

Assisted Chronic Disease Explanation using AI (ACE-AI)

'ACE-AI' tool helps primary care providers identify individuals who are at higher risk of developing diabetes and/or high cholesterol within the next 3 years.

This allows for earlier detection, and prevention or delay of serious cardiovascular events.

From early 2027

Tool will be rolled out to **Healthier SG GP clinics and polyclinics.**

HSG enrollees identified as 'high risk' will undergo subsidised annual cardiovascular disease (CVD) risk screening.



Enhancing accessibility to health services and encouraging residents to lead healthier lifestyles within their neighbourhoods with:

- ➔ **11 enhanced Community Health Posts (CHP)** in Active Ageing Centres, supported by NHG Health, by Q1 2026:
 - Open weekly, instead of monthly
 - Walk-ins allowed
 - Key services include - basic health assessments, health programmes for individuals at-risk or with chronic conditions, caregiver support, post-discharge follow-ups
- ➔ **CHP services** extended to An Nur Mosque and Yusof Ishak Mosque by Sep 2026.
- ➔ Woodlands Hospital will offer specialist-supported care in the community - via enhanced CHPs or teleconsultation - from end-Mar 2026.

Improving Health in the North (Woodlands Town)



- ➔ New feature on **Healthy 365 app** to help residents explore and use facilities in their neighbourhoods.
- ➔ **HPB's collaboration with community partners to co-design accessible healthy lifestyle programmes**, covering physical activity, nutrition, sleep, and mental well-being, and create more shared spaces and amenities for healthy living activities.

Enhancing community care delivery

Leveraging technology to support seniors to age well in the community:

- Eligible seniors with care needs (e.g. frailty) can enrol in **Enhanced Home Personal Care (HPC+) service** for 24/7 technology-enabled monitoring and assistance with Activities of Daily Living, from Apr 2026.

Rollout of Integrated Community Care Provider (ICCP) initiative in 84 sub-regions to help seniors and caregivers access long-term care services more conveniently:

- Seniors with care needs will only need one comprehensive, standardised care assessment, instead of going for different assessments to access individual services, from Apr 2026.
- From Oct 2026, ICCPs will develop a holistic community care plan for each senior with care needs. This care plan will align community care partners to care goals of each senior and ensure timely support.
