Getting here:

- By Car:
 - Park at the North Carpark.
- By MRT:
 - Nearest MRT station: Chinese Garden
 - From Chinese Garden MRT station, take Exit B.
- By Bus
 - Bus services: 180, 335 (Stop along Boon Lay Way)

- Romantic lakeside views and peaceful retreats
- Expansive urban edible garden
- Chinese-inspired architecture

Tips for a safe and enjoyable trip

- Dress comfortably
- Wear a hat, put on sunglasses, and apply sunscreen to shield yourself from the sun

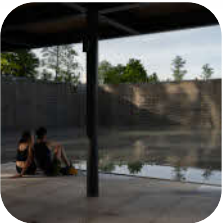

► 1 Grand Arch

A key landmark of the Chinese Garden since 1975. While crossing the White Rainbow Bridge, gaze upon this architectural icon that is adorned with intricate carvings and ornate motifs depicting Chinese mythology

► 2 Edible Garden

Comprises 6 themed gardens: Edible Flower Garden, Kitchen Garden, Climber Garden, Root Garden, Beverage & Medicinal Garden, and Herb & Spice Garden.

Admire the **Eggplants** (*Solanum melongena*) cared for by volunteers at Kitchen Garden, and the elegant **Japanese Honeysuckle** (*Lonicera japonica*) at Edible Flower Garden.

► 3 5 Twin Pagoda & Cloud Pagoda

Spot the striking Cloud Pagoda as this iconic landmark within Chinese Garden stands tall on a hilltop. Then explore the three-storey Twin Pagoda to take in the expansive view of Jurong Lake and catch the beautiful sunset over the waters.

Spot the vibrant **Coppersmith Barbet** (*Psilopogon haemacephalus*) perched among the branches! This fascinating bird is famous for its rhythmic, monotonous call, which sounds exactly like a coppersmith striking metal with a hammer.

► 4 Water Wall Court

The Water Wall Court offers a serene yet dynamic experience, inviting quiet reflection and contemplation. At its center stands a pavilion, perfect for taking in the ever-changing textures of the water.

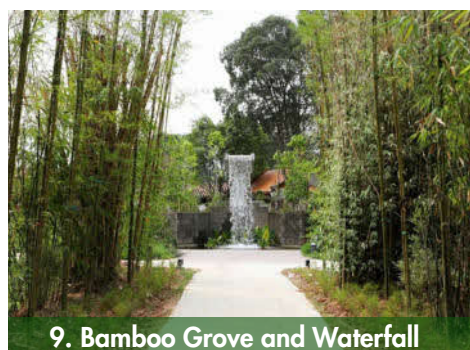

► 6 Bonsai Garden

Admire Suzhou-style architecture and landscaping with a specially selected bonsai collection meticulously curated by trained masters in an indoor gallery and outdoor garden setting.

► 7 8 Tea Pavillion & Stoneboat

Soak in the peaceful atmosphere at the Tea Pavillion that appears to float on water. Admire the beautiful **Lotus** (*Nelumbo nucifera*) flowers blooming over the serene waters.

You might also catch a glimpse of the **Blue Glassy Tiger** (*Ideopsis vulgaris*) fluttering above, the **Malayan Water Monitor** (*Varanus salvator*) gliding by, or the **Green Paddy Frog** (*Hylarana erythraea*) hopping along.

► 9 Bamboo Grove and Waterfall

Walk through the bamboo grove and experience the interplay of sweet scents from fragrant blooms and wind from the waterfall at the end of the tunnel.
