

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) for the GTS

1. How many partners can we include for each project? Can we add more partners after the project has started?

At the point of application, the application must consist of a developer, a main contractor, one consultant and one subcontractor. It may include related firms, e.g. a prefabrication specialist that is a subsidiary of the builder in the alliance.

Subject to BCA's approval, more firms may be added during the qualifying period to meet the key outcomes and workplan objectives.

2. How much grant will the Successful Applicant receive?

In general, the GTS can support up to 70% of qualifying costs (on a reimbursement basis). Actual co-funding levels will be subjected to BCA's evaluation based on the ambition of the outcomes and scope of the specific initiatives in the workplan.

3. When must the GTS funded initiatives be completed?

It must be completed within five years from the date of application.

4. What are the GTS deliverables?

At the application stage, alliances are to submit a business workplan of at least three years, detailing how the group of firms will work collectively to lead more ambitious targets under the BE Industry Transformation Map.

Upon grant commencement, alliances are required to submit half-yearly reports for BCA's progress tracking.

5. If I am main contractor/consultant/subcontractor, am I allowed to participate in applications submitted by different developers?

Firms can concurrently participate in more than one application. However, firms must undertake the necessary due diligence to ensure that the same initiatives are not being proposed across multiple applications. BCA reserves the right to reject the entire application if the submission is not in order.
