## Guidelines and Suggested Template for Activity Ideas

### Overall Guidelines

1. Do ensure that the activity idea contributed is aligned to the NEL Framework, preferably by illustrating how the activity is linked to the belief, iTeach principles, learning areas and learning goals. You may wish to refer to the following resources:
  - a. Nurturing Early Learners – A Curriculum Framework for Kindergartens in Singapore
  - b. Nurturing Early Learners – Educators’ Guide
  - c. Nurturing Learning Dispositions – Curriculum Resources for Kindergartens
2. For contributions in Mother Tongue Language (MTL), do also refer to the following:
  - a. Nurturing Early Learners – Framework for Mother Tongue Languages
  - b. Nurturing Early Learners – Educators’ Guide for Mother Tongue Languages
3. Do keep the contribution concise (no more than 4 pages).
4. Do ensure that permission is obtained for all images used. Avoid using images from the Internet as there may be copyright issues.
