

ISSUANCE OF LETTER OF INTENT

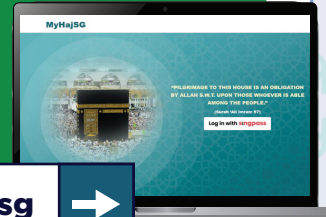

The Haj Office will issue the **Letter of Intent** to eligible applicants from 31 October 2025 onwards via the MyHajSG portal.

Applicants who receive the email and SMS notification are required to log in to the portal to retrieve their letter.

If you wish to **ACCEPT**, here are the steps to follow:

STEP 1

Book an Appointment for Haj Medical Assessment

Upon receiving the Letter of Intent, you should schedule an appointment with a registered medical practitioner (doctor) in Singapore for your Haj Medical Assessment.



Please bring along your NRIC and Letter of Intent for verification purpose.

STEP 2

Undergo the Haj Medical Assessment

Clearly inform your registered medical practitioner (doctor) that you wish to undergo the Haj Medical Assessment. Share details of any existing medical conditions, medications, or mobility concerns to help the registered medical practitioner (doctor) make an accurate assessment.



STEP 3

Receive Medical Health Certificate

Once the medical assessment is completed, the registered medical practitioner (doctor) will issue you with a Medical Health Certificate for your retention, regardless of the assessment outcome.



Please safekeep the issued Medical Health Certificate. Applicants must submit the certificate when purchasing Haj packages. Failure to do so will result in disqualification from purchasing the packages and receiving a Haj visa.

STEP 4

Make Your Decision

You are required to log in to the MyHajSG portal again to indicate your decision regardless of the assessment outcome.



To be completed by Friday, 21 November 2025.

If you are certified as **Medically Fit**, Select

I Accept



If you are certified as **Medically Unfit**, you should either:

▶ **Defer** your Haj and select

I Wish to Defer



▶ **Cancel** your Haj and select

I Wish to Cancel



Accepting the Letter of Intent does not guarantee an offer to perform Haj, as the final selection will depend on the applicant's position in the Haj registration queue.



Applicants may choose to defer or cancel their application at any time without completing the medical assessment if they no longer wish to proceed with their intention to perform Haj.
