HOW THIS BOOK CAN BE USED

Appreciation is a learning disposition that prepares children for lifelong learning.

Children with a sense of appreciation recognise that everyone has unique qualities. They **respect everyone**, **value what others say**, and **learn from all**. Towards the end of the story, the main character, Bruno, showed appreciation when he realised that the other cats had valuable ideas from which he could learn. The other cats, in turn, valued Bruno's contribution of his voice. By putting all their ideas together and working as a team, the cats threw the best party ever.

You may want to read the story a few times to the children. The story can be used to guide children through the process of recognising and valuing the learning disposition of appreciation. Here are some suggestions:

To Help Children Recognise And Value The Learning Disposition Of Appreciation

Ask:

- Bruno did not like his friends' ideas at first and planned his own party. What was his party like compared to their party? Why were the two parties different?
- Why do you think Bruno was sorry? What had he learned from the other cats?
- Bruno's friends invited him to their party and showed that they valued his idea. How can you tell? Why do you think the cats had the best party ever?



"Shall I bring balloons?" asked Susu.


"Shall I bring some string to tie up the balloons?" asked Patches.




"Such great ideas!" mewed the cats.
But one cat was unhappy.


"No! No! I don't like your ideas!" said Bruno.
"I'm going to have a party of my own."


















The cats saw Bruno all by himself.
