1.	Ustaz Pasuni Maulan 	Role: Current Chairman, ARB Background: Ustaz Pasuni Maulan is a respected religious leader whose long-standing contribution to the Asatizah Recognition Board (ARB) has been instrumental in shaping the development and professionalism of the <i>asatizah</i> fraternity. He has served on the Board since 2007, contributing actively to the evolution of the Asatizah Recognition Scheme (ARS) and the institutional strengthening of ARB as a professional oversight body. As one of the early advocates for the ARS, he played a catalytic role in promoting the recognition of qualified <i>asatizah</i> and enhancing their credibility as trusted religious guides for the Muslim community. Appointed Vice-Chairman in 2015, Ustaz Pasuni oversaw the introduction of the Continuing Professional Education (CPE) framework, which further professionalised the <i>asatizah</i> sector by emphasising lifelong learning and ethical conduct. He was later appointed Chairman of ARB in January 2023, where he led the Board in making key decisions on ARS applications, including approvals, and cancellations. Under his leadership, ARB continued to uphold the Code of Ethics and strengthen governance



		processes to ensure that <i>asatizah</i> discharge their duties responsibly, with integrity and relevance to Singapore's multi-religious context.
4.	Ustaz Sallim Bin Jasman 	Role: Long-Serving Member, ARB Background: Ustaz Sallim Jasman brings decades of experience in Syariah law, mediation and education. As former President of the Syariah Court, he has played a central role in strengthening Islamic legal administration and family dispute resolution in Singapore. His measured judgement and deep institutional knowledge enrich ARB's advisory panel, ensuring continuity of standards and integrity in religious leadership.
5.	Ustaz Mohamad Hasbi Bin Hassan 	Role: Long-Serving Member, ARB Background: Ustaz Mohamad Hasbi Hassan is a senior <i>asatizah</i> and respected religious scholar who has played a pivotal role in strengthening the Asatizah Recognition Scheme (ARS) and shaping the ethical and professional standards upheld by the ARB. As one of ARB's longest-serving members, Ustaz Hasbi has been deeply involved in the Board's deliberations since its formative years, providing wisdom and balance in evaluating <i>asatizah</i> applications and guiding policy discussions on professional and ethical conduct. His contributions helped anchor ARB's role as a trusted, independent body that safeguards the



		credibility of Islamic teaching and upholds public confidence in the <i>asatizah</i> fraternity. Drawing on his decades of leadership experience in Pergas, MUIS, and the broader religious sector, Ustaz Hasbi has consistently advocated for the professional development of <i>asatizah</i> — emphasising integrity, continuous learning, and service grounded in <i>amanah</i> and <i>ikhlas</i>. He continues to provide valuable counsel to ARB, especially in the development of standards that align religious authority with contemporary societal needs, ensuring that the <i>asatizah</i> community remains a credible and unifying force in Singapore's religious landscape.

Ustazah Dr Sukarti Binte Asmoin 	Role: Long-Serving Member, ARB & Member, Continuing Professional Education (CPE) Panel Background: Ustazah Dr Sukarti Asmoin is a long-serving member of the Asatizah Recognition Board (ARB), recognised for her depth of experience, wisdom, and balanced judgement in matters relating to <i>asatizah</i> recognition and conduct. Her leadership has been instrumental in strengthening ethical governance within the Board's deliberations. As one of the senior voices on the CPE Panel, Ustazah Sukarti also contributes to ensuring that professional learning and continuous development among <i>asatizah</i>



		remain relevant, high in quality, and aligned with ARB's code of ethics and community expectations. Her decades of service in Islamic education and institutional leadership lend her a holistic understanding of the asatizah ecosystem.
