About JDR Workshop

Judicial Dispute Resolution (JDR) offers a range of options integrated into a court's processes to facilitate parties' amicable resolution of disputes in a cost effective and timely manner. They include judicial mediation/conciliation, early case management, early neutral evaluation and binding neutral evaluation. JDR has been instrumental in the State Courts disposing of many civil actions, small claims, protection against harassment claims, Magistrates' Complaints and community and relational disputes, to name a few.

This 2-day JDR workshop is specially curated for the members of the International Judicial Dispute Resolution Network, Court Volunteer Mediators empanelled by the State Courts and Judges and Judicial Officers interested in JDR.

Participants at the workshop will be introduced to the why, what and how in relation to JDR. It will be a highly interactive workshop with knowledge sharing, discussions, demonstrations and role-play.
