#### **About President's Challenge Fellowships**

- 1 President Tharman Shanmugaratnam launched the President's Challenge Fellowships in May 2025 to develop new approaches in the social sector, support individuals bouncing back from major setbacks, and to recognise outstanding career achievements among ITE graduates.
- 2 The Fellowships recognise and empower individuals along three tracks:
  - Civic Action: Empowers social sector professionals, and those from other sectors
    who have been active volunteers in the social field, to deepen their expertise and
    develop new approaches for achieving social good. The Fellowships enable fulltime and part-time sabbaticals over 1-2 years.
  - Springboard: Empowers individuals bouncing back from major disadvantages or setbacks in life, and are determined to overcome them. It will help them embark on new pathways, such as through education and skills or entrepreneurship training.
  - ITE Inspire: Recognises individuals who have achieved remarkable career or entrepreneurial success following a technical education background. Those chosen for this Fellowship will serve as role models and mentors for youth and others in the community, to develop themselves to the fullest.
- The President's Challenge has partnered with Quantedge Foundation, Singapore Management University, Singapore University of Social Sciences, Temasek and Temasek Foundation, Singapore Institute of Management, Institute of Technical Education and Singapore Business Federation Foundation, to support the fellowships by leveraging their expertise, networks, and capabilities.

Edmund Lek Hwee Chong (陸惠聪)

Senior Vice President, Operations, Seatrium Limited

- Started at Vocational and Industrial Training Board (VITB) to gain practical skills and industry-relevant training. Retook Olevels while at ITE to enter polytechnic, demonstrating commitment to self-improvement.
- Joined the offshore and marine industry in 1998. Rose through the ranks and became Senior Vice President, Operations, at Seatrium in 2023.
- Oversees a network of marine yards and leads complex, highvalue engineering projects for global energy clients, directing cross-functional teams.
- Attributes his success to ITE's influence instilling a 'can-do' attitude and a passion for lifelong learning.
- Provides internship opportunities and actively partners ITE on the Work-Study Diploma programme, bridging education and industry.
- Drives talent development by mentoring a diverse pipeline of early-career professionals across Seatrium's global network.

- Plans to organise yard tours and attachment programmes and provide mentorship to ITE students to gain real-world exposure and industry insights.
- Aims to co-design and sponsor short courses through the Seatrium's Digital Learning Lab at ITE, further strengthening the talent pipeline and technical capabilities of future professionals.

Mohamad Suhaimi Bin Sukiman

Co-Owner & Coffee Director, Dutch Colony Coffee Co.

- Didn't perform well in his O-Level studies as he had to juggle school with caring for his mother, who was seriously ill.
- Enrolled in ITE, but had limited course options due to his colour blindness.
- While studying, he worked part-time as a barista to pay for his school fees and partially support his family. His passion for coffee grew as he progressed, and he was motivated to make this his career.
- Launched Singapore's first carbonated cold brew (2017); introduced public education programmes like the Barista Throwdown (2009 & 2010) Public Cupping Series; authored Kopi, Coffee & Craft (2025), and was a World Barista Championship-certified judge (2013-2025).
- While in ITE, he excelled academically for the first time and gained confidence in his abilities.
- He regularly mentors students, delivers talks at ITE, conducts career talks in secondary schools and designs programmes for youth at-risk and students on the autism spectrum.

- Plans to introduce a 'Brew Your Career' programme to help students see a potential career in coffee, use it as a platform to build transferable skills, and embrace innovation and entrepreneurship.
- The \$10,000 fund will be used in areas, such as investing in equipment, and trainers to run coffee workshops for ITE students on ideation and entrepreneurship.
- His ideas include setting up a coffee cart in ITE that is run by students; setting up a podcast for ITE students by ITE students; and creating a coffee-related CCA for ITE and other educational institutions.

Jocelyn Ng Ling Hui (黄灵慧)

Assistant Director of Nursing (Nursing Education), Ang Mo Kio – Thye Hua Kwan Hospital

- Jocelyn's transformation into a distinguished leader in the healthcare sector began at ITE.
- Motivated by her grandfather's illness and her desire to better care for her family, she took up the *Nitec* in Nursing course.
- Has continually upgraded herself and has completed a Bachelor in Nursing and Master of Education. She has a special interest in caring for the elderly and a passion for nurturing future nursing talent.
- Actively contributes to the advancement of eldercare in Singapore; received multiple awards including Nurses' Merit Award (2014), President's Award for Nurses (2015), Service Quality Awards (Multiple), and Superstar Award – Nursing Merit (2022).
- ITE equipped her with the skills and knowledge to embark on a successful nursing career. Her lecturers firmly believed in her and inspired her to shape the industry. Similarly, she wants to open doors for ITE students and believes that they can be excellent nurses.

- Plans to set up a 'live' online platform enabling ITE students, graduates and alumni across different career stages in the healthcare industry to connect, seek advice, and expand their networks.
- One of her key objectives for this platform is for juniors to link up with seniors within the industry to seek advice and learn from their experiences

Noel Ng Sing Guan (黄星元)

Owner & Director of Harts, Hint, Hei, and Hove Salons

- Inspired by what he experienced at his auntie's neighbourhood hair salon, he undertook the newly launched *Nitec* in Hair Services course at ITE, where he could also learn how to manage his own unruly hair.
- Discovered his flair for hairstyling at ITE. Won several awards; Gold Medal at WorldSkills ASEAN (2010), Medallion for Excellence at WorldSkills London (2011), owns/co-owns 4 salons and has 46 staff.
- Pursued a different vision for his salon; promoted work-life balance by keeping operating hours shorter than usual and granting staff more leave.
- ITE empowered him in his journey, helping him build up his confidence and hone his management skills. He gained international exposure through WorldSkills Competitions and networking opportunities through entrepreneurship programmes.
- Regularly returns to ITE to inspire new students through motivational talks. Offers internship and permanent positions to ITE graduates and supports the industry and ITE by sharing knowledge at seminars.

- Has found success in using social media as a promotional tool for his salons, and he plans to leverage on his strength in social media to increase awareness of the hairdressing profession and the unique opportunities it offers.
- His objective is to demonstrate to youths and their families that hairdressing is a viable career pathway, comparable to other professions.

Anders Tan Wei Siong (陈伟雄)

Founder, Inclus Pte Ltd

- After his Nitec in Info-Communication Technology course at ITE, Anders pursued a diploma and attained a degree in Information Systems Management.
- Began advocating for inclusivity after witnessing the difficulties his autistic brother-in-law experienced while job hunting.
- Started 'Inclus', a self-sustaining social enterprise, in 2018 with his own savings to empower persons with disabilities, and founded 'InSchool', an after-school care and therapy programme for children with special needs in 2024.
- NCSS 40 under 40 Leader (2021); Tatler Asia Gen.T Leader (2024); American Express Impact Leader [APAC] (2024), and ASEAN Inclusive Business Award (2024).
- ITE was a turning point for Anders, where he learned resilience, adaptability, and confidence. The highly supportive environment and staff helped him grow, and he maintains contact with his lecturers and ITE friends today.
- Continues to uplift the ITE community; is the Honorary Secretary
  of ITE Alumni Association Management Committee, mentors
  ITE students, launches programmes for those with special
  needs, leads fundraising efforts, and offers free mentoring and
  industry immersion programmes.

#### Plans to give back to ITE Community

 Plans to support ITE students in implementing their social innovation ideas, by providing resources to bring their ideas to reality.

The \$10,000 fund will be used for programmes that promote social innovation and entrepreneurship for ITE students. He hopes to train up their social spirit.
