



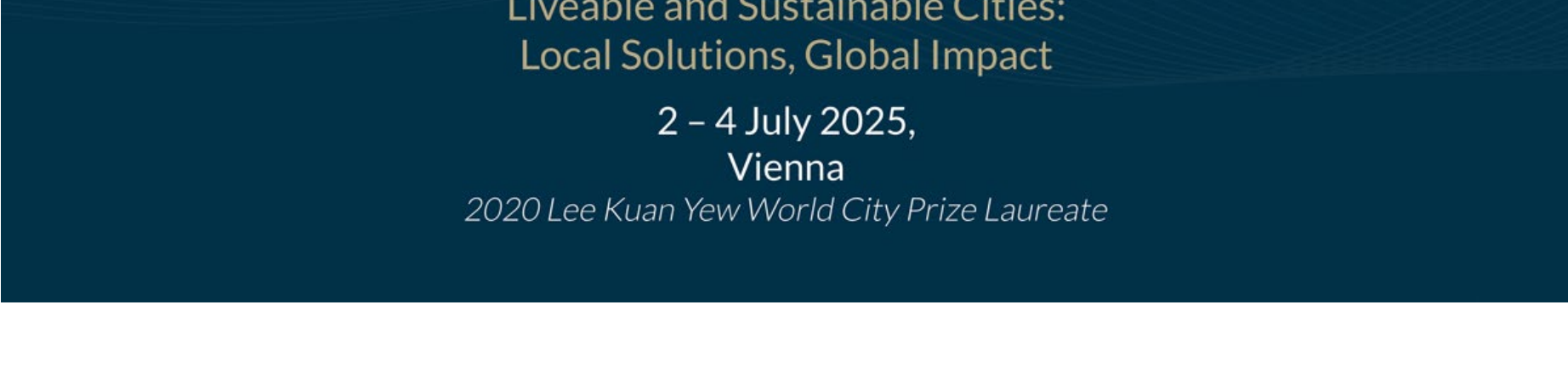
Connect with CLC at the COP30 Singapore Pavilion!

It was curated by Metropolis’ foresight team and supported by the United Nations Development Programme.

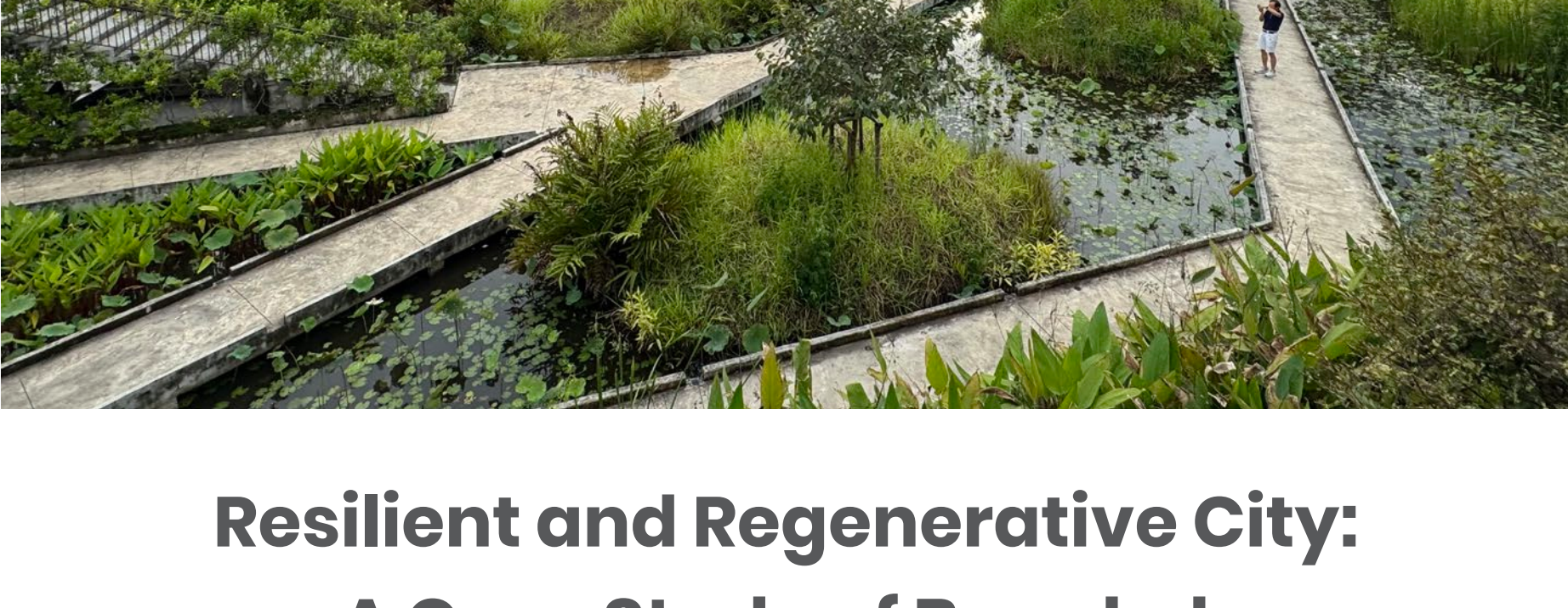
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9th Megacity Think Tank Alliance Forum 2025

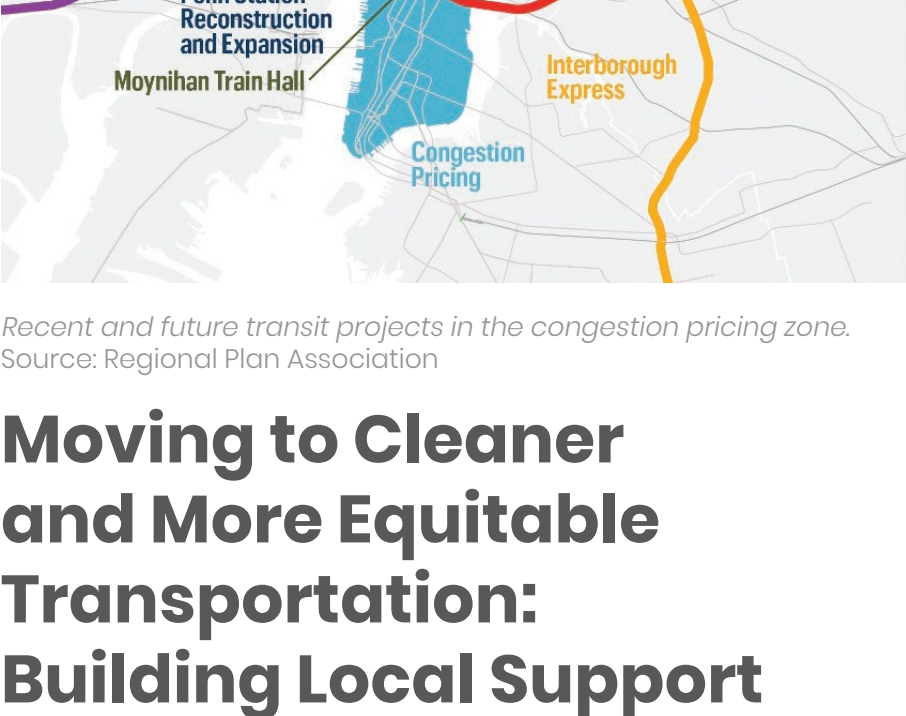
Lecture Report: Shaping Liveable Cities: A Cross-Domain Approach to Sustainable Mobility
