Learning for Life: Cyberwellness Day

As advocates of Cyber Wellness, our Peer Support Leaders (PSLs) designed a class-based Assembly Programme titled "Real or Fake?" to equip students with the tools to discern fact from fiction.

NewTowners participated actively in a 'Mystery Case' group activity, where students went through several game levels related to fake news, such as "Real or Fake Headlines?" and "Real or Photoshopped?", to unravel the clues and find the culprit of the Mystery Case.

Students then worked together to ascertain the reliability of the witnesses' testimonies, and to evaluate and compare the suspects' arguments to make an informed decision on the identity of the culprit.

Through the programme, students have demonstrated improved media literacy skills and a heightened awareness of the complexity of news consumption.

Rooted in Research: Secondary 1 Geographical Investigation

In Term 2, our Secondary 1 students participated in a field trip to Berlayer Creek to investigate the sustainability of the mangroves at the creek.

The students started by examining water samples from the area. They checked the water's acidity level and measured the amount of oxygen in it.

They also observed how clear the water was and checked for impurities to determine if the water is suitable for plants and animals.

Next, they walked along the boardwalks to study the mangroves closely. They observed unique features of the trees.

Through their observations, the students recognised the vital role mangroves play in safeguarding our coastlines and providing habitats for marine life.

This field trip offered a practical extension to lessons and connected classroom teachings with the real world.

The trip also emphasised the importance of understanding and caring for our environment.

As the students progress in their studies, experiences like this highlight the importance of sustainability and making eco-friendly choices.

Building Our Own Solar Ovens

As part of a Weighted Assessment project, our students created innovative solar ovens to harness the power of the sun.

In the two-month long project, the students began by researching the principles behind solar cooking and the key factors influencing the efficiency of solar ovens.

The students experimented with different materials and configurations to maximise the performance of their solar ovens. Through trial and error, the students fine-tuned their designs in order to achieve the highest temperature in the oven.

The solar oven project not only taught students about the technical aspects, such as radiation, heat transfer, and engineering, it also provided invaluable lessons in problem-solving, communication, and a sense of responsibility towards the environment.

"We feel that solar ovens will definitely become a successful alternative if others continue to spread the word about it, and our earth will become a greener place." These were the reflections from S2-01 after they completed the project.

Building Our Own Water Filtration System

As part of our efforts to nurture the joy of learning science among our students, the Secondary One students embarked on a project to design and construct their personalised water filtration systems.

Through this project, students were able to appreciate water as a precious resource and understand the importance of using nature's resources responsibly and sustainably.

Over two months, students researched various materials suitable for effectively purifying muddy water. They then designed water filtration

prototypes using recycled plastic bottles and carried out tests on their filtered water to assess the effectiveness and usability of their water filtration systems.

The hands-on experience fostered teamwork, encouraged innovative thinking and enabled effective communication.

"We learnt to be resilient even when our filtration system filtered out murky water and we understood the importance of patience when working with each other." These are the thoughts from S1-05 on their journey in constructing the filtration systems.

To add another feather to their caps, they performed to over 2000 people at the West Coast Community Centre's National Day Celebration at Grace Orchard School at the end of August.

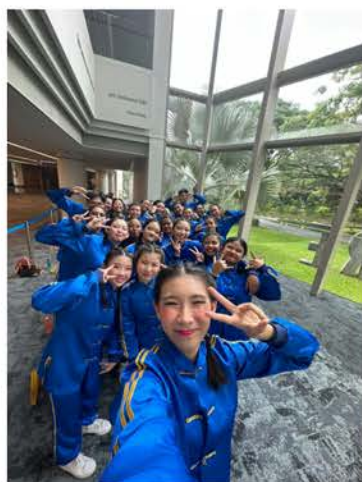
All these performance experiences have forged the team into a close knit group that supports each other without hesitation. 2023 has indeed been a rewarding year during which our team has grown as people and as dancers.

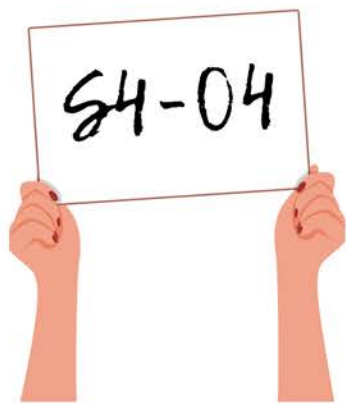
