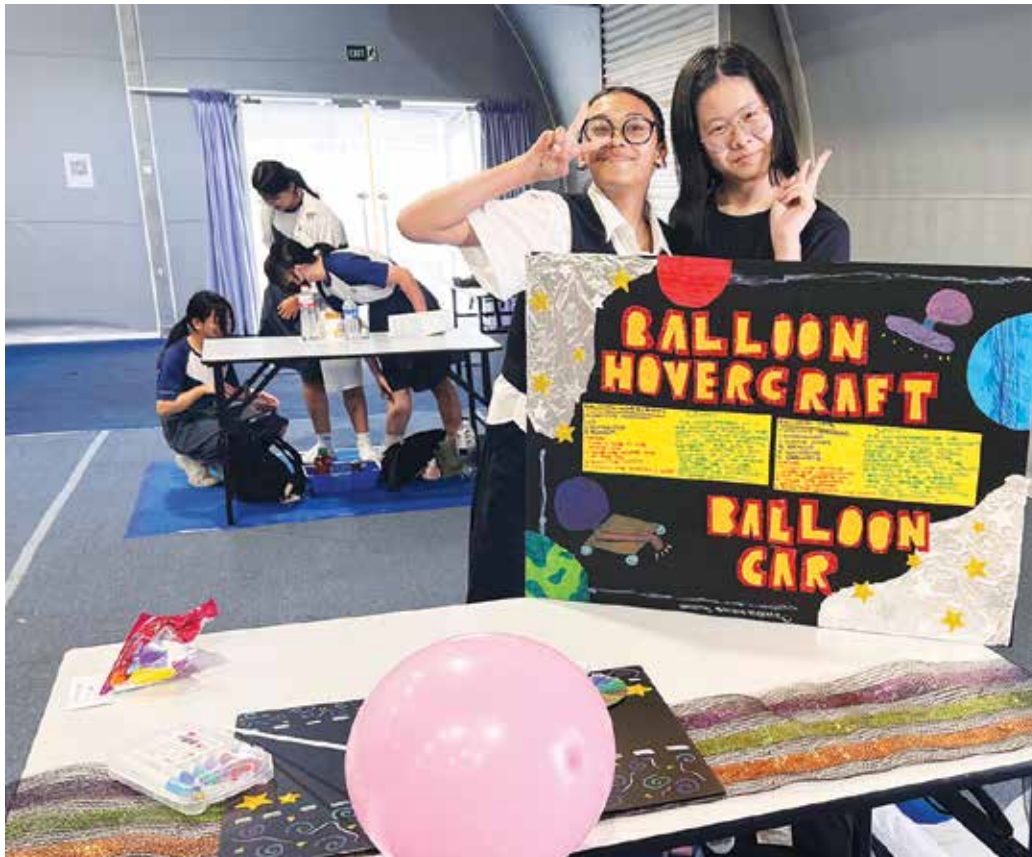

Our lower secondary curriculum builds foundational skills through D&T design thinking, eSketching, and instrumental music development, progressing to ensemble playing and collaborative musical growth that enhances listening, teamwork, and performance abilities. Students engage in captivating hands-on projects from building catapults and bridges with popsicle sticks to exploring culinary arts through investigative food science experiments that develop both technical skills and critical thinking. Real-life problem-based learning addresses authentic challenges like creating nutritious dishes for family members with diabetes, demonstrating grateful acts whilst applying scientific knowledge with empathy and respect for dietary needs. LIBRARY AND MEDIA CLUB



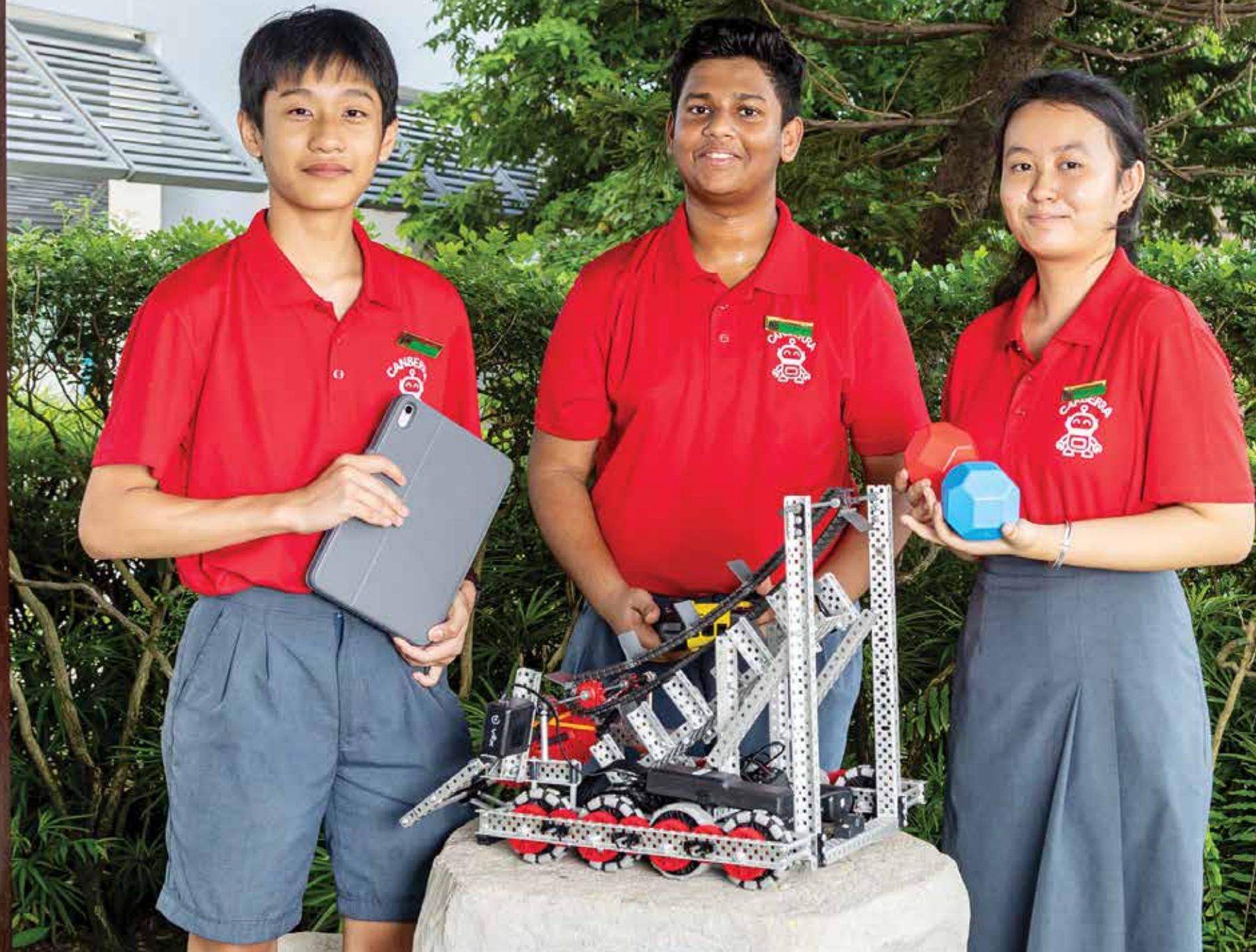

Through our comprehensive three-tiered framework, students progress from Personal Leadership where they learn basic principles and guide peers in projects like the Cheer Competition, to Team Leadership where CCA leaders collaborate in organising major events including Sports Fest and National Day Parade, culminating in Servant Leadership where Student Council members engage as Community Youth Leaders through advanced programmes like the Student Leaders Network whilst leading initiatives such as the Student Suggestion Scheme and Canberran Spotlight. By graduation, our leaders demonstrate essential competencies including self-awareness, relationship management, and responsible decision-making, emerging as passionate mentors ready to serve with distinction and contribute meaningfully to their communities.



LEARNING FOR LIFE PROGRAMME

Canberra Secondary School's Learning for Life Programme, GRC GEMS in Action, develops Community Youth Leadership through understanding and serving different life stages. Our signature four-year programme guides students through the stages of L.I.F.E—Life, Infirm, Frail, and End-in-mind—beginning with Secondary One students celebrating their unique identity whilst advocating for family and relationships through specially-curated challenges and experiences. As students progress through secondary school, they deepen their understanding of each life stage through research, reflection, and meaningful service initiatives that connect them with diverse community members. Through regular community engagement and authentic service experiences, our students develop empathy and compassion whilst building confidence as youth leaders who impact their communities. By graduation, our Canberrans emerge as caring, community-minded leaders ready to serve with distinction and make positive contributions to society.



APPLIED LEARNING PROGRAMME

Canberra Secondary's Applied Learning Programme in Visual Arts and Design creates dynamic intersections between Art and ICT through innovative challenge-based learning experiences. Students engage with authentic real-world problems, developing photography and videography skills whilst crafting meaningful visual narratives that address community themes. Our comprehensive curriculum spans photography modules covering DSLR functions and editing techniques, videography encompassing pre-production through post-production processes, and digital portfolio development for post-secondary pathways. Through collaborative projects addressing climate change, diverse society, sustainability, health, and security challenges, students apply the Find-Think-Apply>Create framework to research community needs, develop engaging stories, and communicate solutions through Google Sites e-portfolios. This programme nurtures both technical proficiency and artistic expression, empowering students as innovative problem-solvers who connect ideas, design solutions, and make positive impacts. Beyond learning digital tools, our ALP develops creative, responsible, and confident digital content creators equipped with essential 21st Century Competencies including communication, collaboration, and critical thinking, preparing them to contribute meaningfully to our increasingly digital world.



APPLIED LEARNING MODULES (ApLM)

Applied Learning Modules at ITE and Polytechnics provide enrichment opportunities for our Secondary 2 and 3 Canberrans, offering hands-on applied learning experiences in diverse fields including healthcare first aid, food and beverage, and wellness therapy. These modules help students discover their strengths and interests whilst experiencing post-secondary institutional life firsthand, from exploring culinary arts and first aid practices to learning therapeutic wellness techniques. At Canberra Secondary School, we are committed to ensuring all eligible Secondary 2 and 3 students gain valuable practical experience at these institutions, broadening access to enhanced engagement and improved learning outcomes. This strategic approach complements their secondary school curriculum by emphasising real-world application of knowledge, empowering students to explore career pathways and make informed decisions about their educational futures in various industries.



CONNECTING GLOBALLY

Our Overseas Learning Journeys equip students with 21st-century competencies whilst shaping them into effective leaders of character through meaningful cultural immersion and service-learning experiences across Malacca, Bali, Cambodia, Vietnam, and China. Secondary 2 students explore the rich heritage of Malacca whilst selected Secondary 3 Canberrans engage in transformative programmes encouraging critical thinking about community involvement, cultural diversity, and sustainability through conducting lessons for local beneficiaries. These global connections are strengthened when our partner schools visit us at Canberra, creating opportunities for students to host international guests and build cross-cultural friendships.
