Principal's Letter to Parents

Term 4, 2026

Dear Parents/Guardians

Welcome back to Term 4, our final term of the year.

As we begin this last stretch, our school community was reminded by 2 Chronicles 15:7: "*Be strong and do not give up, for your work will be rewarded.*" at this morning's devotion sharing.

These words are especially meaningful as our girls work towards the year-end examinations and the many milestones ahead. Yet, as a school, we want to remind our girls that **success is not measured only by outcomes**. Results matter, but so do the effort, perseverance, courage and growth that happen along the way.

Some girls may return to school feeling energised; others may feel anxious or tired as they think about what lies ahead. What they need most is the assurance that **they are not alone**.

This is where the partnership between home and school matters deeply. As parents, you can encourage your daughters to take ownership of their learning - to identify what they need to catch up on, seek help when they are unsure, manage their time and take one step at a time. At the same time, let us remind them that a difficult result does not define them, and that a setback is not the end of their journey.

Sometimes, what a child needs most is not another reminder to "do better", but a parent who says, "**I see how hard you are trying. Keep going. We are with you.**"

As we move through Term 4, let us continue to partner one another - school and home - to support, encourage and motivate our girls, while giving them space to rest, reflect and grow.

1. Learning in this Final Lap for our Graduating Sec 4/5 and Sec 1 to 3 Girls

- a. Revision and Home Support. Our girls will be spending more time on personal learning and revision in this last stretch prior to their major examinations. Some teachers may have also contacted you on your daughter's learning and progress. For a start, ask your daughter to share her revision schedule or plan, and ask how she would like you to support her. Over meals and breaks, talk to her about life beyond the examinations and purpose, be present and listen.
- b. For our Graduating Cohort. The **Night Study Programme** will resume from *16 to 24 Sep*, and the graduating girls' **Study Break** will commence from *Monday, 28 Sep* (for majority, except our Sec 4N girls who will have their Phase 2 Intensive Lessons from *28 - 29 Sep*)

and they need not report to school. The girls are strongly encouraged to make appointments with their subject teachers for individual or small-group consultations from 28 Sep. Teachers may also contact individual students or small groups of students who may require more customised support.

Last, the **JC DSA and Polytechnic/ITE EAE outcomes** were gradually released up until Monday, 7 Sep. The school is in the midst of collating the outcomes with the girls' help. Beyond this, parents can play a pivotal role in helping our girls make decisions about their post-secondary education pathways and their choice of future courses and careers. Before we can do so, we need to have up-to-date information. Here are some useful resources:

2. **Baccalaureate Service cum Graduation Day for Graduating Sec 4/5 Cohort**

Our Baccalaureate Service cum Graduation Day for our graduating girls will be held on Friday, 25 Sep. We thank God for this key milestone in the lives of our graduating students as the school wishes them well in their endeavours beyond the national examinations. Parents of our graduating girls have been invited to attend the Graduation Ceremony after the Service.

Sec 1 to 3 students will be dismissed from school at 10.30am on Friday, 25 Sep.

We would like to thank PL Alumni, PL Parent-School Support Group (PSSG) and Paya Lebar Methodist Church (PLMC) for their tremendous support for this event.

3. 110th Founder's Day on 9 Oct 2026

PLMGS will celebrate our milestone 110th Founder's Day on Friday, 9 Oct. Sec 1 to 3 students will attend the Founder's Day Service in the morning, and will be dismissed by 11.00 am. **Students are to report to school at 7.30 am in full uniform with school tie.**

4. End-Of-Year WRAP Up (Post- Examination) Programme for Sec 1 to 3 Girls

Dates of the End-of-Year WRAP Up (Post-Examination) Programme were shared in earlier letters by the school. As part of the post-examination programme, **We** take time to **Recharge, Reflect, Affirm & Play (WRAP)**. Highlights include Inter-class Games, English Debates, *PuLSE* (or *Pursuing Life Skills in every Experience*) Celebration, and the End-Of-Year PL Awards Prize Presentation held on Friday, 23 Oct to celebrate student learning and successes, encourage our girls for their effort as well as inspire their peers.

5. Important End-Of-Year Plans, Dates and Activities

The school vacation will be from **21 Nov 2026 to 1 Jan 2027**. If you are planning for a family holiday, we appreciate that you plan it during the school holiday period. The last school day for the entire school is Friday, 23 Oct because the school will be used as a venue for the GCE O-Level written examinations. However, please note that:

- a. From Monday, 26 Oct, Sec 3 and selected lower secondary PL-Lites will have bridging lessons, preparing them for 2027.
- b. CCAs will continue 15 Oct – 20 Nov in anticipation of the early competitions in 2027. Some CCAs will resume from 21 Dec 2026. Details were shared with the last Principal's Letter to Parents.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all parents and guardians for your continued support as we begin the final school term of our 110th year. As we enter this last stretch together, I look forward to your continued partnership in supporting our girls and working together to bring the school year to a positive and safe close for all our students and their families.
