

FREE-FLYING ADVISORY FOR BIRD OWNERS

Free flying birds in Singapore's urban environment has significant safety risks, which can result in serious injury or even death, that owners must account for. It is **an advanced skill that demands extensive training and reliable recall** before it can be attempted safely, and without disrupting other members of public.

Safety Risks and Considerations



Collision with reflective surfaces



Permanent loss due to disorientation or distraction



Attacks from other animals



Disamenities to members of the public



Disease transmission from wild animals

Instead of free flying, consider flying and recall training in secure indoor environments, such as in your home. Birds also benefit from interactive toys or social interactions with their owner and other pet birds.
