[NEW] World Aquatic Championships – Singapore 2025 – exclusive events (until 22 August)*

Experience various **World Aquatics Championships – Singapore 2025 exclusive events** all around the Singapore Sports Hub! Explore sponsor booths and visit the Official Merchandise Store at the Fan Zone at OCBC Square, try out interactive stations at the Community Roadshow at Kallang Wave Mall, or even learn more about the various aquatics sports through talks, chats and meet-and-greet with athletes at the Sports Hub Auditorium.

[NEW] Flippa Ball Frenzy Grand Finale (26 July)

Flippa Ball Frenzy provided an opportunity for almost 1,500 youths and seniors to experience this modified form of water polo, played in a shallower pool and with feet touching the bottom. Following two months of workshops and programmes, the event will culminate in friendly competition at the **Grand Finale** on 26 July, where eight teams will battle it out to come out as champions.

[NEW] Aqua Dance Spectacular (2 August)

To highlight the benefits of aquatic exercises among seniors, ActiveSG will be hosting **Aqua Dance Spectacular**, featuring a morning filled with aqua aerobics and aqua fun fit activities. As part of this year's National Day Celebrations through GASG, participants will also be joining in a special aqua edition of Dance of the Nation, choreographed to a remix of this year's National Day theme song, "Here We Are".

Held across five ActiveSG Sport Centres across Singapore, the event is also looking to set a record in the Singapore Book of Records for the largest synchronised aqua aerobics event, with more than 1,000 participants expected.

For those who would like to witness the record being set, the entire event – featuring the festivities across all five sport centres – will be screened live at OCBC Square at the Singapore Sports Hub.

Making its debut is **Pickleball Palooza** at OCBC Square, a fun, inclusive event celebrating the sport of pickleball for all ages and skill levels. Building on pickleball's current surge in popularity, participants can look forward to introductory sessions, friendly matches, and fun challenges designed to get more people trying their hand at the paddle sport.

The event is open all members of the public, regardless of skill level.

[NEW] ActiveSG Para Sport Academy (PSA) Swim Competition (23 August)

The inaugural ActiveSG Para Sport Academy (PSA) Swim Competition will allow persons with different types of disabilities and varying skill levels to experience swimming in a competition setting. To ensure that swimmers of all skill levels can participate, the event features unique categories such as swimming with aids, allowing even new para swimmers get in on the action.

Making its debut as part of GASG, this swim competition brings the para sport community together – athletes, coaches, parents, caregivers and more – to celebrate National Day. The competition also seeks to drum up excitement among the community for the upcoming World Para Swimming Championships, happening in Singapore from 21 to 27 September.

Pesta Sukan (ongoing)

Pesta Sukan, Singapore's oldest and largest multi-sport community event, includes even more sporting activities for both sport enthusiasts and casual participants this year.

Featuring 37 sports in total – of which 11 include para categories – and signature events like the AQUA Ekiden, Round Island Bike Adventure, and Singapore Urban Walk Challenge, Singaporeans can look forward to celebrating the lead up to National Day with exciting competitive sports action all across Singapore.

This year's edition sees six new sports being introduced, with golf, beach wrestling and mind sports such as Chess, Contract Bridge, Weiqi and Xiangqi expanding the competition's reach to

new audiences. The second edition of the **Pesta Sukan Community Championship**, happening until 3 August and organised in collaboration with the People's Association, also returns with two more sports – bowling and floorball – to offer new opportunities for participants from various districts and neighbourhoods to come together in celebration of unity and camaraderie through sport.

ActiveX Playdate @ Senior Sports Day (until 22 August)*

The **ActiveX Playdate @ Seniors Sports Day** is specially designed to encourage seniors to lead an active and healthy lifestyle and foster intergenerational bonding through sport and physical activity. Students from participating primary and secondary schools and junior colleges are paired with seniors from Active Ageing Centres, to engage them in modified team sports such as seated floorball and ladder toss. As part of the experience, student leaders will join motivators on stage for the GASG Workout – Dance of the Nation. They will also lead the reciting of the Pledge, before singing the national anthem together with the seniors.

The initiative is aimed at promoting intergenerational bonding, mutual respect, and communication between students and seniors.

Active Health Community Fitness Challenge (AHrena) (until 23 August)*

At the **Active Health Community Fitness Challenge (AHrena)**, members of the public can discover their potential and learn more about the key areas of fitness through a series of engaging and educational fitness activities. The full suite features five key areas – cardiovascular fitness, agility, balance, strength and power – and helps highlight how these components are important for day to day living.

At Singapore Sports Hub, learn more about the importance of building **strength** to prevent muscle loss and remain functional and independent amidst ageing, and how good muscular **power** boosts both athletic and every day performance while lowering risk of injury.

Lion City Dance Convention (26 July to 3 August)*

Back for its fifth edition, the **Lion City Dance Convention (LCDC)** continues to serve as a key platform for Singapore's vibrant street dance community to come together to build interest and participation through learning and competition opportunities with renowned dance studios and instructors. Once again, participants and attendees can expect intense dance battles and

spectacular crew showcases, evaluated by an all-star panel of local talent and international dance icons.

The **ActiveSG Football Academy (AFA) Football Fiesta**, organised by the ActiveSG Football Academy, seeks to create an inclusive sporting experience that celebrates diversity and promotes football accessibility for children and youths of all abilities. Featuring specially curated mini-competitions, the initiative brings together AFA participants, their parents and football partners, with the aim of fostering inclusive sporting opportunities, building confidence through team activities, and promoting football as a sport for everyone.

Youth@Play (5 and 8 August)*

Now into its second year, Youth@Play this year is organised in collaboration with local Institutes of Higher Learning (IHLs) such as the Institute of Technical Education (ITE) and Republic Polytechnic to deliver a variety of sporting activities for their students. These include learn-to-play workshops, as well as sport games and try-outs.

Held for the third consecutive year, **Majulah Fiesta at the Singapore Sports Hub** features familiar favourites as the nation celebrates SG60 through all things Singaporean. Expect free and fun-filled activities for the entire weekend, to be enjoyed with family and friends!

Kicking off festivities on 8 August and available through to 10 August is **the ALIVE Artisans Market**, held in partnership with INVADE, featuring handcrafted items and creative products from more than 20 local brands.

On 9 August, start the day by working up a sweat at the **Majulah Fiesta Fitness Party** at OCBC Square. From 1pm, **Majulah Music Hub**, the annual National Day concert at Singapore Sports Hub, will take centre stage. Presented by Music & Drama Company and Kallang Alive Sport Management (KASM), the concert will be headlined by local musicians The Island Voices, Iman Fandi, Dominic Chin, Gail Belmonte, Khim Ng, RINES and Aaron Bunac.

Over at the 100PLUS Promenade, Pets Play Day makes a return. This year, in collaboration with Good Pet Fair, the **Good Pet Fair | Kampong Edition** aims to bring together the local community of pet owners to celebrate National Day as one. Then, towards the evening, stay on to watch the

live screening of the national day parade at OCBC Square, Stadium Riverside Walk and Stadium Roar. Marvel at the **State Flag Flypast** and be mesmerised by the 5-minute **fireworks display over the Kallang Basin**, before Majulah Music Hub takes over to wrap up the night.

Majulah Fiesta Fitness Party and **Good Pet Fair | Kampong Edition** will continue on 10 August. Animal lovers and pet owners can look forward to informative talks on a range of topics including Basic Cat Grooming and Physiotherapy for Dogs, and fun activities such as flyball with dogs and the Best Dressed Pets Parade.

National Day Heartland Celebrations (10 August)

Happening across five locations around Singapore, the **National Day Heartland Celebrations** aim to bring the festivities closer to Singaporeans. The celebrations are organised by the People's Association (PA), in partnership with the National Day Parade 2025 (NDP 2025) Executive Committee.

At these sites, residents can enjoy exciting family-friendly activities co-created by PA and its grassroots organisations together with volunteers and partners. Besides the mobile columns, there will also be exhibits, live performances, and a grand finale featuring fireworks and a drone show. There will also be sport try-outs*, as well as kampung games to foster community engagement.

Members of the public can also learn more about the SG60 \$100 ActiveSG credits and Team Nila – Singapore's national sport volunteerism movement. The Active Health Community Fitness Challenge, where visitors can test their fitness levels through sport-specific fitness challenges, will also be available for the public to try out.

Play Inclusive 2025 (22 and 23 August)*

Reflecting GASG's spirit of togetherness, **Play Inclusive 2025**, Singapore's largest inclusive sport competition and a flagship initiative under the refreshed Disability Sports Master Plan, will return

for its eighth edition. Co-organised by SportCares, the philanthropic arm of SportSG, alongside Special Olympics Singapore and the Singapore Disability Sports Council, the event is aimed at raising awareness of disability and inclusive sports through shared sporting experiences. This year, over 1,200 athletes of diverse abilities and their unified partners are expected to compete side by side at events across three locations around the Singapore Sports Hub – OCBC Arena, Kallang Football Hub and Kallang Tennis Hub.

Public engagements will also make a return, featuring inclusive sport activities and try-outs at OCBC Square. There will also be partner booths at the OCBC Arena, where the public can learn more about various offerings for persons with disabilities (PWD).
