1. E-Waste Collection Drive@RGPS from 16 Sep 2026 (Wed) to 18 Sep 2026 (Fri)

We will be holding an E-Waste Collection Drive @ RGPS from 16 to 18 September as part of the School Recycling League 2026 which aims to build long term awareness and ownership among students as future environmental stewards.

Pupils can deposit their e-waste items at a designated area near the canteen drop-off point **before morning assembly from 16 Sep 2026 (Wed) to 18 Sep 2026 (Fri).**

We accept only non-bulky electronic products, regardless of brand, such as :

- Mobile phones, docking stations
- Laptops, keyboards, modems, computer mice, hard disk drives
- DVD players, MP3 players, remote controls
- Electronic gadgets, lithium ion batteries
- Cables, wires

Please note that we do not accept bulky items, such as the television, refrigerator and microwave oven.

Should you miss this period of E-Waste Collection Drive@RGPS, you are encouraged to continue to support the nation's E-Waste recycling programme. You may drop off your E-Waste at other recycling points to properly recycle your E-Waste.

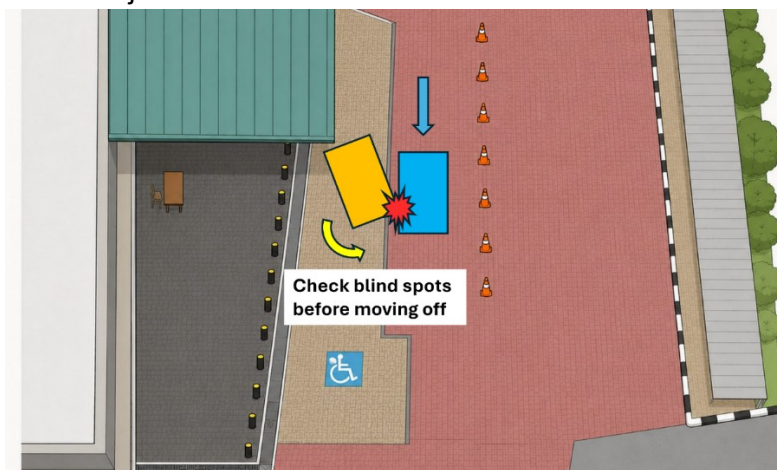
Through these experiences, we hope to nurture in our students empathy, care and a sense of social responsibility and encourage them to take meaningful action towards the well-being of others in our community.
