





Age-Gender Distribution of STIs Incidence Rates (incidence rate per 100,000 population³)







Involved in At Least One Social Group¹ by Age (%)





Involved in Leadership Positions² by Age (%)















Proportion of Singles Among Resident Population by Gender and Age Group (%)





Age-Specific Marriage Rates² (per 1,000 unmarried resident males and females)



Age-Specific Divorce Rates³ (per 1,000 married resident males and females)




Median Age of Resident Live Births for First Time Mothers




