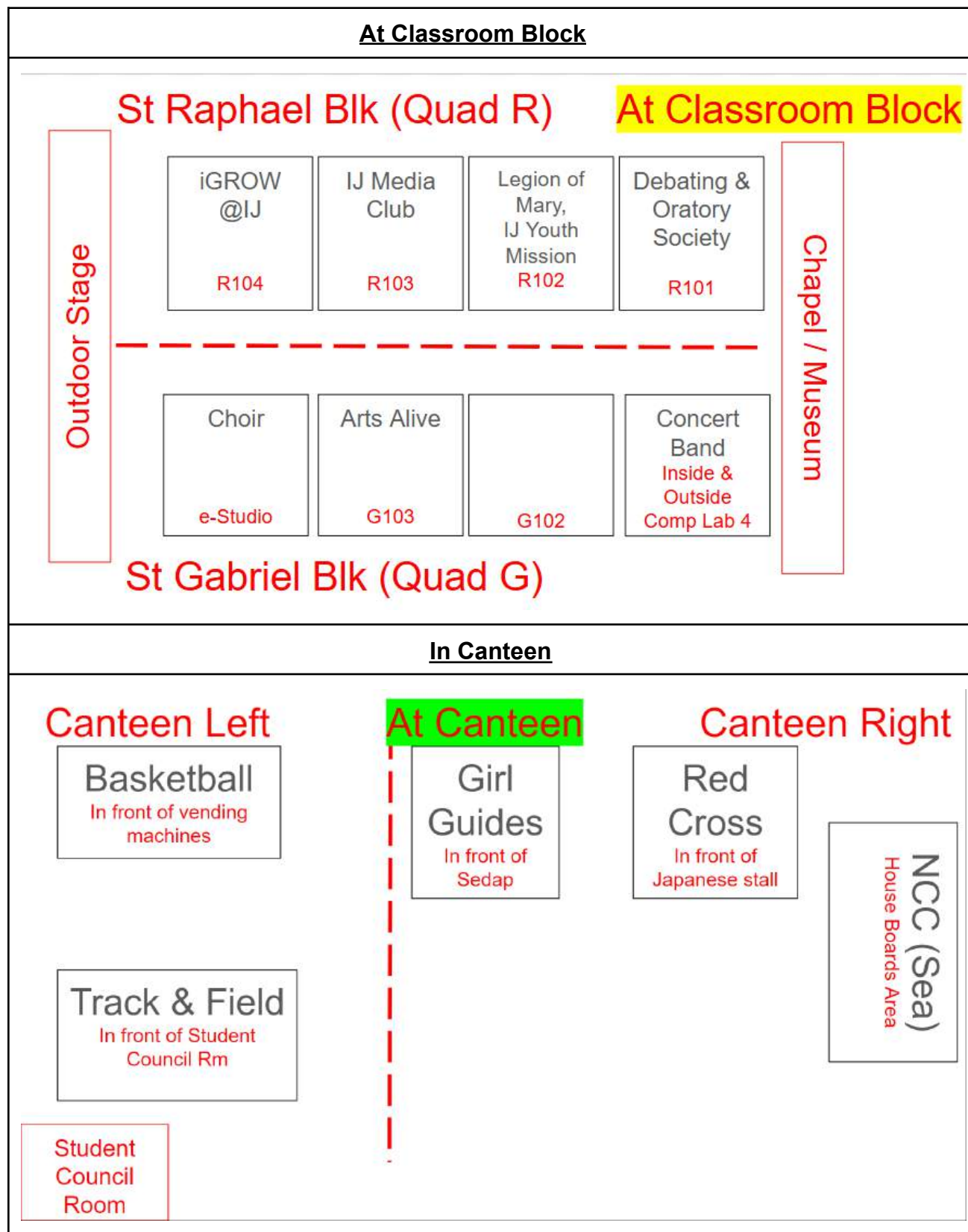

Intent of CCAs and CCA Policy

Our CCAs aim to develop the students' potential outside of the academic field in the following ways:

- Provide for physical, social and mental development
- Cultivate desirable values and attitudes
- Inculcate a sense of belonging in school
- Provide opportunities for the development of leadership skills and competencies.
- Cultivate life-long interests and skills
- Develop healthy lifestyles

It is the policy of MOE and the school that every student must participate in at least one CCA in the school throughout the student's 4 or 5-year stay in the school.

Entry Criteria for CCAs

Visual & Performing Arts

All performing arts CCAs will require students to go for selection trials. These trials will gauge students' potential and ability in the CCA. For Choir and Dance, some experience in the area is required. For Concert Band, Guitar Ensemble and IJ Theatre, a strong interest and willingness to learn is necessary. For Arts Alive!, some places will be reserved for students with prior experience.

Sports and Games

Students in the Sports CCAs will be given opportunities to represent school and as such, students who wish to join should be able to play the sport competently. Coaches are available to help these athletes achieve success in numerous sports competitions. The Sports CCAs will conduct selection trials for those who wish to join. The school's Tennis, Netball CCAs do have some spaces for those with limited experience and are willing to learn.

Uniformed Groups (UGs).

All students are welcome to join these CCAs. These students should be ready to participate fully in the many challenging, adventurous and fun activities in the UG CCAs.

Clubs and Societies

Students who wish to join the Debating and Oratory Society will be required to attend a selection trial. For IJ Media Club, some places will be reserved for students with prior experience. The other Clubs and Societies are open to students who possess an interest in the CCA, as well as a desire to learn and contribute.

CCA Selection and Allocation

The process for CCA selection and allocation is as follows:

1. All Secondary One students and their parents will attend a briefing by the HoD CCA who will explain the importance of participating in a CCA, the school's CCA policy and how CCAs and other co-curriculum activities are graded.
2. Students will visit the various CCA booths to gather information about the various activities on offer during CCA Orientation. They may also approach the respective CCA teachers, prior to making their selection, to find out more about the CCA.
3. Secondary One students are encouraged to attend the various CCA selections of their CCA choices.
4. CCA trial and selection results will be published by 27 January 2026 (Tuesday).

6. By Mid February, all Secondary One students will be informed of their allocated CCA and should start attending CCA practice as soon as possible.

As far as possible, the school will try to allocate CCAs according to the student's 6 choices. However, the school needs to ensure that the needs of each CCA are also met and at the same time, ensure that none of the CCAs are over- or under- subscribed.

CCA Grading

The CCA Grading Scheme ((LEAPS) takes into consideration a number of new initiatives implemented in the last few years, like the Student Leadership Programme, Values-In-Action Programme and the Character and Citizenship Education Programme.

Since 2014, LEAPS 2.0 guides the recognition process for all co-curricular activities in the school.

Key Domains in LEAPS 2.0 with a focus on “Broadened Recognition; Stronger Student Centricity”

Participation

This domain recognises students’ participation in one school-based Co-Curricular Activity (CCA). Recognition is based on the number of years of participation (with sufficient attendance, i.e. 75%) and exemplary conduct and active contribution to the CCA. ***Sustained engagement in the same CCA*** allows for progressive development of character, skills, knowledge and friendships, and will be accorded higher recognition.

Service

This domain recognises students’ development as socially responsible citizens who contribute meaningfully to the community. Every secondary school student will contribute at least 6 hours per school year to the community. In CHIJ, students are also guided to embark on a Values-In-Action project (VIA). Students will be recognised for the time they put into planning, service and reflection, when participating in a VIA project.

Leadership

This domain recognises students’ leadership development. Recognition is accorded to students’ ability to take charge of personal development, work in a team and assume responsibilities, in the service of others. In addition to formal leadership appointments, participation in student leadership modules/workshops, the National Youth Achievement Award (NYAA) and leadership positions in the school, CCA or student-initiated/student-led projects will also be recognised.

Achievement

This domain recognises students' representation and accomplishment in co-curricular involvements beyond the classroom. Opportunities for representation and accomplishment present valuable learning experiences for students to learn discipline, resilience and develop their character. Students may represent the school or organisations endorsed by the school. Recognising external opportunities better caters to students' diverse interests and talents. It also recognises the community's role in developing the child.

- Representation refers to being selected and endorsed by the school or an organisation endorsed by the school (e.g. the community club or national association) to contribute, perform or compete. It need not be tied to his/her CCA in school.
- Accomplishment refers to attaining accolades and awards at competitions, festivals, performances, exhibitions, conferences and symposiums where the student represents the school or other organisations endorsed by the school.

Recognition of Co-curricular Experience

At the end of the graduating year, students' co-curricular attainment will be recognised according to Excellent/Good/Fair. The level of attainment will be converted to a bonus point(s) which can be used for admission to Junior Colleges/ Polytechnics/ Institutes of Technical Education (JC/Poly/ITE).

Co-Curricular Attainment	Details
Excellent (2 bonus points)	Student who attains a minimum Level 3 in all four domains with at least a Level 4 in one domain.
Good (1 bonus point)	Student who attains a minimum Level 1 in all four domains with any one of the following: i. At least Level 2 in three domains; ii. At least Level 2 in one domain and at least Level 3 in another domain; or iii. At least Level 4 in one domain.
Fair	Student's attainment in co-curricular will not translate into any bonus points.

The CHIJ Netball School Team has won the ‘B’ and ‘C’ Division titles many times over the years. This is a strong tradition that we are proud to uphold and defend. Annually, we compete in the South Zone Netball Championships (‘B’ Division) and subsequently move on to compete in the National Inter-School Netball Championships. In the ‘C’ Division, we play in the Pool/League A competition.

The competition season lasts from January to April for the ‘B’ division and May to August for the ‘C’ division. Naturally, our intensive and rigorous training begins in the months leading up to the competitions for each division.

Under the leadership and expertise of our coach Ms Kok Mun Wai, the CHIJ Netball School Team has flourished as her dedication and passion for the sport has contributed immensely to the netball legacy in CHIJ. It was through her guidance, with the support of the school, which led us to claim the double championship title for both ‘B’ and ‘C’ Division in both the South Zone Inter-school Netball Championships as well as National Inter-school Netball Championships consecutively in both 2015 and 2016. In 2017, we achieved championships for South Zone Inter-school Netball Championships while achieving 1st and 2nd placing for ‘C’ division and ‘B’ division for Nationals respectively. Through the team’s perseverance and determination to do our best, our team managed to clinch our double championships once again, both at the 2018 Zonal and National Championships. In 2019, we achieved champions for both divisions in the South Zone Inter-school Netball Championships and 2nd placing for ‘C’ division at the National Inter-school Championships. In 2022 and 2023, we achieved champions for both ‘B’ & ‘C’ divisions in the South Zone Inter-school Netball Championships. In 2025, we achieved 3rd place in the ‘B’ division National Inter-School Championships and 2nd place in the ‘C’ division League 1 competition.

However, the CHIJ Netball School Team is not only about winning competitions. Besides the annual championships, CHIJ Netball also plays friendly matches with many different schools and teams. Annually, the team also organises a team bonding retreat and beach training at Sentosa. This helps us to learn from the other players and allows us to gain more experience on and off the court.

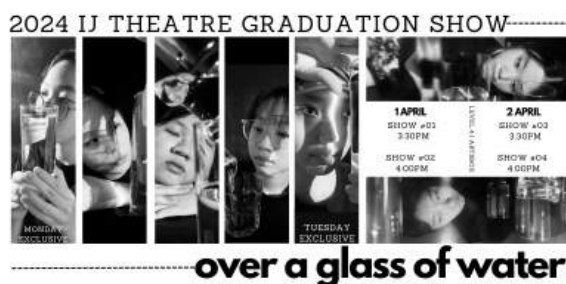

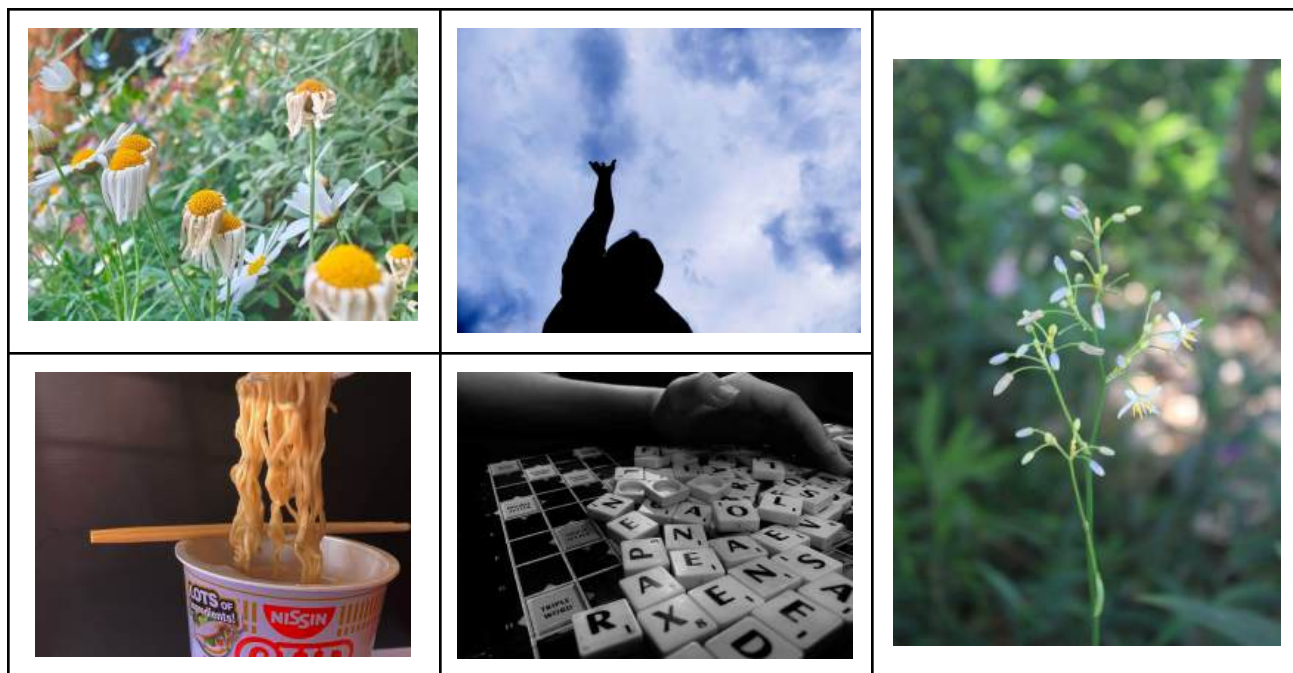

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. Which CCAs require trials and which do not?

There are CCAs that require you to pass trials/auditions before you can join the CCA. There are also CCAs that conduct try-outs for Sec 1s to experience the CCA, but the Sec 1s need not pass the try-out to join the CCA.

The full list of CCAs that require trials/auditions, or conduct trials, can be found on Page 7 and 8.

2. Do DSA Students need to participate in the CCA Trials/Auditions or submit our CCA Choices?

DSA Students do not need to participate in the trials/auditions. It is also not necessary for them to submit their CCA Choices, as their CCAs have been fixed, according to the talent areas that they entered the school by.

3. Are Sec 1 students allowed to start CCA training before the final CCA Allocation results are announced/put up?

If Sec 1 students would like to start training with the CCA (before the final CCA Allocation), they should approach Mr Daryl Chan for his permission individually first.

However, students should take note that starting CCA training before the final CCA allocation does not guarantee that they will be allocated to that CCA.

4. Can we appeal to join another CCA, after our final CCA Allocation is announced?

Students can appeal, but transfers will only be approved on a case-by-case basis, based on the circumstances provided, as well as the availability of places in the desired CCA.

5. What should I do if I would like to change my CCA, after a few months in the CCA?

- a. Speak to your CCA teacher and see if the concerns can be worked out.
- b. Continue attending your CCA until May or October, before approaching Mr Daryl Chan to discuss a possible change of CCA at his email: chan_chiang_daryl@moe.edu.sg
- c. Do take note that a change of CCA may have an adverse effect on your LEAPS2.0 grades.
