Dear Parents/Guardians

We are delighted to welcome your child back to North Vista Primary School. As we embark on a new academic year, we remain firmly committed to nurturing the values that shape our community—Respect, Resilience, Responsibility, Integrity, Care and Harmony, collectively known as the R³ICH values.

2026 also marks a leadership transition for the school. We extend our heartfelt appreciation to Mr Amran for his dedicated service and steadfast leadership. His contributions have helped strengthen the foundations of our school and shaped many positive practices that we continue to build upon. We wish him all the best at Horizon Primary School. At the same time, we warmly welcome Mr Azuan, as our new Vice-Principal. We look forward to working closely with him to continue advancing the school's vision and direction.

Each year, we place emphasis on one core value and create purposeful, age-appropriate opportunities for students to put it into practice. In 2025, we focused on Respect. In the new year, our spotlight is on the value of **Integrity**. We hope to guide our *Vistalites* to speak truthfully, honour their commitments, and make the right choices even when it is difficult or unobserved. By the end of their six-year journey with us, your child will have experienced and demonstrated all six values in ways that will help shape who they become. Your support in reinforcing and modeling these values at home will make a meaningful difference. When school reopens, students will also receive a lion mascot symbolising Integrity—a reminder to live out this value with courage, just like a lion.

Our teachers remain dedicated to building a vibrant *Community of Learners @ the School for the Future*. They will continue to design learning experiences that spark curiosity, strengthen character, and equip our students for a rapidly changing world.

We look forward to partnering with you in supporting your child's growth—in learning, independence, confidence and responsibility. As co-partners on this journey, we remain united in our mission to build character, inspire a love for learning, and nurture a safe, caring and respectful school where every child can reach their potential.

1. Fostering Care and Well-Being

Health, Safety and Insurance Matters

We seek your cooperation in ensuring your child receives timely medical attention should flu-like symptoms develop during the school year, and we ask that they remain at home until they have fully recovered. If your child becomes unwell while in school, we will contact you to arrange for early dismissal, as students who are unwell will not be permitted to go home on their own. MOE has also arranged a basic Student Protection Plan for all students in 2026; you may refer to the [link](#) provided for details. As this plan offers only essential accident coverage, you may wish to consider additional insurance for more comprehensive protection.

2. Building Independence and Responsibility

Establish Routines and Habits

We encourage you to guide your child in packing their school bag each day based on the class timetable provided. This helps them learn responsibility and keep track of what they need for school. HPB recommends that a child's school bag should be about 10%–15% of their body weight (about 3.5–4 kg for P1–4 students). Bulky items such as art blocks, dictionaries, and files may be stored in their class lockers. Please help your child establish the habit of packing their belongings the night before. If they forget an item, allow them to explain the situation to their teacher. These small experiences strengthen resilience and personal ownership. **As part of this learning, the school will not accept items for delivery to students.**

We also encourage you to label your child's belongings, such as water bottles, wallets and purses, with their name and class. Misplaced items can be found at the Lost & Found counter outside the Bookshop. Caring for their belongings is an important life skill that supports independence. Please also **iron and stitch the fabric nametags above the school crest of PE shirts and top left of school uniforms by Friday, 30 January 2026**. You may refer to the student organiser, Pg 9 and 10 for examples.

3. Following School Routines and Expectations

Flag Raising and Punctuality

The first day of school for P2 to P6 students will be on 5 Jan 2026 (Monday). To begin the day well, all students should arrive by **7.25 am** for the Flag Raising Ceremony, which begins promptly at 7.30 am. Students who arrive after 7.30 am will be marked late, and parents will be notified **after the third occurrence**. We strongly encourage all Vistalites to bring a story book to school for silent reading in the morning before assembly. We seek your support in keeping regular bedtimes, consistent morning routines and allowing enough travel time so your child starts each day calm and ready for school.

Proper Attire for School

Students are also expected to be **properly attired**. PE attire should be worn only on days with PE or PAL. On other days, students should be in their school uniform with **full black shoes and ankle-length socks**. Dressing neatly and following school rules helps students take pride in their appearance and understand the importance of personal discipline.

Use of Digital Devices

In line with the latest guidelines and policy by MOE on the usage of mobile devices such as handphones and smart watches, students are **not allowed** to use **their handphones or smartwatches** in school during school hours, which include remedial/supplementary lessons and CCAs. Handphones and smartwatches are to be kept in their bags or classroom lockers. Students are responsible for the safekeeping of their handphones and smart watches. The school will not be held responsible for the loss of phones or smart watches. Do note that the school will provide any necessary digital devices for in-class learning, eliminating the need for pupils to bring their own. Given the young age of your child /ward, we aim to promote physical activities and social engagement when he/she is at school.

4. Safety in Our Community

Road Safety Matters

Safety is a key priority in our school. Please refer to **Annex A** for the Joint Road Safety Letter from the Singapore Police Force, Land Transport Authority and the Singapore Road Safety Council. Please do go through the letter and communicate safety matters to your child/ward. Additional safety and security guidelines can also be found in the 2026 Student Organiser (pages 11 and 12). For the safety of all road users, we strongly urge parents driving into the school to slow down and adhere to the speed limit of **15 km/h**. Your cooperation helps keep our school environment safe for everyone.

Drop off routine when driving your child to school

As part of our ongoing commitment to ensuring the safety and efficiency of our school drop-off process, we kindly request your cooperation in preparing your child to sit on the **left side of your vehicle** during morning drop-offs. This adjustment will not only facilitate quicker and safer alight from the vehicle but also provide easy access to your child's belongings, streamlining the process for both parents and students. We appreciate your understanding and collaboration in prioritising the safety and well-being of all our students.

5. Key Administrative Matters for Noting

Early Dismissal on 5 Jan 2025 (P2- P6)

Please note that, as in previous years, our P2-P6 students will be dismissed at 12 noon on 5 Jan 2026 (Monday). From 6 Jan onwards, students will be dismissed at 1.30 pm if they do not have any after-school programmes.

Sale of school textbooks and uniform

You will be able to purchase the necessary school textbooks at the school bookshop located in the school canteen. The school uniform vendor will be in school **every Wednesdays* from 2.00 pm - 3.30 pm in January & February**, *(7, 14, 21 and 28 Jan 2026, 4, 11, 25 Feb 2026) should you need to purchase uniforms. **Uniforms will be sold at the school bookshop from 2 Mar 2026 (Monday)**. You may also purchase the school uniform from the school uniform vendor's retail store outside of the mentioned dates. For more information, please visit the [uniform vendor's website](#).

NVTPS Student Organiser 2026

The Student Organiser included in the booklist serves as a communication tool between parent and class teacher. Your child/ward can also use the Student Organiser to record his/her daily homework. It will be useful if you can go through the content with your child/ward daily. A copy of the Student Organiser will be issued to your child/ward on 5 January (Monday). If your child loses it, parents may purchase a replacement copy from the school bookshop.

Canteen Price Notice

Please refer to the attached canteen price list (**Annex B**) to help you gauge an appropriate amount of pocket money for your child. We currently have two vacant canteen stalls; do contact the school if you know of anyone who may be interested in applying.

Updating of Student Detail Form (SDF)

A Parents' Gateway (PG) message will be sent on **2 Jan 2026 (Friday)** requesting parents to verify/update your child's/ward's SDF. We kindly ask for your cooperation in completing this update by **31 Jan 2026 (Saturday)**. This exercise is vital to ensure we have the most current contact details and medical information for your child. Having accurate data is crucial, particularly in emergency situations. We appreciate your prompt attention to this matter.

P6 Photo Taking Exercise for school smart card on 3 Feb (Tuesday) and 4 Feb (Wednesday) 2026

Students are to report to school in their school uniform (yellow shirt/blouse) for the photo taking exercise. Students having Physical Education lessons will not need to be dressed in PE attire as the teacher will conduct Health Education lessons on that day. We will also not be sending another reminder. However, the school will remind students on the day before the photo taking to come in school uniform.

Learning Journeys for P3 and P4 students

Weighted Assessments for P3 to P6 students

Assessment is an integral part of the teaching and learning process. Our weighted assessments are formative in nature and are designed to support learning. They provide meaningful feedback to help students understand their strengths and identify areas for improvement, while also serving as checkpoints to guide their progress. P3 to P5 students will have weighted assessment at the end of each term and sit for an examination in term 4. P6 students will have non-weighted assessments for Term 1 and 2. 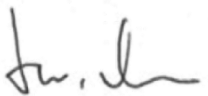

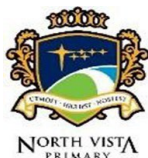

ROAD SAFETY OF STUDENTS

We would like to seek your cooperation in ensuring the safety of students travelling to and from school. As our students are still developing their road sense and spatial awareness, and may be less visible due to their height, your partnership is crucial in creating a safe school environment. The following provide parents of our school's road safety policies and guidelines.

Safe Driving Guidelines

When driving in the school vicinity, please

- Observe speed limits and remain vigilant for pedestrians within the school zone
- Follow all traffic rules and avoid reckless driving or illegal manoeuvres, e.g. turning into the school from the outer lane(s)
- Follow directions from traffic marshals to facilitate safe and smooth traffic flow
- Avoid the unnecessary honking
- Use designated student pick-up and drop-off points during school arrival and dismissal
- Where allowed, ensure swift and safe alighting of your child on the kerb side with the help of an adult

Student Safety Guidelines

Please remind your child to:

- Use designated pedestrian crossings and avoid jaywalking or crossing recklessly
- Refrain from running to catch buses, and avoid crossing in front of or behind stationary buses
- Do not play near or on the road
- Stay alert while crossing roads and keep mobile phones away
- Practise the 'Kerb Drill' before crossing:
 - Look right, look left, look right again
 - Ensure all vehicles have stopped
 - Raise hand to indicate crossing intention
 - Cross briskly when the vehicles have stopped entirely (at zebra crossings) or green pedestrian signal is displayed (at signalised crossings)

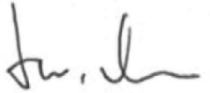
Additional Safety Reminders
