Top Achievements

- Living on her own at a young age was stressful at first but Ryka soon found that this arrangement worked better for her. It gave her a quiet and peaceful environment, allowing her to relax and better concentrate on her work.
- Ryka received the Keppel Care Foundation Scholarship in 2024 for her outstanding performance in school. The Scholarship is awarded to one student per college each year. By stretching the cash award, Ryka was able to get a year's worth of living expenses – this meant she did not have to work as many hours, leaving her with more time to rest, pursue other activities, and focus on her studies.
- Ryka participated in several competitions, earning a commendation award for the Tan Kah Kee Young Inventor's Award in 2024, and winning First Prize at the Student Ideation & Design Competition the same year.
- A driven and eager learner, Ryka enjoys reading and learning a variety of skills – from baking and budgeting to sports science and storytelling. Her enthusiasm and exceptional work ethics saw her earn five distinctions for her six core modules. This earned her a remarkable 3.957 GPA.
