 2025 Report](#).² The Singapore Cultural Statistics, published annually since 2008, provides an update on the state of the arts and cultural landscape in Singapore.

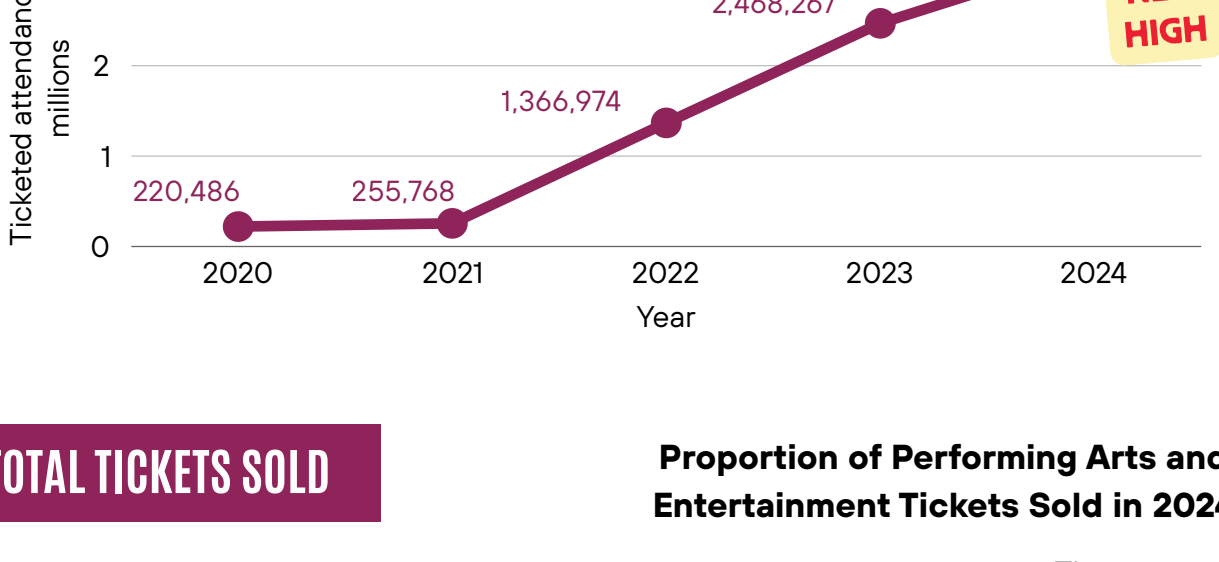

PERFORMING ARTS AND ENTERTAINMENT EVENTS

TICKETED ATTENDANCE

Live performing arts and entertainment set a new record, with ticketed attendance climbing to 3.2 million.⁸

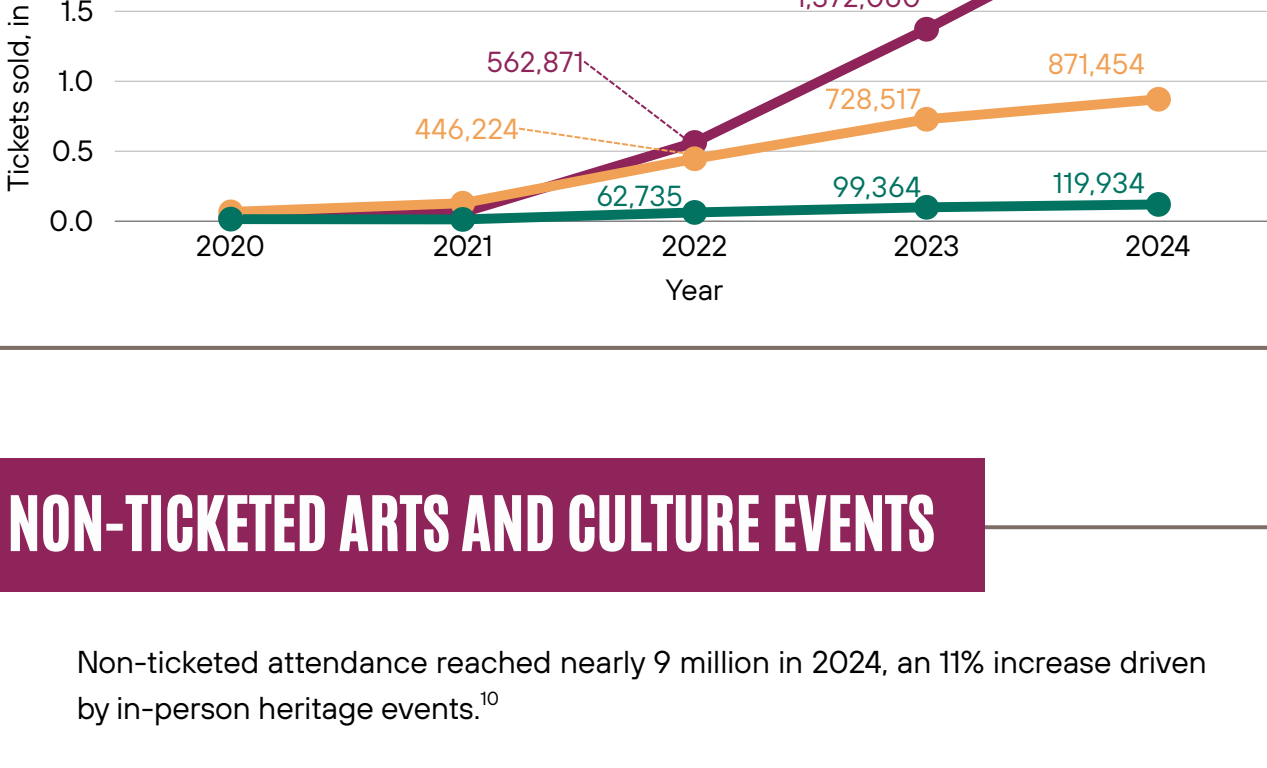
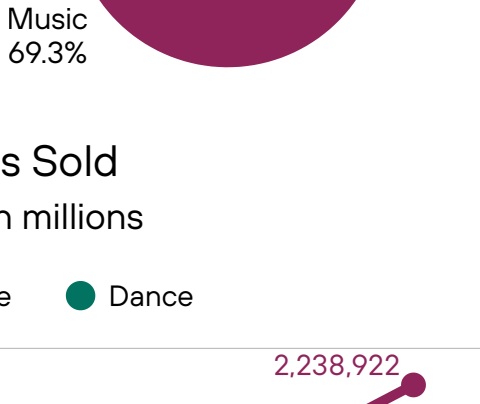


TOTAL TICKETS SOLD

Proportion of Performing Arts and Entertainment Tickets Sold in 2024

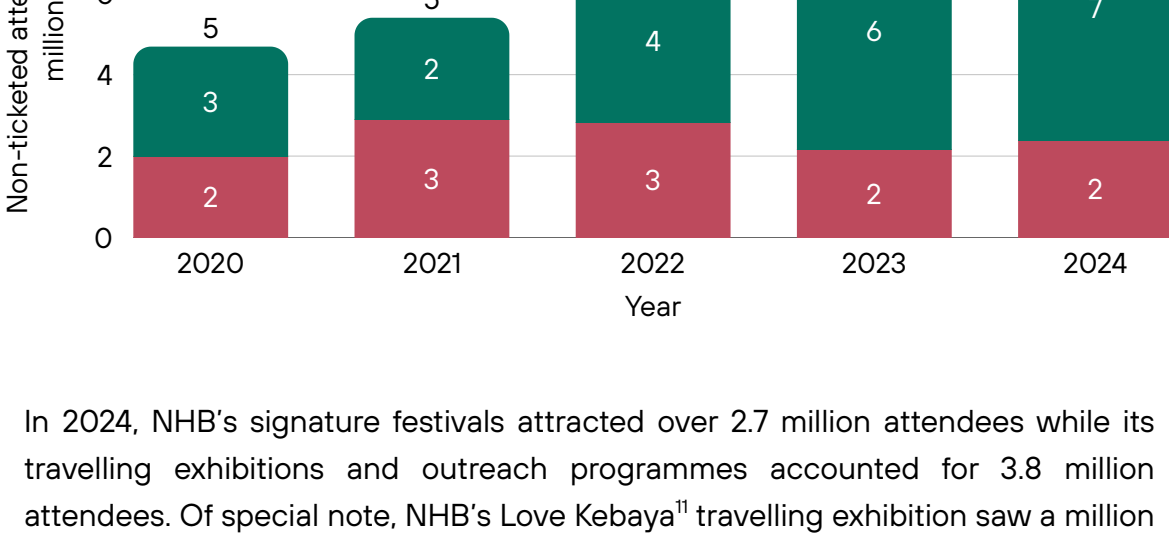
The largest growth was seen in ticketed live music.

This was due to an increase in live pop and rock concerts by international artists in 2024, by musicians such as Bruno Mars, Coldplay and Taylor Swift.⁹



NON-TICKETED ARTS AND CULTURE EVENTS

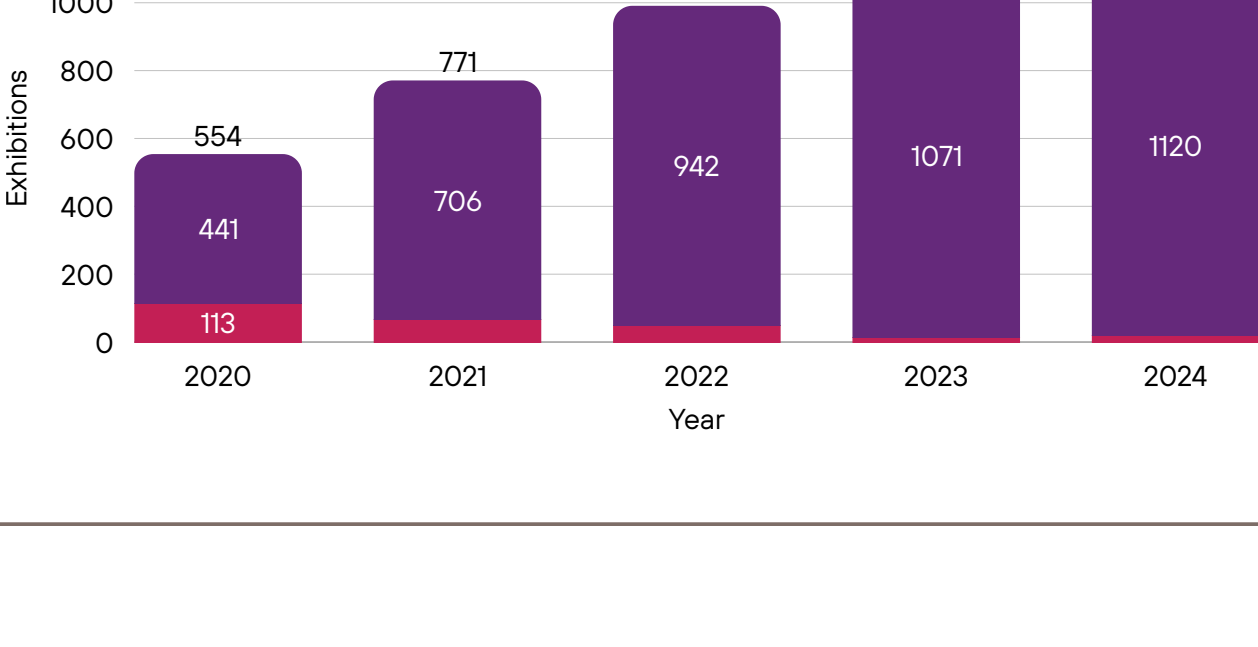
Non-ticketed attendance reached nearly 9 million in 2024, an 11% increase driven by in-person heritage events.¹⁰



In 2024, NHB's signature festivals attracted over 2.7 million attendees while its travelling exhibitions and outreach programmes accounted for 3.8 million attendees. Of special note, NHB's Love Kebaya¹¹ travelling exhibition saw a million attendees and was held in conjunction with the joint nomination of Kebaya on the UNESCO Representative List of Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity.

VISUAL ARTS EXHIBITIONS

The total number of visual arts exhibitions reached 1,139 in 2024, the highest level recorded since data collection began in 2010.⁵

Performing arts events refer to performances of folk, traditional arts and contemporary forms of dance, music (e.g. classical, traditional music etc) and theatre. Entertainment events refer to large scale performances of contemporary music (e.g. pop/rock concerts).
- 4.SCS Report 2025, Table 3: N_e of Changing Exhibitions at National Museums. A changing exhibition refers to a temporary exhibition displaying historical and contemporary art or artefacts drawn from the National Collection or external collections. Our National Museums refer to the following arts and heritage institutions: Asian Civilisations Museum, National Gallery Singapore, National Museum of Singapore, Peranakan Museum, and Singapore Art Museum.
- 5.SCS Report 2025, Table 2: N_e of Visual Arts Exhibitions. Visual arts refer to public exhibitions of abstract or representational art objects such as painting, sculpture, pottery, ceramics, creative photography, installation art and multi-media art. Applied arts such as film, graphic design, jewellery design and handicrafts are excluded. Visual arts exhibitions may be held in-person or accessed digitally through electronic media or the Internet e.g. a virtual exhibition. Exhibition days refer to the total number of days over which an exhibition is held. It does not include opening day/reception, exhibitions which are by appointment/for private viewing only, and permanent exhibitions of any museum. Total levels for 2020 and 2021 included indivisible digital and hybrid exhibitions and exhibition days data. Divisible data in 2020 and 2021 may not add up to the total.

Performing arts and visual arts interest groups refer to dance, music & vocal, speech & drama, and visual arts interest groups organised by People's Association in community clubs and residents' committees, residents' networks or neighbourhood committees.

They also refer to non-ticketed in-person outreach events organised by the National Heritage Board (NHB) and include community outreach activities organised by NHB institutions and museums, including the Singapore Night Festival and Singapore HeritageFest. Attendance figures exclude incidental viewership and events where attendance figures are unable to be determined. Non-ticketed in-person heritage events may also include some performing arts elements.
