In 2025. we commemorate the 60th of anniversary Singapore's independence (SG60) and the 5th anniversary of the SG Eco Fund. Although SG Eco Fund is still relatively young, it has grown from strength to strength and become a source of support for community efforts to promote environmental sustainability and climate resilience.

Over the years, we have seen increasingly ambitious and creative proposals from applicants. grant This demonstrates а growing understanding of environmental issues and our community's interest in contributing to efforts to address climate change. This can also be partly attributed to our collaborative efforts of working with grant applicants, through workshops and consultations. to improve the design of their projects to enhance their viability.

While the Fund has supported numerous projects over the years, our measure of success extends beyond the number of grants awarded to also focus on community participation. Our grant recipients are reaching out to more members of the community than ever, sharing ideas and inspiring others towards a more environmentally sustainable lifestyle and climate resilient Singapore. Feedback from the ground has been encouraging, with many participants sharing that they feel they can make a real difference environmental to issues. Many also express how participation in their projects have changed their perspectives and further inspired them about environmental action.

The past year marked another significant milestone as we welcomed more strategic partners with extensive networks and expertise in different sectors. We thank our partners who have helped us empower our grant recipients to scale their initiatives, tap into broader resources, and engage with diverse stakeholders creative communities to corporate partners across Singapore.

In celebration of SG60, we have increased the maximum grant amount of the Sprout category to \$30,000, for qualifying projects submitted in 2025. This reflects our commitment to empowering ground-up initiatives contribute to Singapore's sustainability goals during significant national milestone. We hope this increase will boost the reach and impact of these projects, helping more people to contribute to Singapore's sustainability journey. As we look to the future, we remain committed to working alongside of the sustainability members community to make Singapore a more sustainable home for all Singaporeans!





Governance Structure

The SG Eco Fund is governed by a Board of Trustees and supported by an Advisory Committee. All members do not receive remuneration for their service.

Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees oversees the Fund's strategic objectives, directions, and values. They also approve grant distributions, monitor the Fund's activities, and oversee financial reporting and compliance. The Trustees meet at least once a year, where the quorum for each meeting is a minimum of three Trustees.





Featured Projects from 2024

Through the SG Eco Fund, passionate individuals and groups have turned their environmental aspirations into tangible community action. Here, our grant recipients share their journeys of creating lasting impact and inspiring others to join the sustainability movement.



Sew Can I

by Image Mission Ltd

Image Mission's project taught women from disadvantaged backgrounds to transform used garments into practical, everyday items such as bags and household accessories. This initiative fostered a vibrant online community where participants could showcase their creations, exchange ideas and champion mindful textile consumption. The project reduced 500 kg of textile waste and engaged around 90 people over a year.

With the SG Eco Fund, we reduced textile waste by upcycling clothing donations and at the same time, involved our community in learning a new skill. The funding gave us the foundation to continue the project and continue to contribute to the sustainability movement. The response was overwhelming, and we wished we had applied for a bigger fund to accommodate more participants, so a key learning point is to not limit your potential by the funding quantum.

Yuhua Agri-tech - Solar (YAS) Living Lab

by Yuhua Citizens' Consultative Committee (CCC)

YAS Living Lab converted a carpark rooftop into Singapore's first integrated agritech-solar testbed, combining vegetable growing with solar energy harvesting, while fostering community engagement.

With the SG Eco Fund's support, the Lab enabled eight groups, from institutions like Singapore Polytechnic to social organisations like Kampung Senang, to experiment with sustainable farming and solar technologies, contributing to food security and renewable energy goals. The project engaged 2,000 visitors over eight months, and produced over 500 kg of vegetables, demonstrating how urban spaces can be optimised for dual-use in food production and energy generation.

Beyond the innovations in hydroponics, solar panels, and greenhouse technology, the most exciting part of our YAS lab is witnessing how the simultaneous application of all three technologies boosts our ability to produce more crops, better crops, with enhanced resource utilisation.



Jalan Journey - Sustainability World

This youth team developed and launched Sustainability World, a virtual platform that uses storytelling to engage students on sustainability topics and their environmental impact. They engaged more than 300 secondary school students during their project and continue to offer interactive programmes. Sustainability World has since impacted more than 1,000 students, furthering Jalan Journey's commitment to environmental education among youth and showcasing the catalytic impact of the Fund.



Food Waste Upcycling and Community Education

by Holocene Pte Ltd

Holocene Pte Ltd implemented its in-house food waste solutions at Kim Tian West to collect food waste from residents while conducting educational workshops on recycling food waste into compost. Over a year, the initiative successfully engaged 100 residents and upcycled 140 kg of food waste into compost for use in community gardens.

Over two years, PERGAS engaged over 260 people, yielding 60 kg of produce from their eco-friendly garden setup. Through hands-on education, participants learnt practical gardening skills while gaining awareness of environmental responsibility.

Living Seawalls: Coastal Protection and Reef Ecosystem Creation for Environmental and Socio-Economic Benefits

by Witteveen+Bos South-East Asia Pte Ltd

This pilot reef restoration initiative by Witteveen+Bos South-East Asia explored using oyster reefs for local coastal protection and biodiversity enhancement. They collected 130 kg of oyster shell waste from hotels and restaurants, turning them into a living seawall. Using biodegradable mesh bags, the reef encouraged oysters, which have a natural ability to filter water and stabilise our shorelines, to grow by providing a substrate for larvae to latch on to.

Volunteers from diverse backgrounds, including students and parents from Rainbow Centre, helped in cleaning and packaging oyster shells. Citizen scientists conducted monthly reef monitoring. In total, more than 100 people were engaged and involved in this project.

The SG Eco Fund enabled us to test our artificial oyster reef project, demonstrating its success in enhancing marine biodiversity and naturally recruited baby oysters. The Fund's community engagement sessions connected us with diverse individuals from the hospitality sector, students and citizen scientists. Our findings have kickstarted collaborations with agencies, academia and industry partners for nature-based coastal protection solutions. In the face of climate change, we hope that artificial oyster reefs will be able to contribute to the enhancement of Singapore's coastal resilience.

Singapore Eco Arts Festival

This team of individuals organised an Eco Arts Festival to engage the public about environmentally-friendly art from waste materials. They conducted workshops facilitated by experienced artists and showcased the artworks created, as well as sustainability-themed artworks by other creative practitioners, at library@orchard. Through this one-year project, they engaged over 1,800 people and connected them with the arts community and upcycled about 350 kg of waste materials such as textiles, plastics and glass.

The SG Eco Fund helped launch and expand the festival, making our workshops and art experiences accessible to the public.

We encourage future grantees to work closely with the SG Eco Fund team to identify opportunities to widen their reach, tailor their messaging for greater impact, and explore meaningful approaches to building a greener world together.

Aquaponics Farming on SGH Campus Rooftop

by National Cancer Centre of Singapore Pte Ltd

Led by the SingHealth Duke-NUS Institute of Biodiversity Medicine (BD-MED), this project saw the implementation of a community-based rooftop aquaponics farm and horticultural therapy and sustainability programmes at the Singapore General Hospital (SGH). The project engaged 380 people over 2 years and produced 200 kg of vegetables over 4 months of partial operation, with the potential to ramp up to over 2,000 kg monthly at full operational capacity, and provide fresh vegetables to the SGH Central Kitchen for in-patients' meals.

With the support of the SG Eco Fund, That WKND Company organised street cleanups at various locations and featured the events on social media. They also encouraged participants to dress up in upcycled fashion items based on the theme of the session (e.g. beach-inspired outfits for beach cleanup). Over four weeks, more than 100 people were engaged to collect over 65 kg of trash from our streets. The videos highlighting upcycled fashion and the cleanups garnered over 1.2 million impressions on social media.

Banner Upcycling

by Lions Befrienders Service Association (Singapore)

This voluntary welfare organisation worked with more than 50 seniors to upcycle discarded banners into usable products such as carrier bags. The upcycled products were distributed to the community and banner donors and showcased at educational exhibitions at participating Active Ageing Centres, highlighting the seniors' efforts alongside educating the wider public. A total of 590 people were engaged through this project, with more than 130 used banners being upcycled.





Financial Information

The SG Eco Fund supports community projects that improve the environment or advance environmental sustainability in Singapore. At the close of the financial year, we held total assets of \$45,675,556. This sum includes \$1,036,903 cash and cash equivalents, \$38,653 other current assets, and \$44,600,000 investment in Special Singapore Government Securities (SSGS).




The bulk of FY2024 expenditure was for grant disbursement, made to grant recipients who had met the deliverables of their projects.
