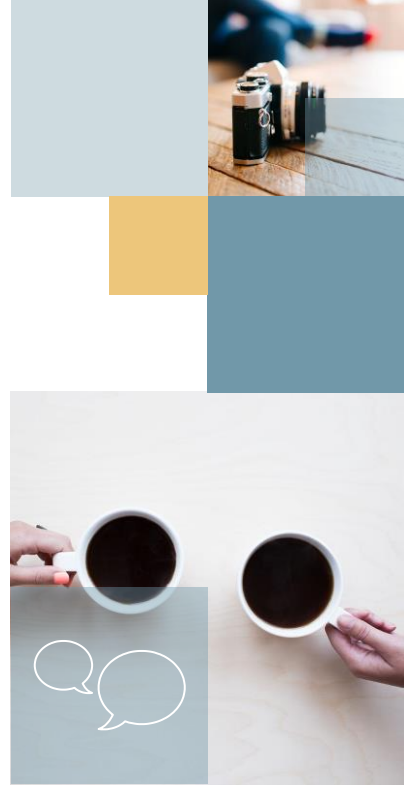

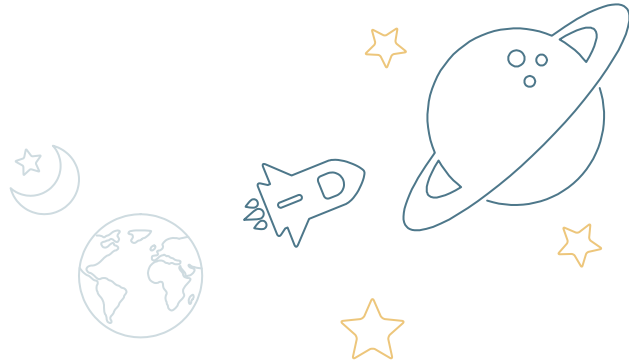

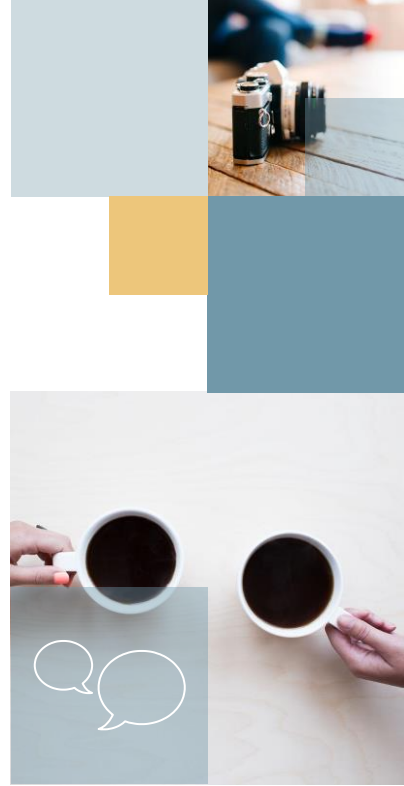
- ▶ stay open to the possible education and career pathways that are available and be flexible in discussing these pathways with your children and

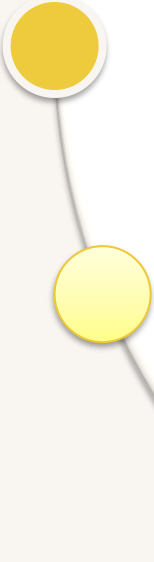

Tips for Parents to Initiate Conversations with Their Child

- ▶ What are your favourite subjects and Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs)? What do you like about them?
- ▶ How would you want to contribute to our community to make a positive difference?
- ▶ What are your goals and aspirations?

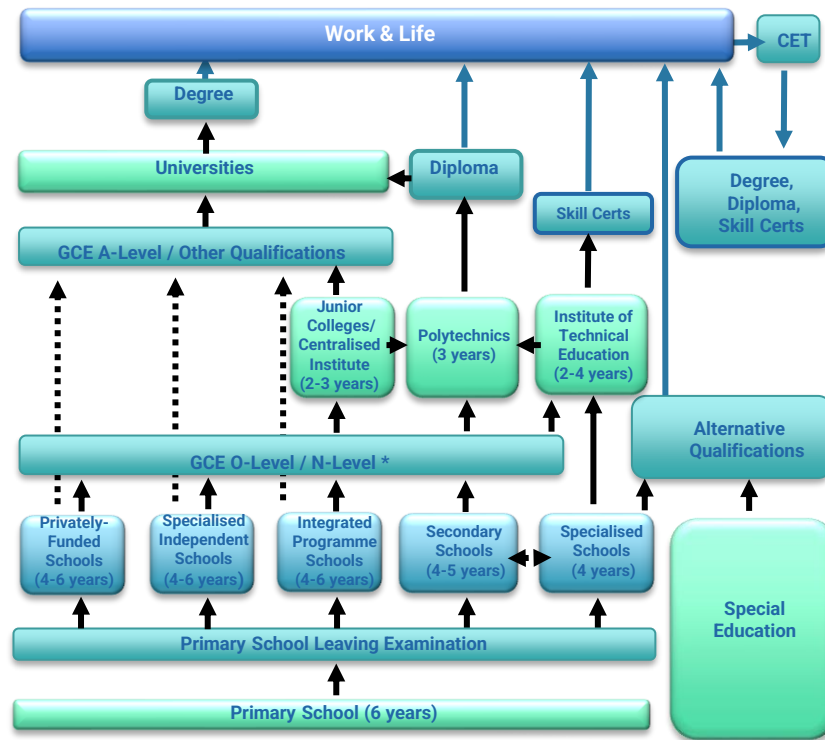
- Discuss with our children the different occupations and their contributions to society.
- Encourage our children to broaden their education and career possibilities.

- ▶ Which education institutions are you curious to find out more about and why?
- ▶ What information have you found about the industries or careers that you are interested in, including the education pathways leading to them?
- ▶ How do you think you can find out more about the education or career pathways you are interested in?

- Encourage our children to be adaptable and embrace lifelong learning as they seek to develop themselves.

- ▶ What are the setbacks/failures you have faced that taught you something? Can I share about a setback I experienced that helped me grow?
- ▶ What did you try that was difficult for you this week? What will you do to challenge yourself this month? *(You can make this a family challenge and get your children to ask you these questions too.)*

Explore Pathways: Singapore Education Landscape Overview

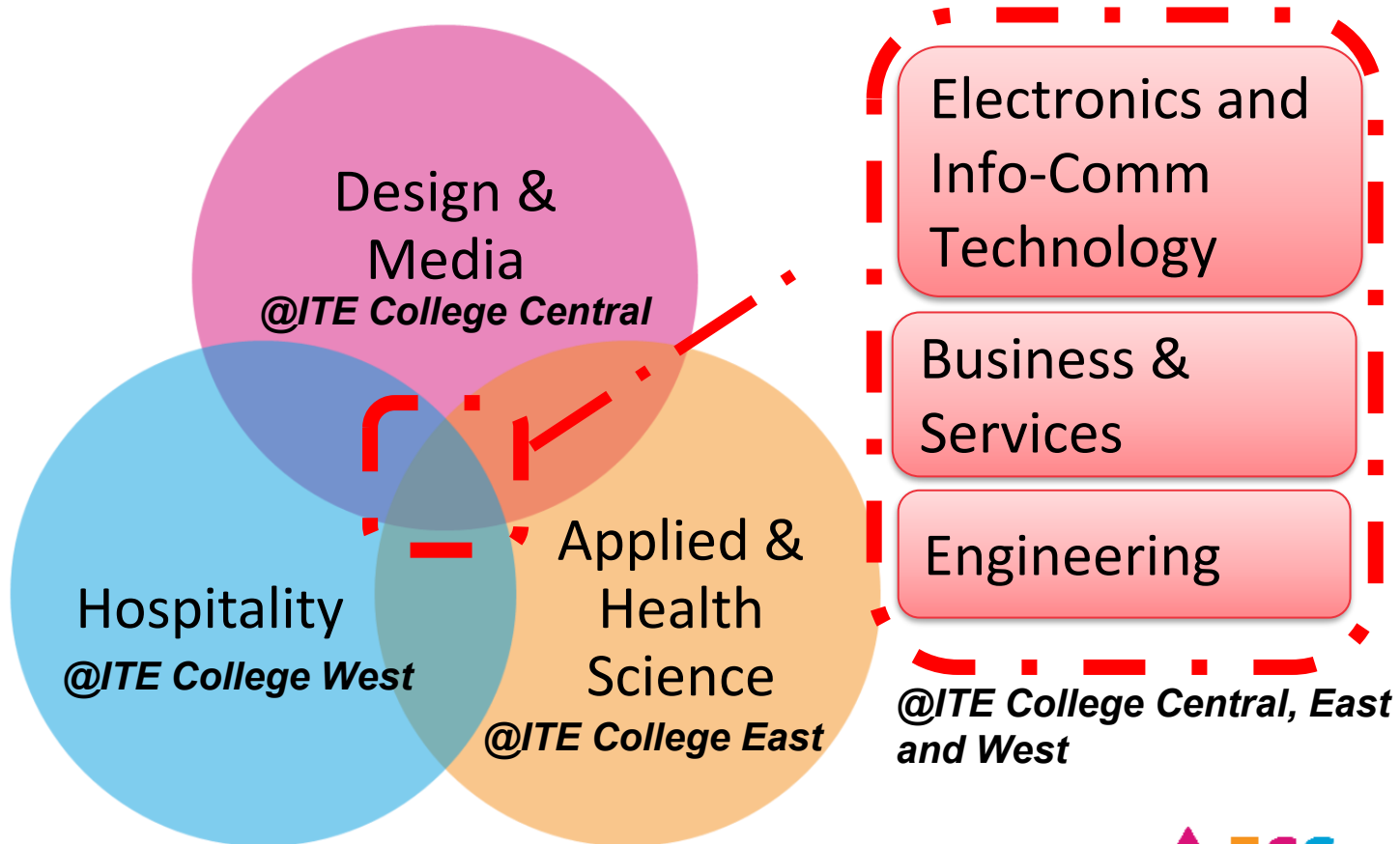

R4	Any best-scoring G3 subject except Religious Knowledge



There are some subjects at 'A' level where students will have to meet the stipulated requirements taken at SEC Level.
The requirements differ for each JC so please check the respective institutions' website for details.

Direct School Admission (DSA) JC/IB

- Allows student to **apply directly** to each JC and secure a place based on **talents & achievements** such as sports or performing arts
- Assessed through write-up, interview, portfolio, trial, audition
- If successful, student given a **conditional** offer before sitting for SEC.
- Student can accept **one** offer only
- **Honouring your commitment:** If acceptance is not cancelled by Oct deadline, student will not be eligible for JAE
- Offer is confirmed if student meets L1R5 ≤ 16 and subject requirements



DSA-JC – Direct School Admission for Junior Colleges

DSA provides students with the opportunity to seek admission to JCs based on a broader range of talents and achievements.

Poly Early Admission Exercise (EAE)

- Allows student to apply and secure a place in polytechnic based on course-related **interest & aptitude**
- Apply up to **three** diplomas in **order of preference** and provide one write-up for each course
- Assessed through interviews, portfolio, aptitude tests
- If successful, only **one** conditional offer is given
- **Honouring your commitment:** If acceptance is not cancelled by Oct deadline, student will not be eligible to change course or participate in JAE
- Offer is confirmed if you meet $\text{ELR2B2} \leq 22 + \text{MERs for the course}$



Polytechnic EAE – Polytechnic Early Admissions Exercise

Polytechnic EAE is an aptitude-based admissions exercise that allows students to apply for and receive conditional offers for admission to polytechnics prior to receiving their final grades. It allows students to demonstrate their aptitudes and interests apart from academic grades, thus allowing a wider range of talents to be recognised.

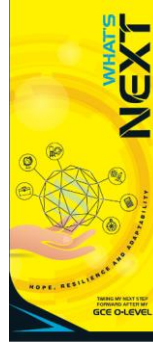
