





CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE



FY2024 marked a year when the ethos of collaboration and cooperation in the intellectual property (IP) world stood in stark contrast to an increasingly fragmented world.

This was seen in the IP treaties, collaborations and cooperation programmes that continue to operate at the global, regional and local levels.

Collaboration as the Cornerstone of Innovation

As a small and open economy reliant on trade and an open global system, Singapore thrives on the seamless flow of ideas, goods, and services across borders.

In the last FY, the Intellectual Property Office of Singapore (IPOS) played a pivotal role in driving global, regional and local cooperation to support enterprises, creators and the IP community.

These efforts underscore the continued importance of maintaining open channels for the exchange of ideas, even—perhaps especially—during global uncertainties.

Milestones in Multilateral Cooperation

Last FY was marked by watershed moments in international IP cooperation with the conclusion of two landmark World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) treaties after decades of negotiation.

The WIPO Treaty on Intellectual Property, Genetic Resources and Associated Traditional Knowledge was a landmark treaty to address the interface between IP, genetic resources and traditional knowledge and the first WIPO Treaty to include provisions specifically for Indigenous Peoples as well as local communities.

Once it enters into force with 15 contracting states, the Treaty will establish a new and robust disclosure requirement for patent applicants whose inventions are based on genetic resources and/or associated traditional knowledge.

Singapore played an important bridge-building role to ensure a balanced treaty that is practical and implementable, including a clear and specific scope of disclosure that will govern the ownership and management of genetic resources and a rich corpus of traditional ideas and knowledge.

Similarly, the Riyadh Design Law Treaty (RDLT) makes it easier, faster, and more affordable for designers to protect their designs internationally and in home markets by streamlining national systems for registering designs. The IPOS delegation was part of efforts to conclude the RDLT after nearly two decades of negotiation.

These treaties, which have been years in the making, reaffirm the strength of multilateralism and collaboration in tackling global challenges despite diverse interests and priorities. In a fracturing world, such collaborations still showcase the ideal of what is possible when innovative countries and stakeholders come together to secure the collective interest.

SINGAPORE

as a Global IP Dispute Resolution Hub

In today's interconnected economy, IP disputes often transcend national borders, involving parties, evidence, and assets located in multiple jurisdictions.

Efficient, effective, and trusted cross-border IP dispute resolution (IPDR) mechanisms are critical for business certainty and confidence, supporting continued innovation and growth.

Singapore continued to strengthen its position as a global IPDR hub with its involvement in various global IP initiatives.

A key highlight was the "Intellectual Property & International Dispute Resolution - What Every Lawyer and Corporate Counsel Needs to Know" seminar series in New York in March 2025, jointly presented by Greenberg Traurig LLP, IPOS, WIPO Arbitration and Mediation Center Singapore Office, and Penn State Dickinson Law.

Bringing together global IP and legal experts to exchange insights on emerging IP and technological trends, this seminar series deepened partnership and collaboration and strengthened Singapore's role as a world-class venue for appropriate IP and technology dispute resolution. It is expected that Singapore's status as a centre for robust and effective alternative dispute resolution will continue to spur the growth of dispute resolution in the IP/IT space.

AI & IP

IPOS continues to closely watch AI developments as they challenge legal assumptions all around the world. Our policy approach has always been to stay nimble while promoting technological developments within ethical guard rails.

In 2024, IPOS and Singapore Management University (SMU) Centre for AI & Data Governance (CAIDG) issued a landscape report titled: "When Code Creates: A Landscape Report of Issues at the Intersection of Artificial Intelligence and Intellectual Property Law" which provides key insights on AI/IP issues across jurisdictions. Such studies enable us to keep abreast of the latest issues around the world surrounding AI, which will guide us in our policy formulation.

Conclusion

In the 2024 Global Innovation Index (GII), Singapore attained its highest ranking in over a decade to be the 4th most innovative country in the world. This is a testament to our steadfast approach to developing our innovation system and effective IP protection infrastructure, based on the strong collaboration between Singapore government agencies to make Singapore a thriving innovation hub.

Looking ahead, the global environment demands continued agility and adaptability. We must remain nimble and continue building on our strengths – trust, connectivity, expertise and thought leadership – to bring key players together in cross-border collaborations. By carving out a meaningful role for ourselves, we will stay relevant even in an uncertain world.

None of our achievements would have been possible without the support and collaboration of our partners and stakeholders in Singapore and across the globe - from government agencies and international organisations to industry associations and individual innovators. Thank you for joining us on this journey (that never stops) to help ensure Singapore continues to thrive as a global hub for innovation and IP in Asia and beyond.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S MESSAGE



In FY2024, IPOS continued to strengthen Singapore as a global IP hub to help drive innovation and economic growth.

Through strategic collaborations with regional and international partners, we expanded our reach and enhanced our services to better serve the business community in Singapore and across the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) region.

Deepening Ties Across the Region

Singapore continued to forge IP cooperation across the ASEAN region.

We supported the launch of the WIPO-ASEAN Mediation Programme (AMP+) to help businesses resolve cross-border IP and technology related disputes without resorting to lengthy litigation, saving time and resources while preserving business relationships.

The programme offers funding for IP and technology-related mediations administered by the WIPO Arbitration and Mediation Center Singapore Office.

We also worked with ASEAN partners to speed up the patent search and examination process for innovators who wish to file patents in the region.

For example, the new Patent Prosecution Highway arrangement with Intellectual Property Corporation of Malaysia (MyIPO) streamlines the patent examination process.

We also expanded our Collaborative Search and Examination (CS&E) network to include Indonesia, alongside our existing programme with Vietnam. The CS&E speeds up the patent search and examination process for innovators who wish to file patents in these countries.

The 3rd edition of the Singapore Patent Examiner Exchange & Development (SPEED) Fellowship was also held in Singapore to cultivate a stronger and more connected patent examiners community across the region. Fellows from Cambodia, Laos, Indonesia, and Vietnam exchanged insights to enhance their patent examination skills.

Forging Local Partnerships

During World IP Day 2024, we partnered with the Ministry of Sustainability and the Environment, the Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth, National Youth Council, TikTok and WIPO for a digital campaign on IP's role in driving sustainable development in Singapore.

We also held our signature global event IP Week @ SG 2024, with more than 5,000 participants from over 40 countries and 90 partners.

For the first time, we co-organised joint panel sessions with the Institute of Valuers and Appraisers, Singapore (IVAS) and the International Valuation Standards Council (IVSC) to highlight the growing importance of intangible assets disclosure, valuation and financing.

Enhancing Local Legislation

The Ministry of Law and IPOS also reviewed exceptions allowing access to digital copyright works and protected performances restricted by access control measures (ACMs) in 2024. The policy intent was to balance the need to protect creators while enabling access for those who use digital copyright works.

New exceptions now allow access to copyright works for specific uses relating to the use of assistive technologies to facilitate access to published works for persons who are blind, visually impaired, or otherwise print disabled as well as the preservation, replacement, and administration of materials in public collections. The regulations took effect from 1 January 2025 onwards.

Conclusion

As we look to the future, IPOS remains steadfast in our mission to build Singapore as a global IP hub. We will continue to strengthen our partnerships, enhance our services, and develop forward-looking policies that enable innovation and sustainable growth.

I extend my heartfelt appreciation to everyone in the IPOS Group and all our partners—government agencies, industry associations, businesses, and the IP community-for your continued collaboration and support.

FY24's achievements provide a strong foundation for our future efforts. With your continued partnership, I am confident that we will further enhance Singapore's position as a trusted global IP hub and create even greater value for our stakeholders in the years ahead.



LEADERSHIP CHANGES AT IPOS



FY2024 has been a significant year for the Intellectual Property Office of Singapore (IPOS). Beyond the milestones achieved in advancing our innovation economy and strengthening Singapore's global IP hub position, it has also been a time of leadership transition — a moment to honour and thank two distinguished individuals who have shaped the organisation's evolution: Dr Stanley Lai, SC, our outgoing Chairman and Mrs Rena Lee, our outgoing Chief Executive.

Serving as Chairman of the IPOS Board from 1 April 2013 to 31 March 2025, Dr Stanley Lai, SC played a pivotal role in guiding the transformation of IPOS into a world leading agency that supports Singapore's innovation economy. His leadership and unwavering commitment propelled Singapore to the forefront of Intellectual Property (IP) and innovation on the global stage.

Under his chairmanship, IPOS achieved significant milestones. The IP Hub Master Plan and the Singapore IP Strategy (SIPS) 2030 were launched in 2013 and 2021 respectively. IPOS was recognised as the most innovative IP office in the world by the World Trademark Review in 2020. Singapore consistently ranked highly on the Global Innovation Index (GII).

In 2024, Singapore maintained its position as the most innovative country in the South-East Asia, East Asia and Oceania region in the GII, and achieved its highest global ranking in a decade, ranking fourth globally. Dr Lai's tenure laid a strong foundation for IPOS's continued work to strengthen Singapore's position as a global intangible assets (IA) and IP hub.

Mrs Rena Lee was appointed as Chief Executive of IPOS on 1 August 2020. During her term, she led her team to elevate Singapore's position as a global IP and IA hub. Rena and her team drove the implementation of the SIPS 2030, supporting enterprises and the wider innovation community. She pushed significant legislative and policy reforms to the IP regime and continued efforts in international engagement with IP offices all over the world on issues relevant to the global IP ecosystem, including emerging issues relating to frontier technologies like Artificial Intelligence. She also led Singapore's delegations in treaty negotiations, contributing to the adoption of two new World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) treaties.










GLOBAL INNOVATION



The GII is a global ranking of the world's most innovative economies and published by the World Intellectual Property Organization. This year, the index used 78 indicators to track innovation trends in 133 economies.

Singapore topped 14 out of 78 indicators (up from 11), including government effectiveness, information and communications technology (ICT) access, unicorn valuations and venture capital (VC).

The ranking is based on two broad areas: innovation inputs and outputs. Innovation inputs refer to factors that enable innovative activities while innovation outputs refer to the actual results of innovative activity in an economy.

Singapore retained its top rank in innovation inputs, seeing significant shifts in sub-component indicators under Human Capital & Research and Business Sophistication - 'Education' improved by 7 positions (39th) and 'Innovation linkages' improved by 5 positions (7th) respectively.

We are encouraged by the steady progress in Singapore's journey as a global innovation hub, which is the result of joint efforts over the years across government, research, and business sectors to support innovation growth. The Singapore IP Strategy 2030 aims to continue broadening the scope of IP to the larger economy, into areas such as IP financing and commercialisation, to keep us on an innovation and business growth trajectory.

WIPO TREATY ON INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY,

GENETIC RESOURCES AND ASSOCIATED TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE

On 24 May 2024, the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) approved a treaty that will require patent applicants to disclose if their inventions are based on genetic resources or traditional knowledge of indigenous peoples. This landmark treaty is the conclusion of over 25 years of negotiations at WIPO, with Singapore playing an important bridge-building role throughout the negotiations to ensure a balanced treaty that is practical and implementable, including a clear and specific scope of disclosure. RIYADH DESIGN LAW TREATY

WIPO Member States reached agreement on 22 November 2024 on the new Riyadh Design Law Treaty (RDLT). This agreement is a game changer for designers as it will streamline, standardise and update the international design protection system, allowing creators and designers to better protect their designs and move them across borders.

This is another landmark achievement that affirms the value of multilateralism amid global challenges. We are proud that our Chief Executive Mrs Rena Lee and the Singapore delegation were part of finalising the RDLT, which will go towards enabling designers to better protect their creations, harness the power of their innovation, and grow. AI, NFTS AND CRYPTOCURRENCY -

HOW ARE THEY SHAPING AND BEING SHAPED BY IP AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION?



In conjunction with Greenberg Traurig LLP, the WIPO Arbitration and Mediation Center Singapore Office, and Penn State Dickinson Law, IPOS hosted a series of seminars in the United States (US) on 3 and 6 March 2025.

Drawing close to 900 registrants, this cross-border collaboration brought together global intellectual property (IP) and legal experts from Singapore and the US to discuss how IP and dispute resolution is shaping, and being shaped by, emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence (AI), standard essential patents (SEPs), non-fungible tokens (NFTs), and cryptocurrency.

Featuring keynote speeches from WIPO Director General Daren Tang, and then-Minister for Community, Culture and Youth and Second Minister for Law Mr Edwin Tong SC, participants gained insights on emerging trends and best practices amid the evolving challenges frontier tech brings.





GLOBAL KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE -

FEDERAL CIRCUIT BAR ASSOCIATION® (FCBA) GLOBAL SERIES 2024

The Federal Circuit Bar Association® (FCBA) Global Series was held for the first time in Singapore in October 2024. Part of an ongoing dialogue addressing emerging global challenges, it was an excellent opportunity for IP professionals in the US, Singapore and around the world to network and learn from one another, with panel discussions covering topics on intellectual property (IP) dispute resolution, Patent Office Perspectives, IP Treaty and International Trade Trends, and Patentable Subject Matter. IPOS was a sponsor for the FCBA Global Series Reception at the Supreme Court (SG Courts), and we thank FCBA for holding this important event in Singapore.





CUTTING-EDGE TECHNOLOGY RAISES THE BAR

FOR INTERNATIONAL DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Together with Maxwell Chambers, IPOS welcomed distinguished judges and guests at the Maxwell Chambers Open House on 29 August 2024 to discover the cutting-edge technology in our hearing services, including the Maxwell Visualiser (3D holographic TV display), VR headset, wide-screen virtual display setup, and Maxwell Onsite (drone service) to bring intellectual property (IP) and tech dispute resolution hearings in Singapore to the next level.





THIRD BELT AND ROAD HIGH-LEVEL CONFERENCE

ON INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY IN BEIJING

In September 2024, IPOS participated in the Third Belt and Road High-Level Conference on Intellectual Property in Beijing, where IPOS Chief Executive Rena Lee joined the panel discussion on enhancing product value through IP and accelerating its commercialisation through IP financing. She acknowledged the lessons learned from Singapore's IP financing journey, exchanged insights with fellow panellists, and shared Singapore's plans to continue engaging industry partners and empower more enterprises to unlock value from their intangible assets. The Belt and Road High-Level Conference on IP brings together many countries and IP ecosystem stakeholders at the global level, and IPOS is glad to have participated in all the three editions of the Conference. This is a part of our strong and longstanding IP partnership with China and especially important as we look at broader IP issues beyond protection, such as commercialisation and financing.

FASTER SPEED-TO-MARKET IN SINGAPORE

AND INTERNATIONALLY WITH MORE PATENT PROSECUTION HIGHWAY (PPH) PROGRAMME PARTNERS

IPOS signed agreements with the Institut National de la Propriété Industrielle (INPI) France and the Intellectual Property Corporation of Malaysia (MyIPO) on the Patent Prosecution Highway (PPH) programme, adding on to the current list of around 30 countries. Under the PPH programme, businesses and innovators can speed up patent applications and enjoy faster speed-to-market in Singapore and our partner markets globally, with increased likelihood of patent grant, faster first office action, and fewer office actions.

SINGAPORE AND BRAZIL ROLL OUT IP BUSINESS GUIDES

IN PORTUGUESE TO REACH MORE BUSINESSES

IPOS and Instituto Nacional da Propriedade Industrial (INPI) Brazil signed a new 5-year cooperation Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) that will benefit Brazilian and Singaporean innovators and businesses. A key initiative was the launch of business guides in Portuguese to reach out to the more than 265 million Portuguese speakers globally.





TRILATERAL TRADE MARK EXAMINER EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

WITH NEW ZEALAND AND AUSTRALIA

IPOS participated in the trilateral examiner exchange programme with the IP offices of New Zealand (IPONZ) and Australia (IPAU). This is part of a broader programme slated to take place over a three-year period (2024-2026), with each IP office taking turns to host two officers each year to exchange knowledge on trade mark examination practices, operational matters, recruitment and training strategies as well as operational enhancements and digital solutions. During the exchange which took place at the host office of IPONZ in June, the three offices collectively shared about their specific trade mark filing systems and office tools.

SWITZERLAND & SINGAPORE'S EMERGING IP-DLT REVOLUTION:

AN INTRODUCTION

Blockchain, or distributed ledger technology (DLT), has changed the way we transact and secure data. To learn more about the intersection of blockchain and intellectual property (IP), and its impact on IP protection, management, and commercialisation, IPOS published a joint chapter with the Swiss Federal Institute of Intellectual Property (IPI) capturing the key findings and reflections of our joint study, "Where Blockchain meets Intellectual Property". IPOS hopes that findings from this joint effort will enhance collaboration between blockchain and IP stakeholders and pave the way for more international partnerships between IP offices and emerging tech.

ENHANCED MEDIATION OPTIONS FOR BUSINESSES IN ASEAN

In July 2023, WIPO and IPOS introduced the WIPO-Singapore Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Mediation Programme (AMP) to offer a faster, costeffective mediation option that preserves business relations. AMP provides funding for IP disputes or commercial contract negotiations involving at least one ASEAN party which are mediated at the WIPO Arbitration and Mediation Center Singapore Office. Following the conclusion of AMP on 31 December 2024, WIPO and IPOS now offer AMP+, which offers new features such as allowing parties to appoint a mediator based in any ASEAN member state who speaks their preferred language.

FASTER IP PROTECTION IN ASEAN WITH NEW COLLABORATIONS

A new Collaborative Search and Examination (CS&E) programme between IPOS and Indonesia's Directorate General of Intellectual Property (DGIP) was launched on 2 January 2025. Offering businesses an accelerated patent search and examination process for patent applications filed in either country, this two-year pilot programme complements IPOS' existing collaboration with IP Viet Nam. GROWING IMPORTANCE OF SUSTAINABILITY-RELATED BUSINESSES

IN SINGAPORE & ASEAN



An IPOS study revealed that the number of green or sustainability-related trade mark filings increased steadily in the last decade (2014 – 2023), at almost three times the growth rate of total trade mark filings in Singapore. Titled the "Singapore Green Trade Marks Study", it further revealed that more than half of these green trade marks were for innovations related to 'Pollution control', 'Transportation' and 'Energy production'. Another study by IPOS' subsidiary, IPOS International, also revealed that there was a record high of 54,000 patent applications for green solutions in Southeast Asia in 2022, particularly in key sustainability areas such as digital technologies that improve connectivity and enhance urban efficiency. The report, titled "Southeast Asia Patent Landscape: Driving Sustainable Development Goals through Technological Innovation", was produced in conjunction with World IP Day 2024. ¹Green trade marks are defined as trade marks with at least one green term in their Goods & Services specifications. The classification is done based on the green expressions and methodology used by EUIPO's Green EU Trade marks study 2021 and 2023.

IP WEEK @ SG

Singapore's premier global IP event IP Week @ SG 2024 saw over 5,000 participants from over 40 countries involved in plenary discussions, meetings and associated events.

Covering a wide range of topics from IP to business, legal, finance and technology, the event also served as a melting pot where the global IP and business community came together to network.

This was the first time the event was organised in conjunction with the Singapore Convention Week 2024, a signature event focusing on dispute resolution, arbitration, mediation and litigation. IPOS also co-organised joint panel sessions with the Institute of Valuers and Appraisers, Singapore (IVAS) and the International Valuation Standards Council (IVSC) for the first time as part of IP Week @ SG 2024 and the IVAS-IVSC Business Valuation Conference 2024, highlighting the relevance of IP across various sectors.




