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Dear Parents/ Guardians,

Welcome back to Term 3! We hope our Vistalites enjoyed a well-deserved break and are returning refreshed and ready to learn.

In Term 2, our Vistalites participated in a range of thoughtfully curated learning experiences. One notable highlight was our school-wide Values-in-Action programme, **“Celebrating Our Everyday Heroes,”** which recognised and honoured the support staff who play an important role in our students’ daily school lives. Held on 30 April, ahead of Labour Day, students had the opportunity to interview and express their appreciation to these unsung heroes. Through this meaningful initiative, students learnt to value the contributions of others, practise the school value of Respect through thoughtful interactions, by showing sincerity, gratitude and appreciation in both words and actions.

Another memorable event was our Vista Wonders experiential learning festival, themed **“One World, Many Wonders.”** Over two days, students explored English, Mathematics, and Science through hands-on, immersive activities. It was encouraging to see our students taking the lead and confidently guiding their peers through the various learning stations.

We also celebrated International Friendship Day with vibrancy and enthusiasm. It was a meaningful opportunity to deepen their appreciation for cultural diversity and friendship across borders.

Earlier this term, our Performing Arts groups concluded their Singapore Youth Festival (SYF) Arts Presentations, while our Senior Division National School Games (NSG) teams also wrapped up their competition season. We are proud of our Vistalites for their commitment, resilience and teamwork throughout their training, performances and competitions. Beyond the achievements and outcomes, these experiences have provided valuable opportunities for our students to grow in confidence, discipline and sportsmanship.

We also celebrated the accomplishments of our Uniformed Groups, whose members demonstrated leadership, service and dedication through various unit-level and individual achievements. We are also proud of three of our Vistalites who were recognised with the Singapore Silent Heroes Award for their quiet acts of service and positive contributions to the community. These experiences have helped our students develop character, teamwork and a strong sense of responsibility.

In addition, many of our Vistalites represented the school in academic competitions and enrichment programmes, including Mathematics and Mother Tongue Language events. Cultural Performance Exposure Scheme (CPES)

Initiated by the Committee to Promote Chinese Language Learning (CPCLL), the Chinese Play External Showcase (CPES) aims to nurture students' interest in the Chinese language and culture through immersive learning experiences beyond the classroom. 3. Safety in School

Food Passing at Side Gate 3 During Recess

The safety and well-being of our Vistalites remain our priority. We have observed that some parents and students gather near Side Gate 3 during recess for the passing of food items. While well-intentioned, this practice makes it difficult for the school to keep track of who students may be interacting with and what items may be passed on to them.

As recess is an important time for students to socialise with their peers and develop their social and emotional competencies, we would like to encourage students to spend this time interacting with their friends within the school environment.

For students with specific dietary requirements, parents are encouraged to prepare and pack the necessary food items for their child to bring to school in the morning. For most students, the school canteen continues to provide a range of food and beverage options during recess. We also see this as an opportunity for our Vistalites to develop responsibility by preparing for the school day and managing their needs independently.

We seek parents' support and understanding as we work together to provide a safe and conducive environment for all students.

Social Responsibility

We seek your continued support in safeguarding the well-being of all students. If your child/ward is unwell, please bring them to see a doctor and keep them at home until they have fully recovered. If the recovery takes time and

they need to return to school while still experiencing mild symptoms, we encourage them to exercise social responsibility by wearing a mask to protect both themselves and others.

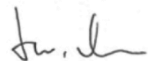
