1. E-Waste Collection Drive@RGPS from 16 Sep 2026 (Wed) to 18 Sep 2026 (Fri)

We will be holding an E-Waste Collection Drive @ RGPS from 16 to 18 September as part of the School Recycling League 2026 which aims to build long term awareness and ownership among students as future environmental stewards.

Pupils can deposit their e-waste items at a designated area near the canteen drop-off point **before morning assembly from 16 Sep 2026 (Wed) to 18 Sep 2026 (Fri)**.

We accept only non-bulky electronic products, regardless of brand, such as :

- Mobile phones, docking stations
- Laptops, keyboards, modems, computer mice, hard disk drives
- DVD players, MP3 players, remote controls
- Electronic gadgets, lithium ion batteries
- Cables, wires

Please note that we do not accept bulky items, such as the television, refrigerator and microwave oven.

Should you miss this period of E-Waste Collection Drive@RGPS, you are encouraged to continue to support the nation's E-Waste recycling programme. You may drop off your E-Waste at other recycling points to properly recycle your E-Waste.

Programme for the day:

1. Children's Day Concert, Classroom Activity and Bonding Session

Students will enjoy a Children's Day concert and classroom activity, followed by an extended snack time and bonding session with their Form Teachers.

These activities aim to strengthen positive peer relationships and foster stronger teacher-student relationships.

2. Children's Day Classroom Activities and Community Chest Appeal

As part of the classroom activities, students will participate in meaningful experiences designed to help them better understand the needs and experiences of people with disabilities. Through these activities, we hope that our students will develop greater empathy and appreciation for the experiences of others and be inspired to contribute positively to the community.

The school will also be supporting the annual Community Chest fundraising campaign to support individuals and families in need. Students will receive a donation envelope on 1 October 2026. Participation in the donation drive is voluntary. Students who wish to contribute may return their sealed donation envelopes to their Form Teachers during their FTGP lesson in Week 4 (5–9 October 2026).

3. Learning Journeys (Learn and Bond@RGPS)

The school will be organising **four** learning journeys for your daughter/ward as part of our P6 Learn and Bond@RGPS Programme.

SCDF Responders Plus Programme (RPP)

We have arranged for our P6 students to attend the SCDF Responders Plus Programme at Bukit Batok Fire Station. This programme focuses on core lifesaving skills and essential emergency procedures with an emphasis on practical hands-on engagements. Our students will undergo practical hands-on training on three vital Emergency Preparedness (EP) skills known as the 'Triangle of Life'. This three-pronged programme comprises:

- Basic first aid,
- CPR-AED and
- Basic firefighting using fire extinguishers and hose reels

Dialogue in the Dark (DITD) Singapore

The students will also be going to Dialogue in the Dark Singapore at Ngee Ann Polytechnic where they will get to participate in a tour carried out in the dark to experience life as a visually impaired person. Each group will be accompanied by a guide to go through themed rooms that simulate familiar environments. This experience will help the students understand themselves better and increase their social awareness of people with visual and other impairments. It also offers a unique and effective platform to encourage and promote an inclusive society.

Animal Farm@ACT 3 THEATRE

The school has also arranged for a learning journey to ACT 3 Theatre. This immersive learning journey blends live performance, reflection and experiential learning. It is designed especially for Primary 6 students. Through this experience, students will be able to connect with ideas, values and emotions through story and character.

Every session includes a 30-minute theatre performance, a 30-minute behind-the-scenes question-and-answer segment with the cast and a 60-minute guided drama workshop. Students watch, think and participate as they explore how drama and theatre deepen understanding, empathy, and self-expression.

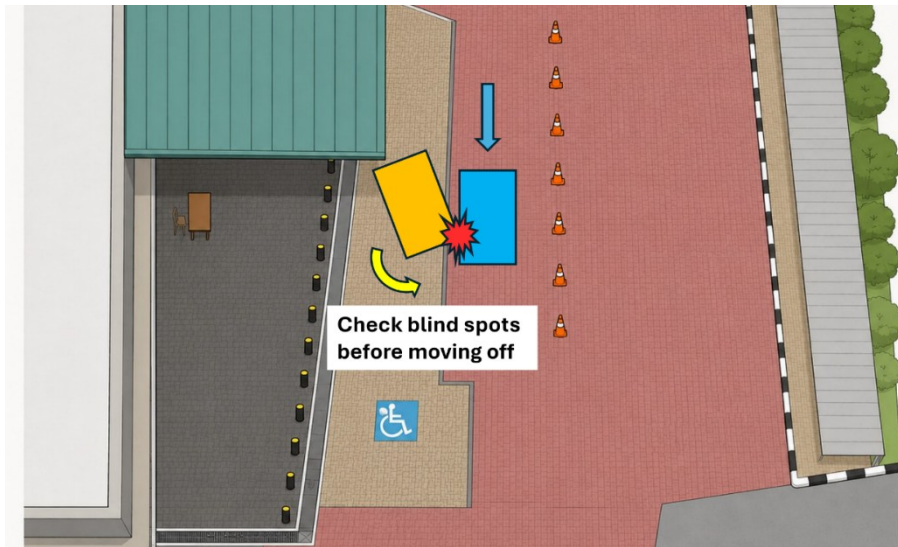
We will be conducting a briefing on the details of these learning journeys for our P6 students after the PSLE.
