2026 Term 4 Updates

EOY Marking Days on 6 and 7 Oct 2026

The marking days for teachers will be from 6 – 7 Oct 2026. All students do not need to report to school on these two days.

Post-Exam Activities from 19 Oct to 21 Oct 2026

We will be having post-exam activities for our Secondary 1 to 3 students from 19 – 21 Oct. More details about the respective level activities will be provided nearer to the date.

Meet-the-Parents (MTP) on 23 Oct 2026

The year-end MTP for selected students will be held on 23 Oct. Only selected Secondary 1 to 3 parents and students will need to meet with the School Leaders and key personnel of the school. A Parents Gateway notification will be sent out to these parents closer to the date for them to book the preferred time slots for the meeting.

Haze Management in School

In view of the current haze conditions in Singapore, schools are monitoring the haze situation closely and will adjust school-based measures where necessary, taking reference from the Pollutant Standards Index (PSI) levels.

The school has put in place the following safety measures:

- i. Ensuring that air purifiers are deployed
- ii. Staff are ready to assist students who may be feeling unwell due to the haze or who are experiencing breathing difficulties.

If your child has a pre-existing lung or heart condition, please ensure that they bring their prescribed medication, such as an asthma inhaler, to school each day. Students will also be reminded to inform their teachers promptly if they feel unwell so that appropriate care and support can be provided. Parents should seek medical attention for children who are unwell or experiencing haze-related respiratory symptoms.

Please continue to check Parents Gateway regularly for updates. You may also contact the General Office directly if you have any queries. For more information on the current haze situation and general health advisories, please refer to the latest advisories by the National Environment Agency (NEA).

Thank you for your support as we work together to safeguard your child's health and well-being, while ensuring that learning continues in a safe environment.

Road Safety Outside the School

We have observed some parents/guardians allowing their child/ward to alight from vehicles in the second lane and cross the road to enter the school. This is extremely dangerous, as motorcycles may travel between vehicles and may not be able to stop in time. For everyone's safety, parents/guardians must only allow their child to alight at designated and safe drop-off points.

Parents are also reminded not to wait or park along the double yellow lines outside the school. Please refer to the Joint Road Safety Advisory shared in the Term 3 letter to parents. To minimize congestion and ensure the safety of all road users, parents should only proceed to the school after their child has informed them that they are ready to be picked up.

We seek your cooperation in observing these road safety practices and keeping our students safe.
