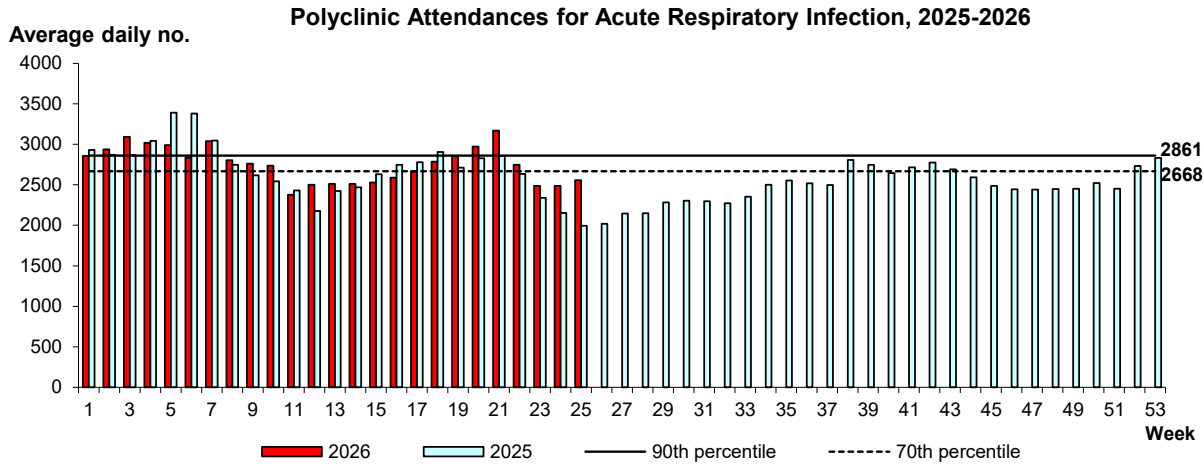

Acute Respiratory Infection (ARI) Situation in Singapore 2026

ARI indicators for E-week 25 (21 - 27 Jun 2026) were as follows:

The average daily number of patients seeking treatment in the polyclinics for ARI was 2556 (over 5.5 working days) in E-week 25.



In E-week 25, the top respiratory pathogens among adult and paediatric samples from the National Surveillance Programme for Acute Respiratory Infection[§] (ARI) were:

- Adult samples: Influenza (28%), SARS-CoV-2 (15%), and human rhinovirus/enterovirus (13%).
- Paediatric samples: Human rhinovirus/enterovirus (30%), influenza (16%), and parainfluenza viruses (13%).

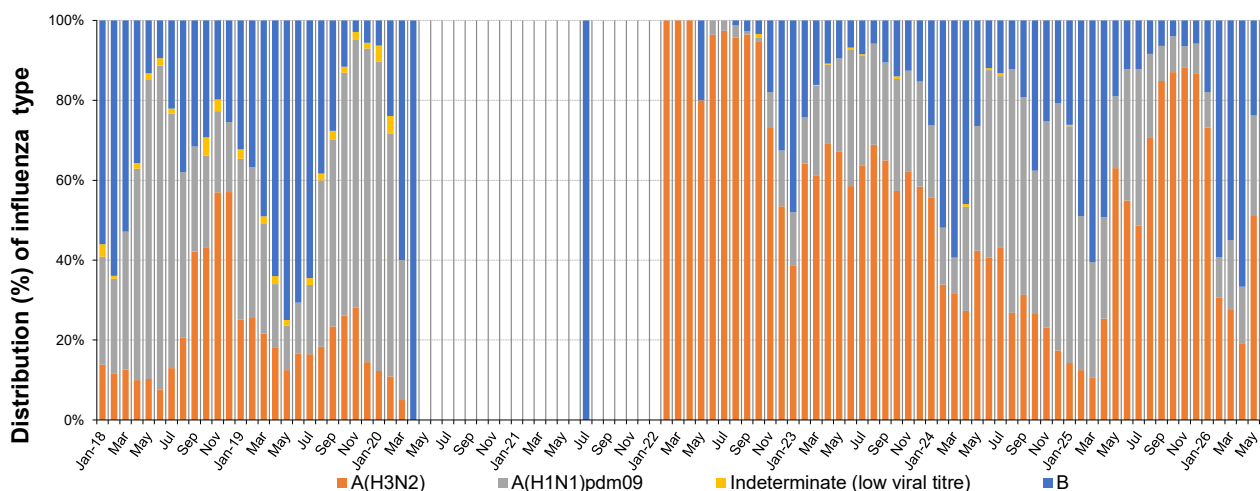
[§] CDA monitors the trends of respiratory pathogens in the community through our sentinel surveillance programme for Acute Respiratory Infections (ARI) which includes polyclinics and selected general practitioner (GP) clinics.

COVID-19 and Influenza

The positivity rate for influenza among ILI samples (n= 154) in the community was 34% in E-week 25. The positivity rate for COVID-19 among ARI samples (n= 279) in the community was 14% in E-week 25.

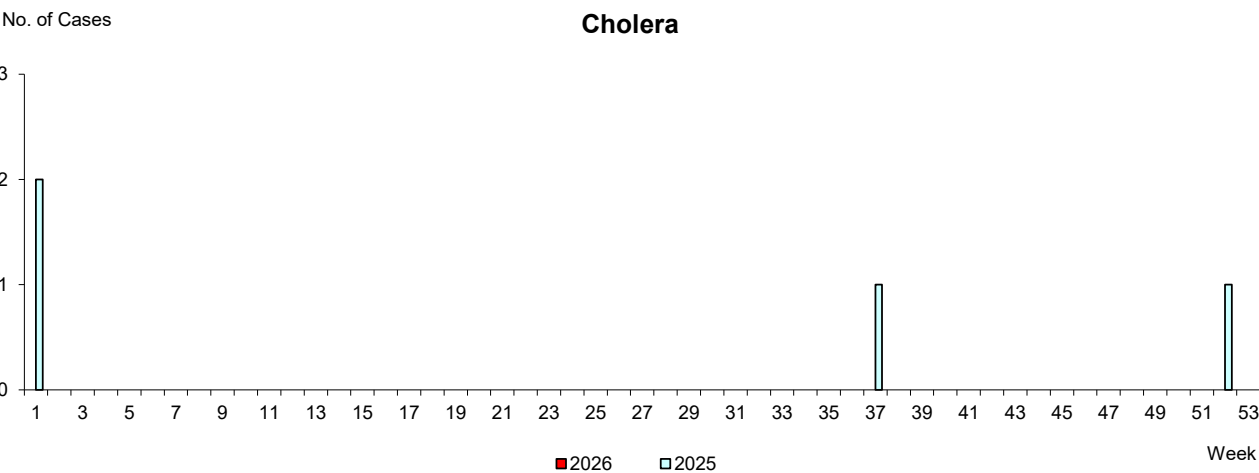
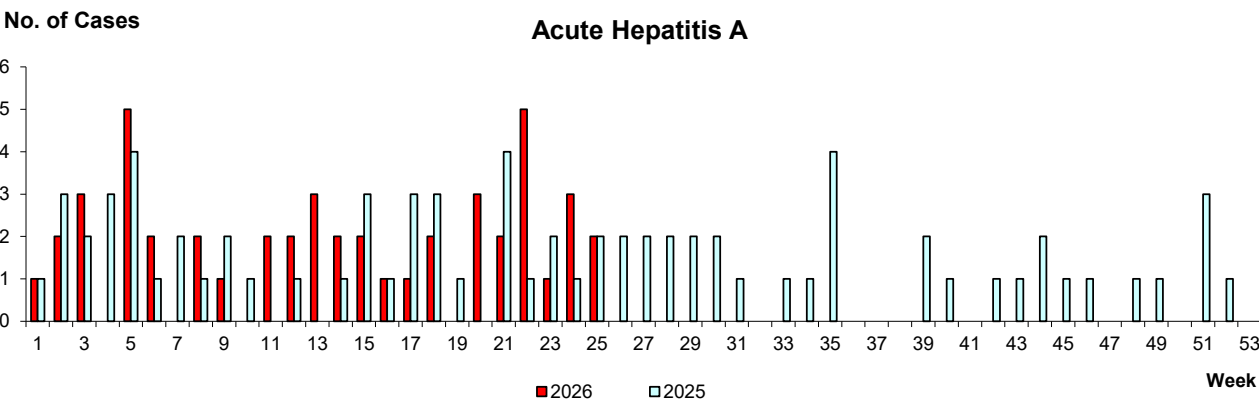
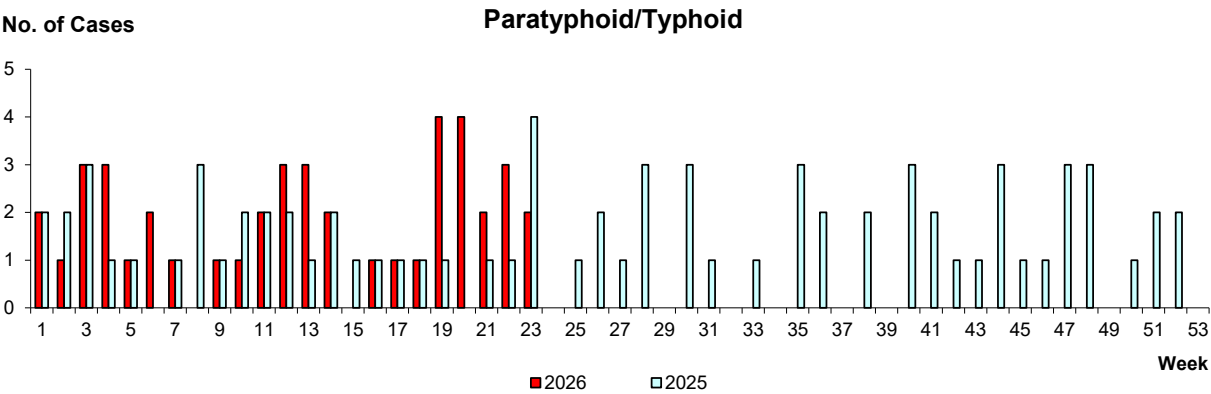
Of the 80 specimens tested positive for influenza in May 2026, 20 were positive for influenza A(pH1N1) (25.0%), 41 were positive for influenza A(H3N2) (51.2%), and 19 were positive for influenza B (23.8%).

Monthly Influenza Surveillance

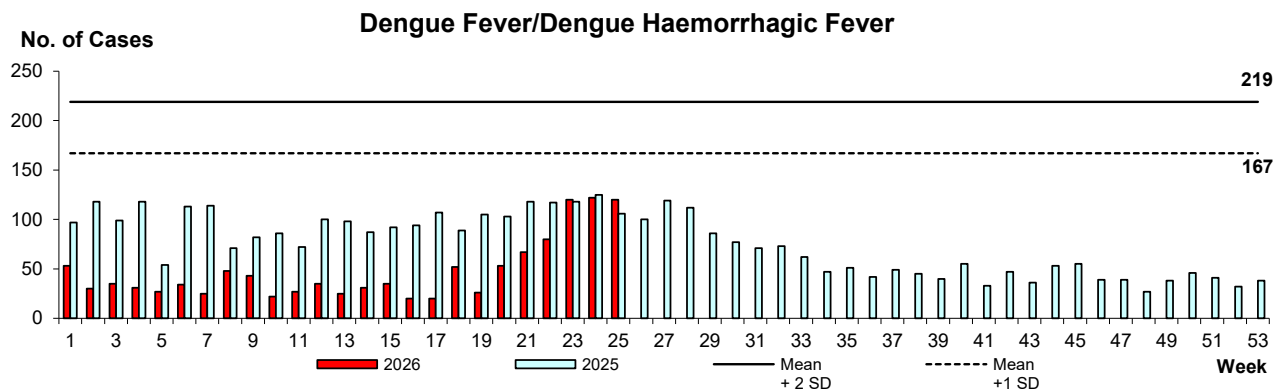

WEEKLY INCIDENCE OF FOOD/WATER-BORNE DISEASES, 2025-2026



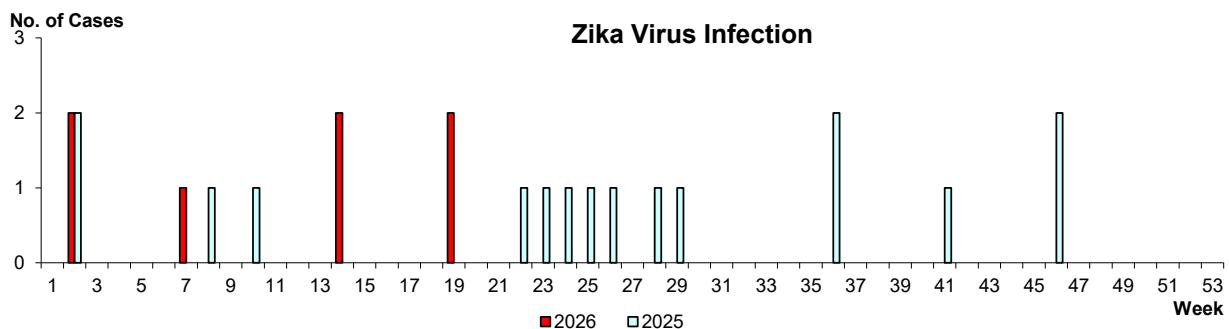
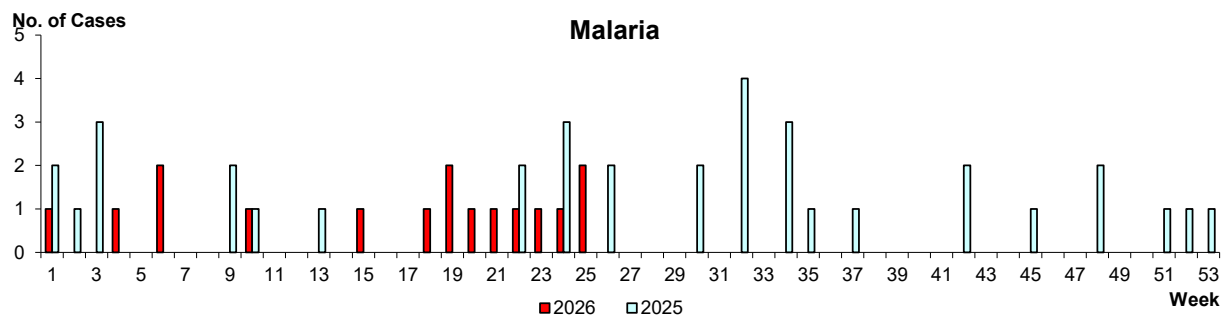
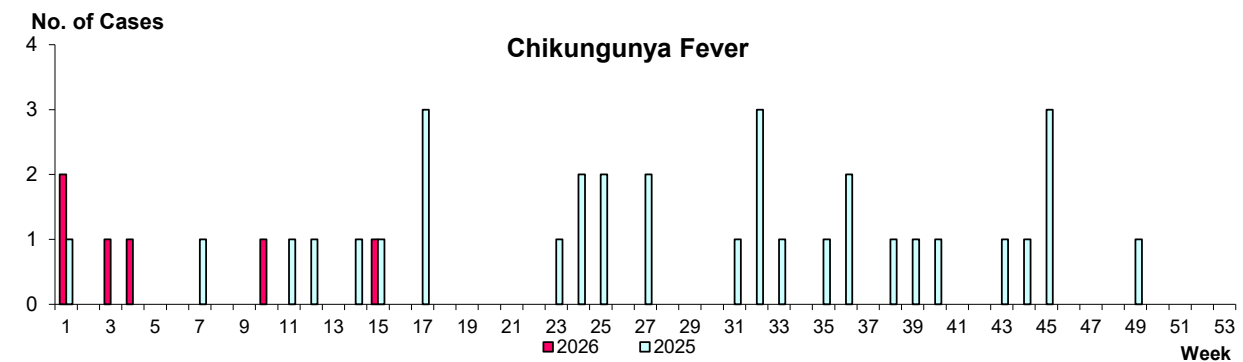
WEEKLY INCIDENCE OF VECTOR-BORNE DISEASES, 2025-2026



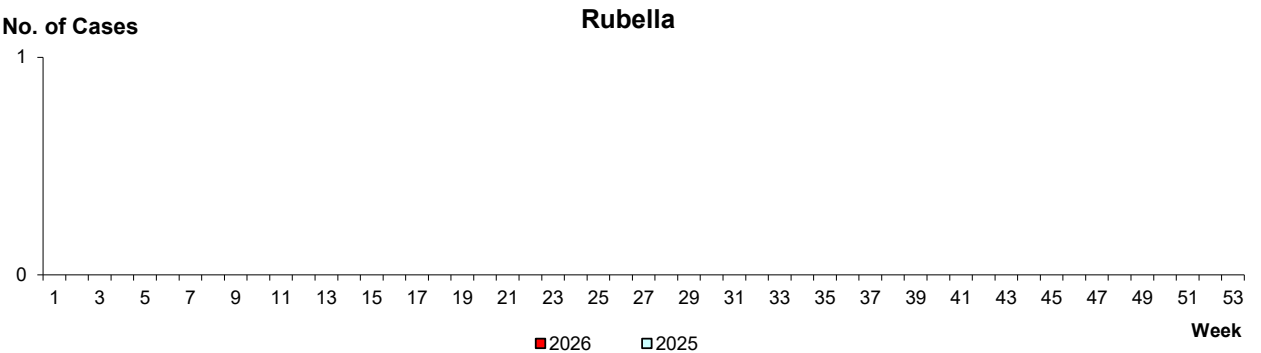
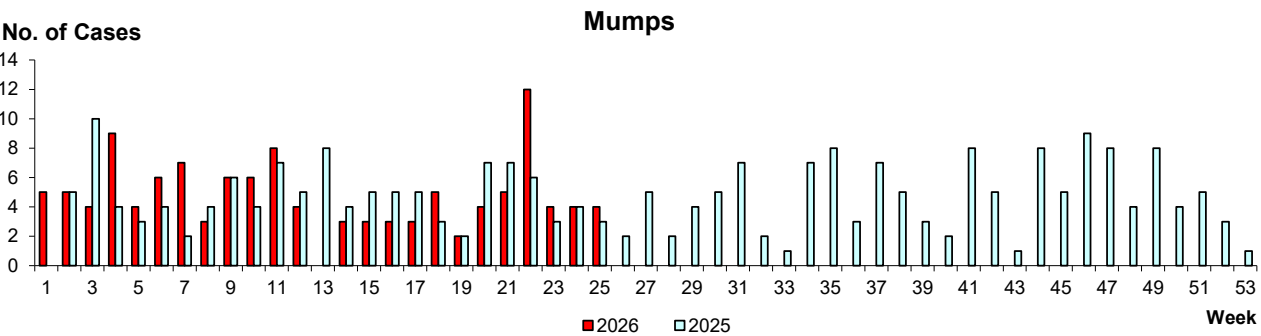
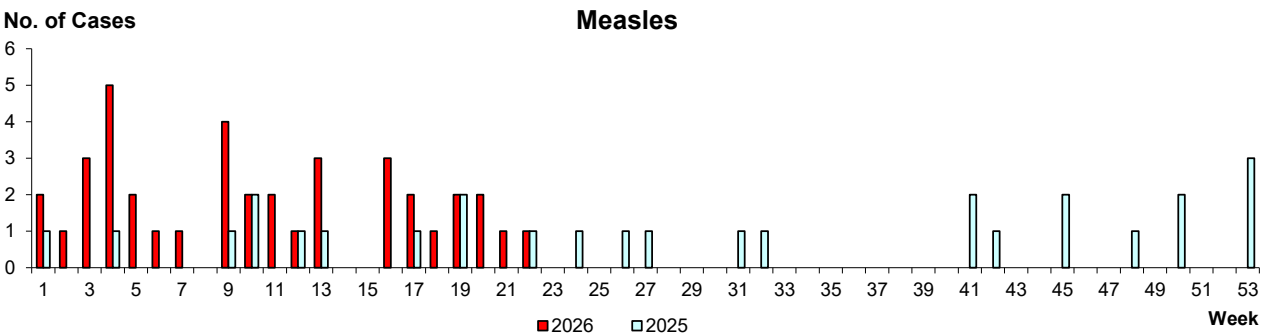
The number of dengue notifications was 120 in E-week 25.

The number of hospital admissions decreased to 17 in E-week 25, compared to 26 in E-week 24.

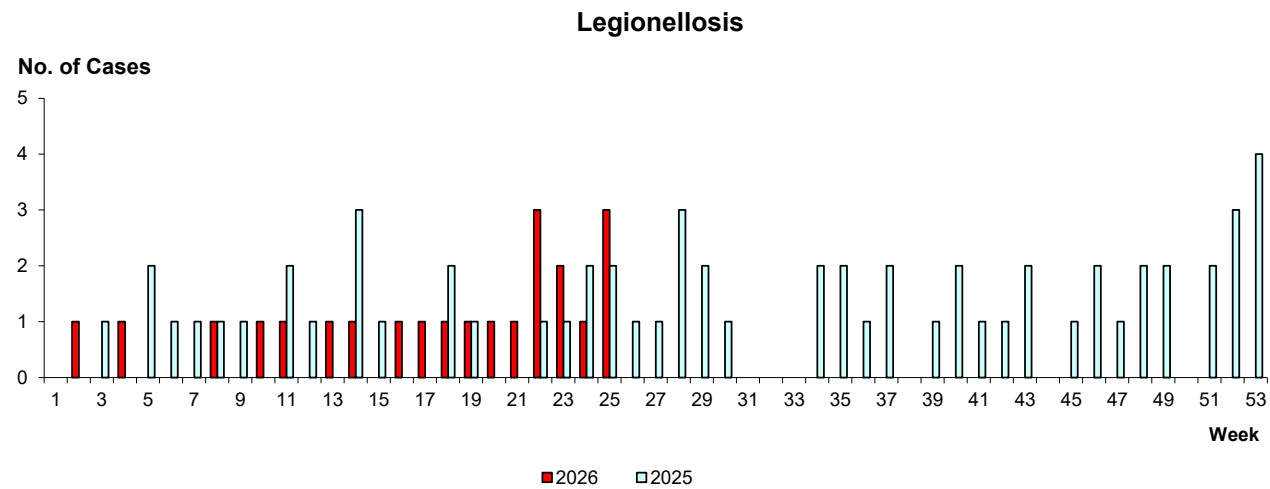
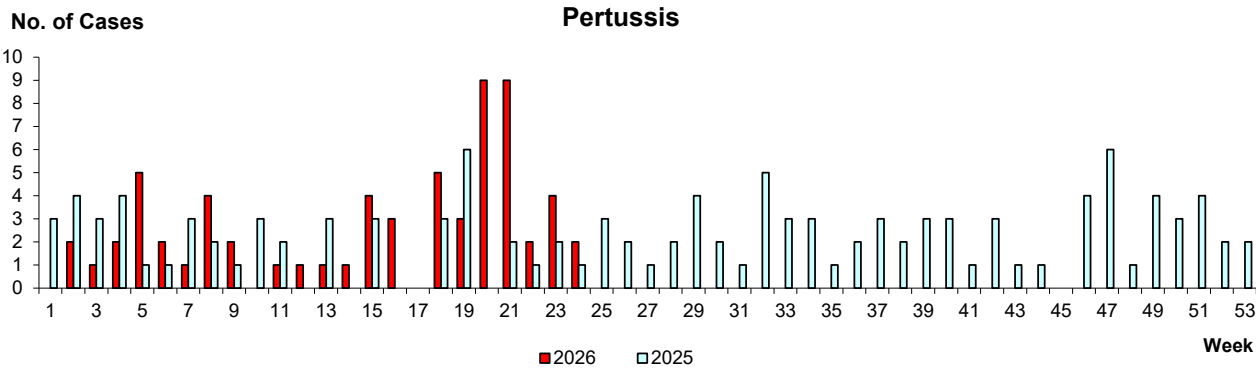
Preliminary results of all positive dengue samples serotyped in June 2026 showed DEN-1, DEN-2, DEN-3 and DEN-4 at 4.7%, 37.5%, 56.3% and 1.6% respectively.



WEEKLY INCIDENCE OF AIR/DROPLET-BORNE DISEASES, 2025-2026



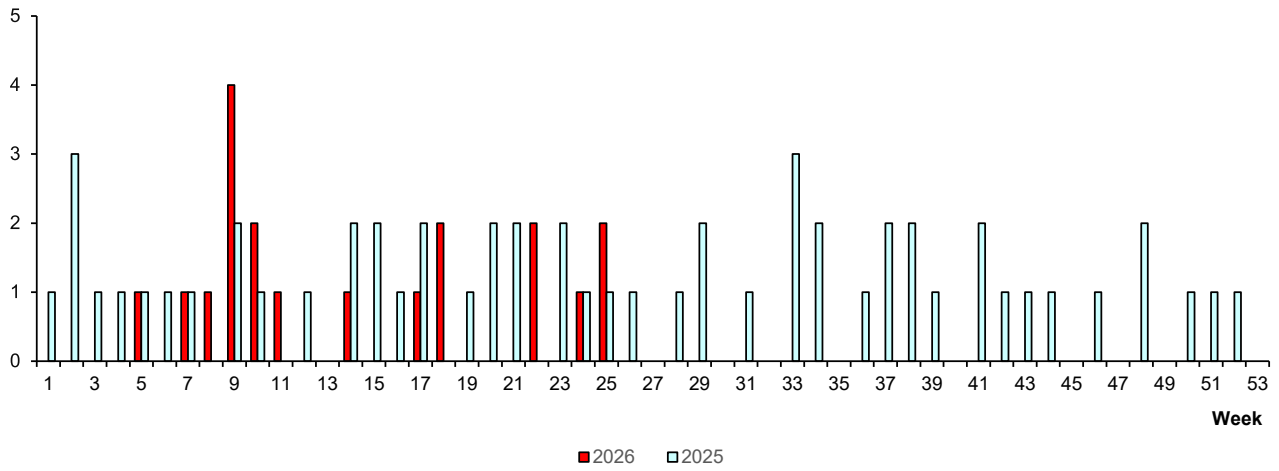
WEEKLY INCIDENCE OF AIR/DROPLET-BORNE DISEASES, 2025-2026

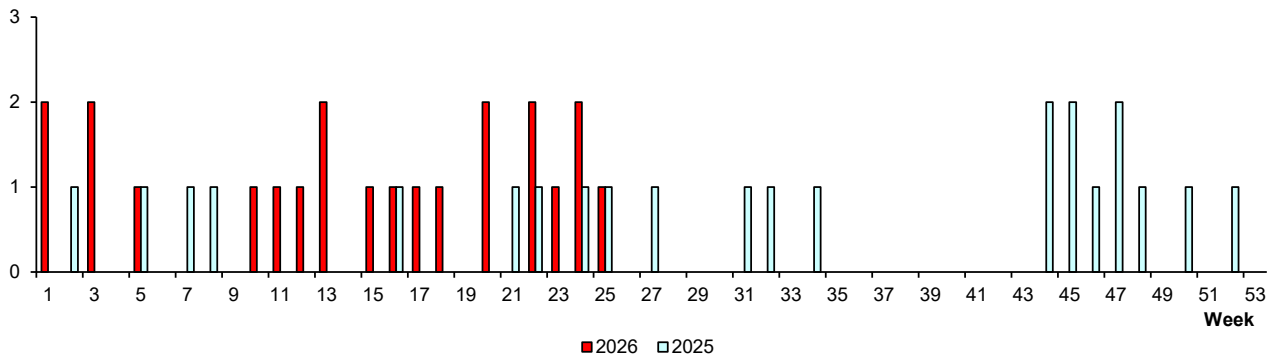

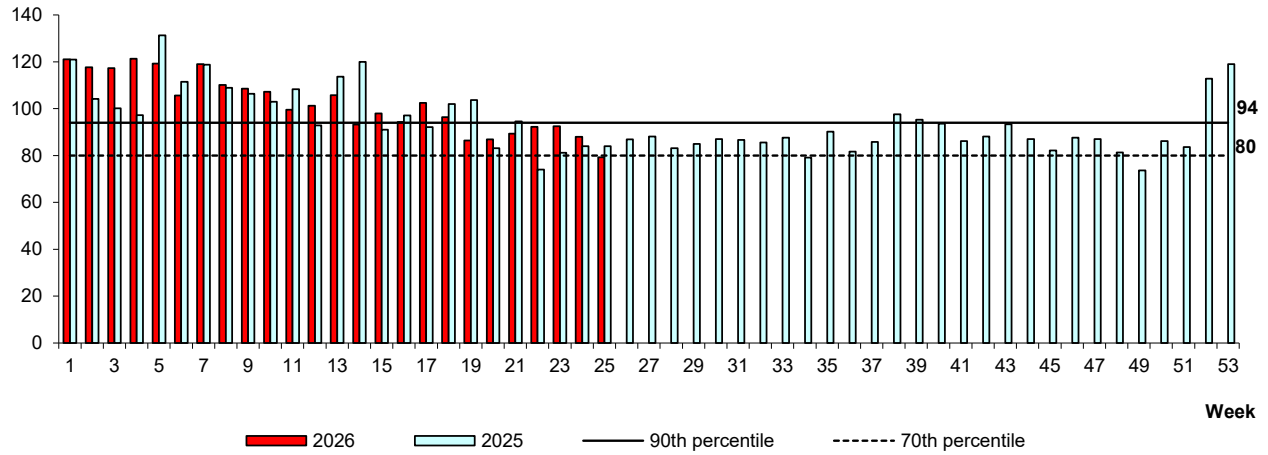

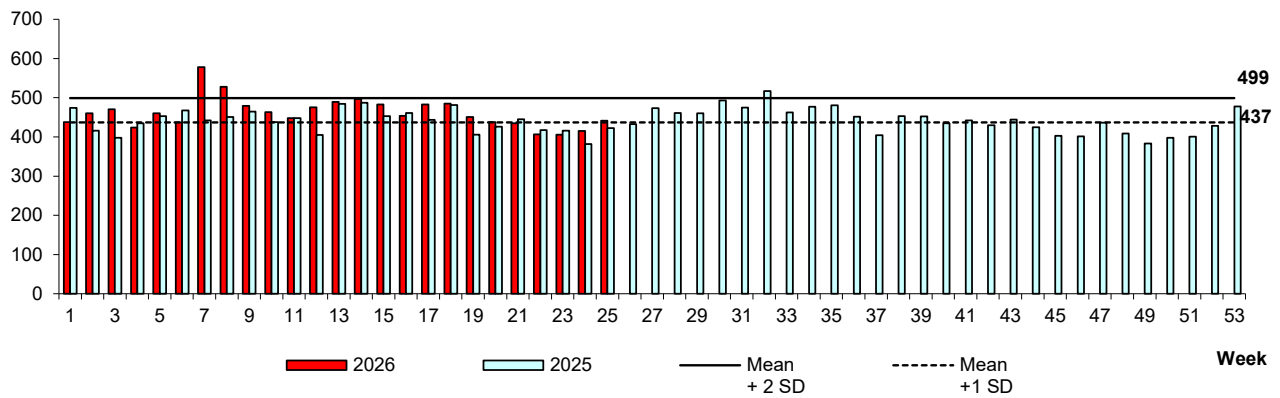

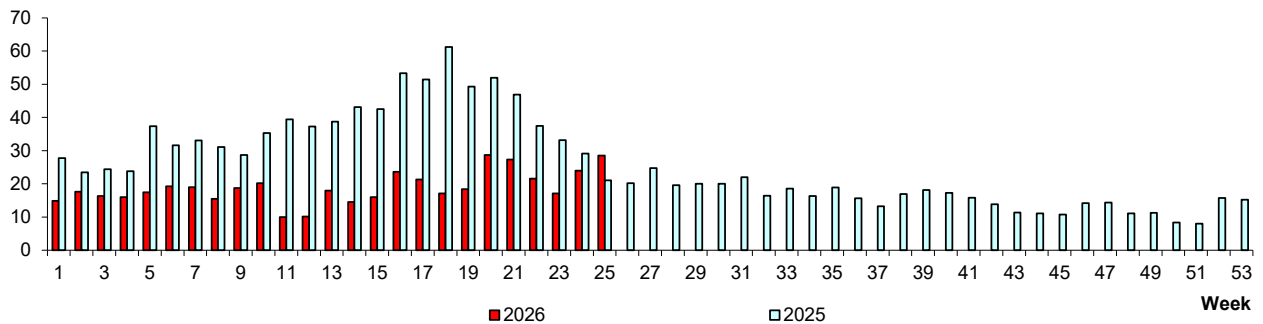
