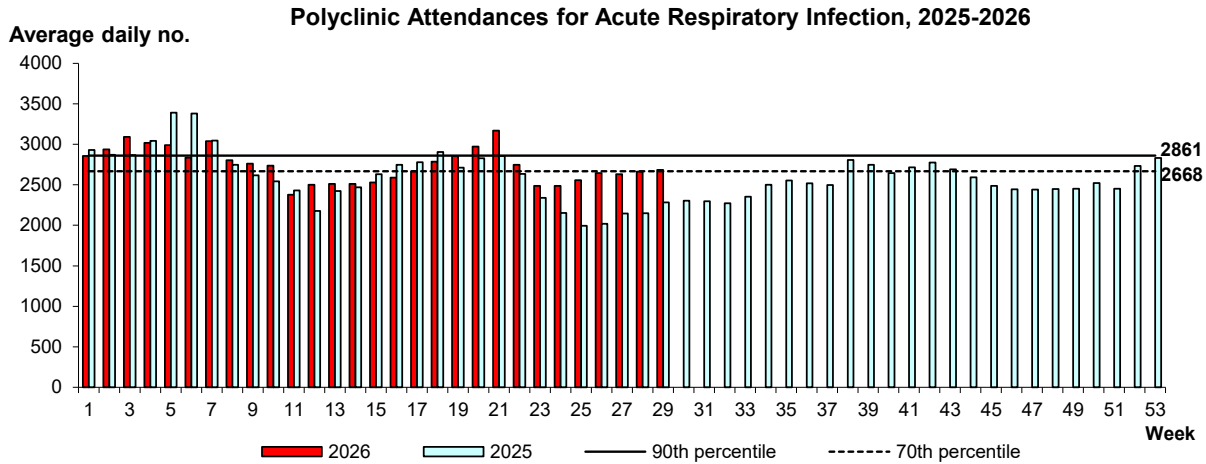

Acute Respiratory Infection (ARI) Situation in Singapore 2026

ARI indicators for E-week 29 (19 - 25 Jul 2026) were as follows:

The average daily number of patients seeking treatment in the polyclinics for ARI was 2683 (over 5.5 working days) in E-week 29.



In E-week 29, the top respiratory pathogens among adult and paediatric samples from the National Surveillance Programme for Acute Respiratory Infection[§] (ARI) were:

- Adult samples: Human rhinovirus/enterovirus (23%), influenza (15%), and SARS-CoV-2 (10%).
- Paediatric samples: Human rhinovirus/enterovirus (35%), influenza (15%) and respiratory syncytial virus (13%).

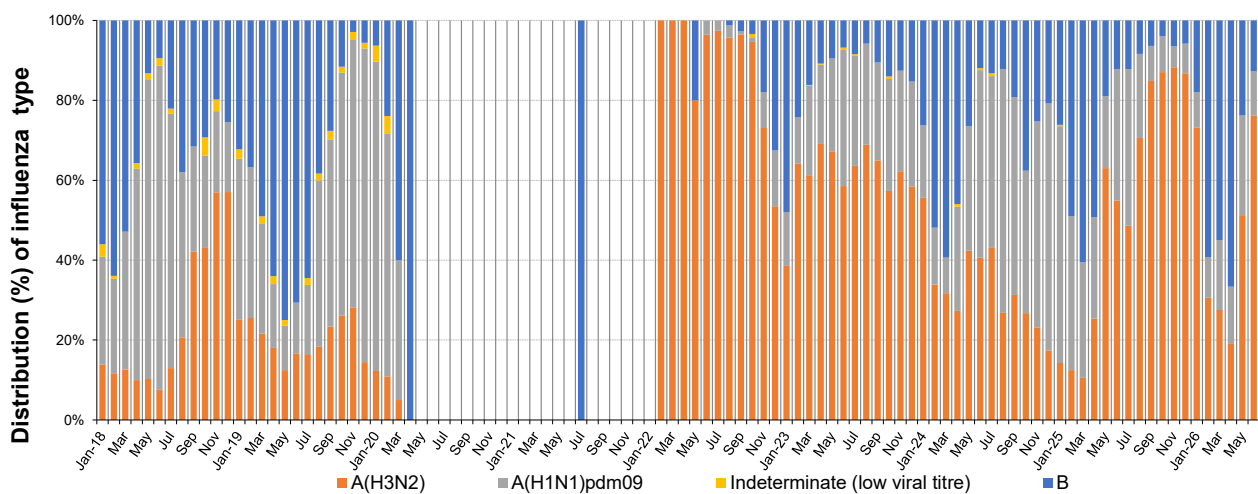
[§] CDA monitors the trends of respiratory pathogens in the community through our sentinel surveillance programme for Acute Respiratory Infections (ARI) which includes polyclinics and selected general practitioner (GP) clinics.

COVID-19 and Influenza

The positivity rate for influenza among ILI samples (n= 168) in the community was 25% in E-week 29. The positivity rate for COVID-19 among ARI samples (n= 327) in the community was 8% in E-week 29.

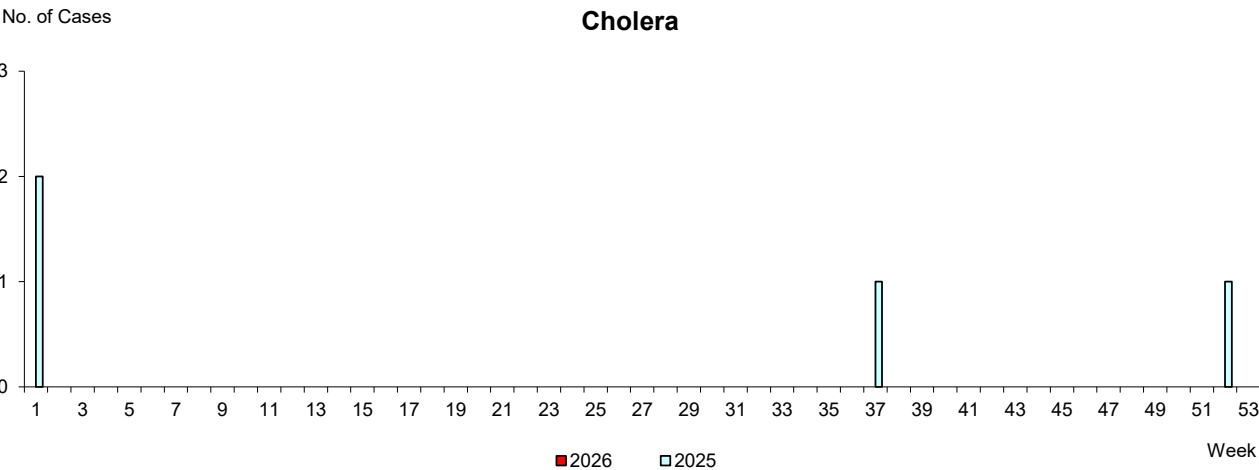
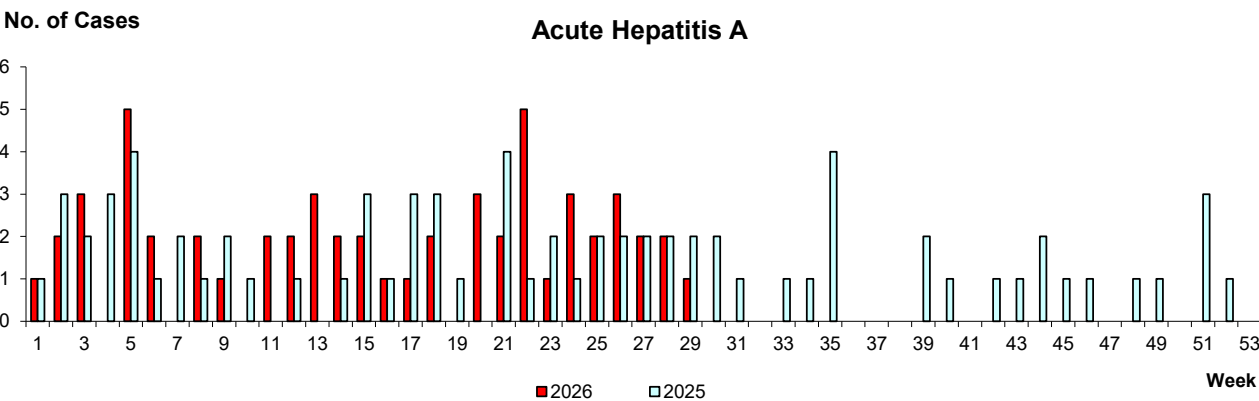
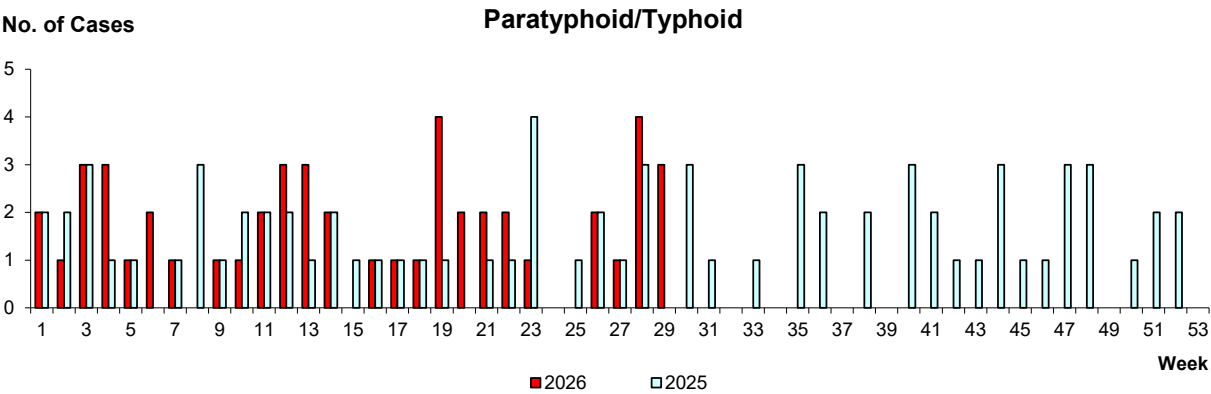
Of the 189 specimens tested positive for influenza in June 2026, 21 were positive for influenza A(pH1N1) (11.1%), 144 were positive for influenza A(H3N2) (76.2%), and 24 were positive for influenza B (12.7%).

Monthly Influenza Surveillance

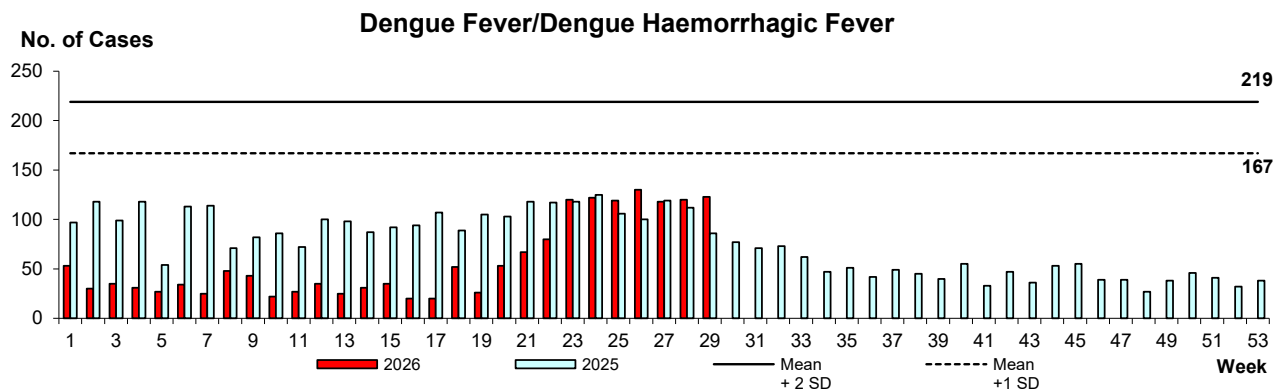

WEEKLY INCIDENCE OF FOOD/WATER-BORNE DISEASES, 2025-2026



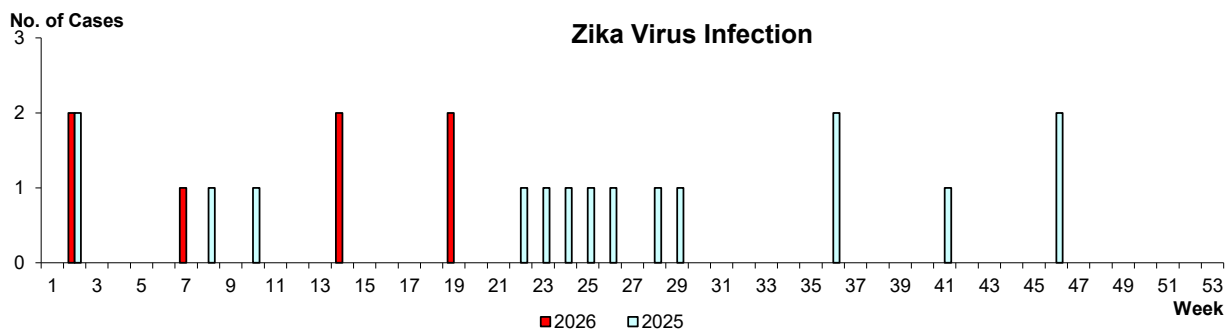
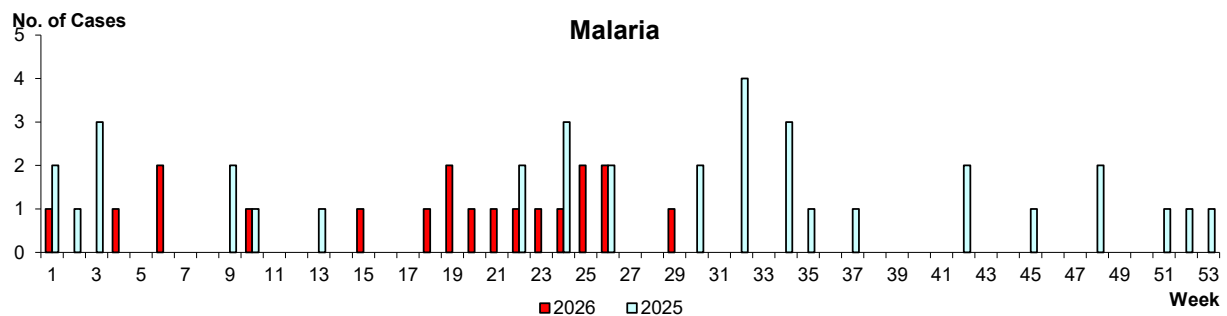
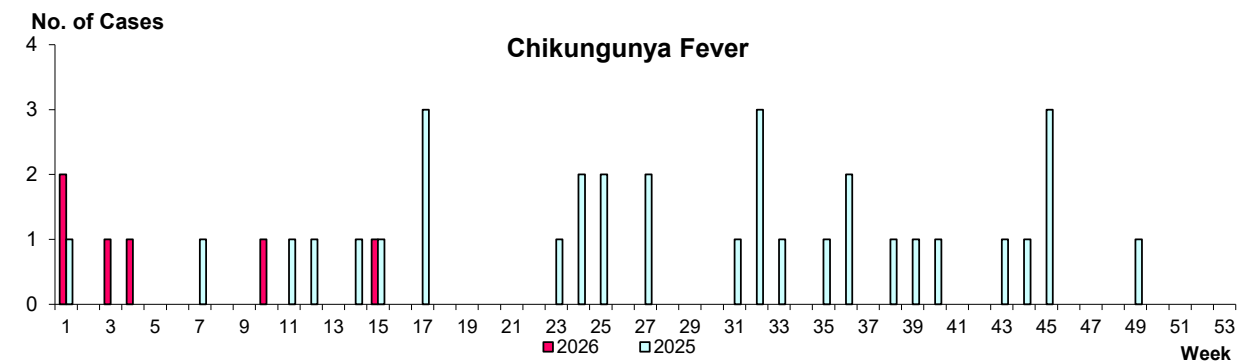
WEEKLY INCIDENCE OF VECTOR-BORNE DISEASES, 2025-2026



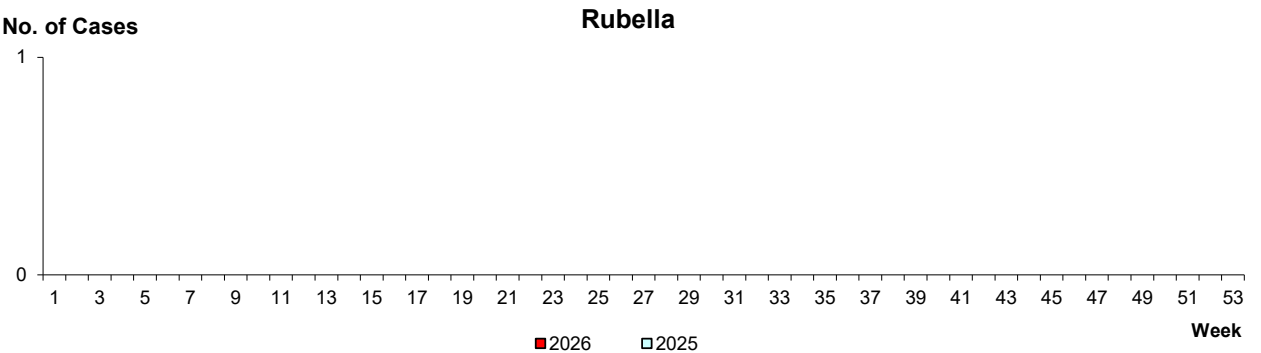
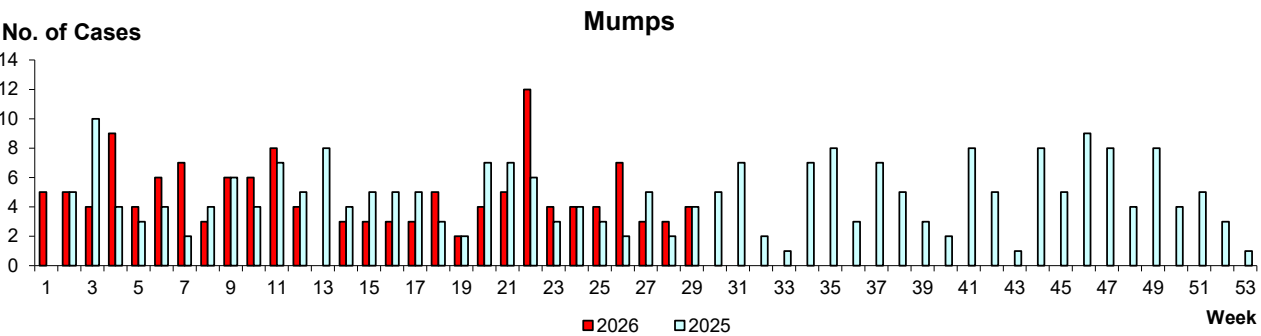
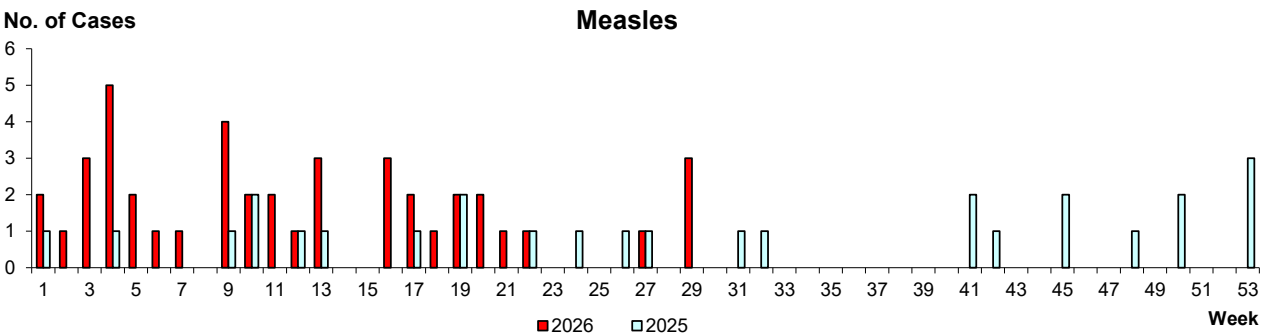
The number of dengue notifications was 123 in E-week 29.

The number of hospital admissions increased to 21 in E-week 29, compared to 18 in E-week 28.

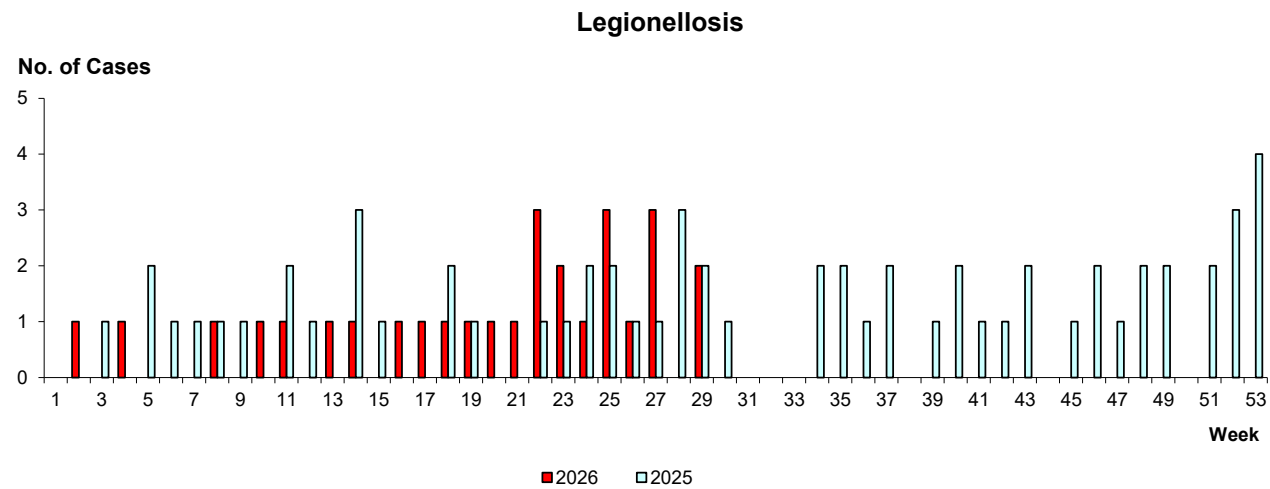
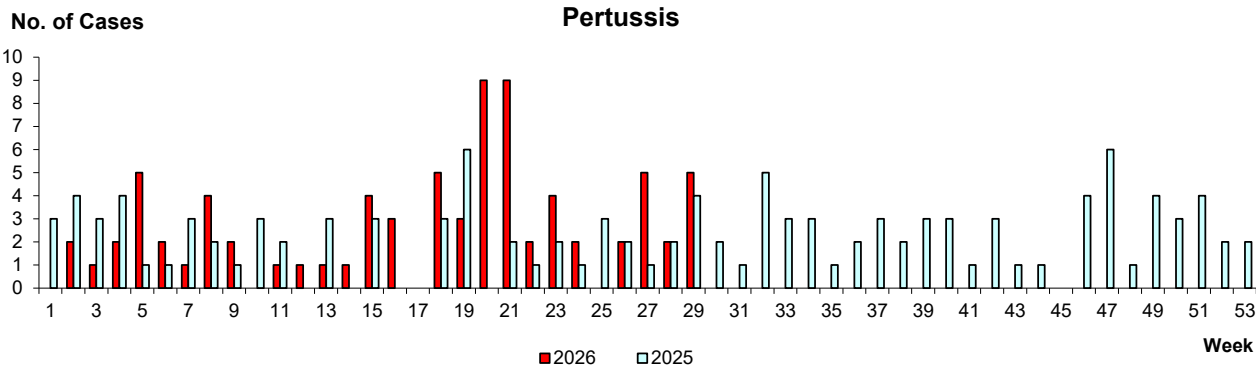
Preliminary results of all positive dengue samples serotyped in July 2026 showed DEN-1, DEN-2, DEN-3 and DEN-4 at 2.6%, 45.3%, 52.1% and 0.0% respectively.



WEEKLY INCIDENCE OF AIR/DROPLET-BORNE DISEASES, 2025-2026



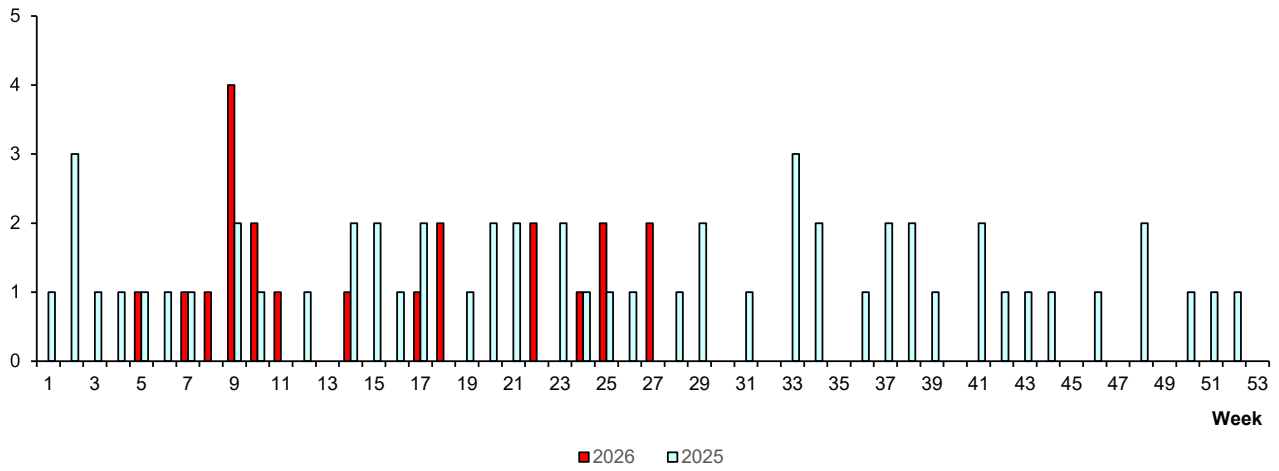

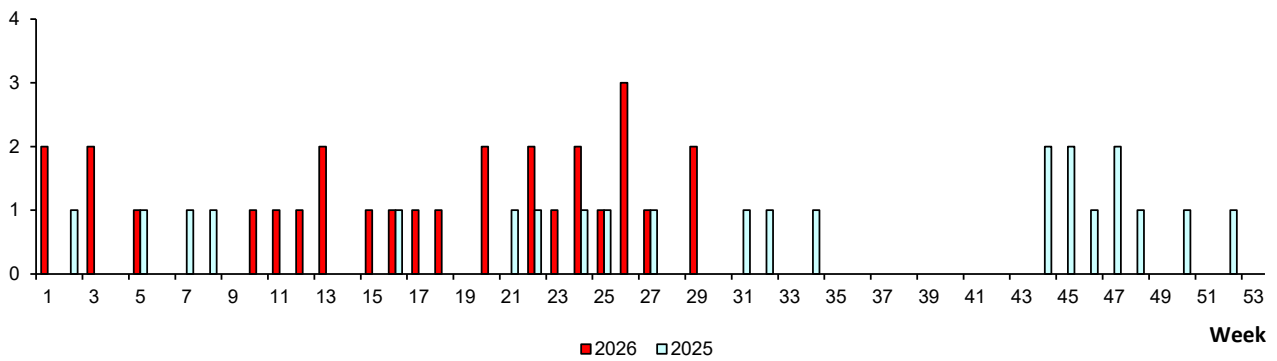

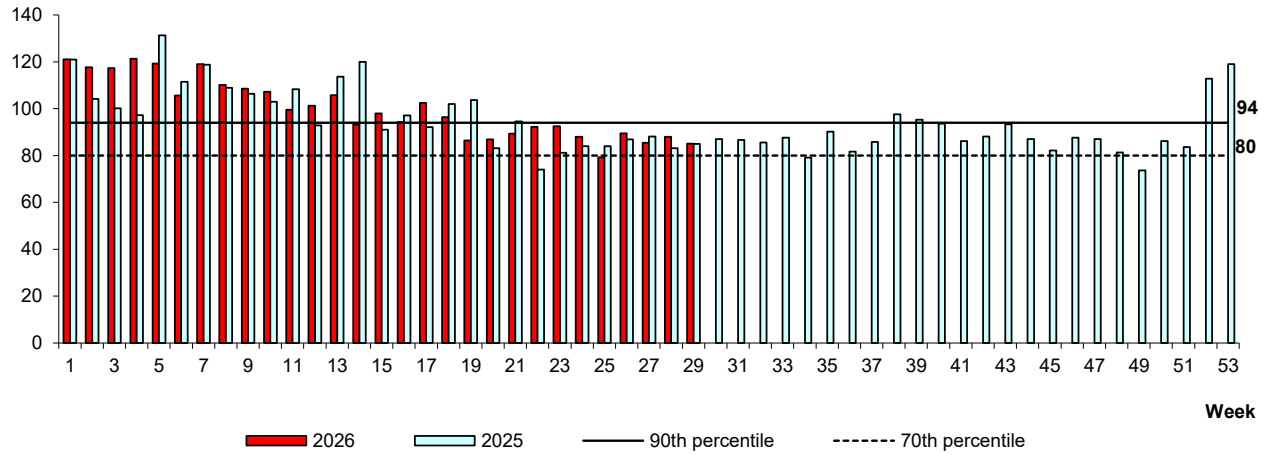

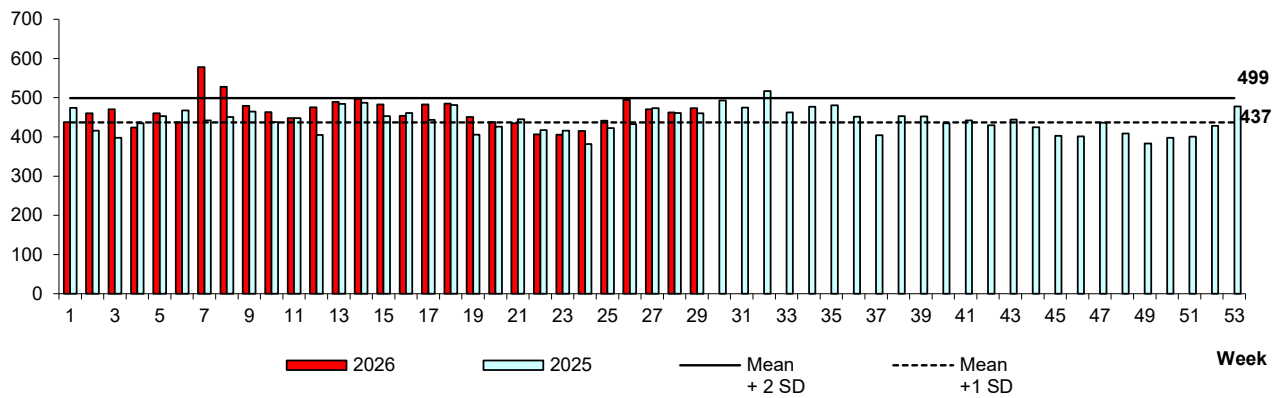
