Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome to the final term of 2026! We hope our students have had a restful break and are ready for the term. With your continued support in ensuring that your child gets enough rest, attends school regularly and arrives on time, we look forward to a positive and fulfilling Term 4 together.

1. **Safety and Administrative Matters**

Thank you to those who have submitted your child's/ward's 2026 September Holiday Travel Declaration.

If you have yet to submit the declaration, please submit the travel declaration via Parents Gateway (PG) > SERVICE > DECLARE TRAVELS by **Friday, 18 September**.

Please indicate the country and city of travel, including any city of transit, where applicable. Only one parent is required to submit the declaration.

If your child/ward did not travel during the holidays, no action is required. If travel plans changed after submission, please submit a new declaration via PG. For cancelled travel plans, please inform the school.

Preparations for End-Year Examinations

As our students prepare for the upcoming End-Year Examinations, we appreciate your support in helping your child/ward stay well rested, focused and ready for learning.

Some helpful tips:

- Plan regular revision with short breaks in between.
- Encourage an early bedtime and sufficient sleep.
- Balance play and leisure time with revision.
- Put away phones and digital devices at least two hours before bedtime.
- Avoid eating too late at night to support restful sleep.



2. Primary 6 PSLE Study Break for Students

To support the well-being of our Primary 6 students as they prepare for the PSLE, the school will have a three-day study break from **Monday to Wednesday, 21 to 23 September**.

During this period, students are strongly encouraged to remain at home for revision. The school will remain open for students whose parents/guardians are unable to make alternative care arrangements.

Selected students will be required to return to school for additional support, and their parents/guardians will be informed separately. Online consultation sessions have also been planned for the remaining students.

Students enrolled in the school-based Student Care Centre (SCC) may report to the SCC from 1.30 p.m. during the study break, should parents/guardians require the service.

3. Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE)

PSLE Listening Comprehension Examination will be held on **Tuesday, 15 September**. Primary 1 to 5 students need not attend school on this day. Primary 6 students have received further instructions on their reporting time for the examination.

The **PSLE Written Examination** will be conducted **from Thursday to Wednesday, 24 September to 30 September**. More information will be provided to Primary 6 students and parents nearer the dates. Here's wishing our class of 2026 all the best in the examination!

4. Semester 2 Home-Based Learning (HBL)

HBL aims to facilitate continuous learning while fostering student independence as self-directed learners.

Please refer to the Semester 2 HBL schedule. On **Tuesday, 15 September** and **Monday, 12 October**, Primary 2 to 5 students will engage in Home-Based Learning (HBL) and will not report to school. We seek your support in ensuring that your child/ward has the necessary learning materials and a quiet, conducive space to participate in their lessons from home.

5. Primary 3 to 5 End-Year Oral Examinations

Please refer to the schedule below for the oral examination dates. **The oral examination will be conducted after school in the afternoon.** Students will be tested in sequence according to their **index numbers**. As such, the time at which individual students complete their examination and are dismissed will vary.

Students may **leave school once they have completed their oral examination**. Please make the necessary transport arrangements for your child. Students enrolled in the Student Care Centre (SCC) will report to SCC after they have completed the oral examination.

6. Primary 3 to 5 End-Year Examinations (Written Papers)

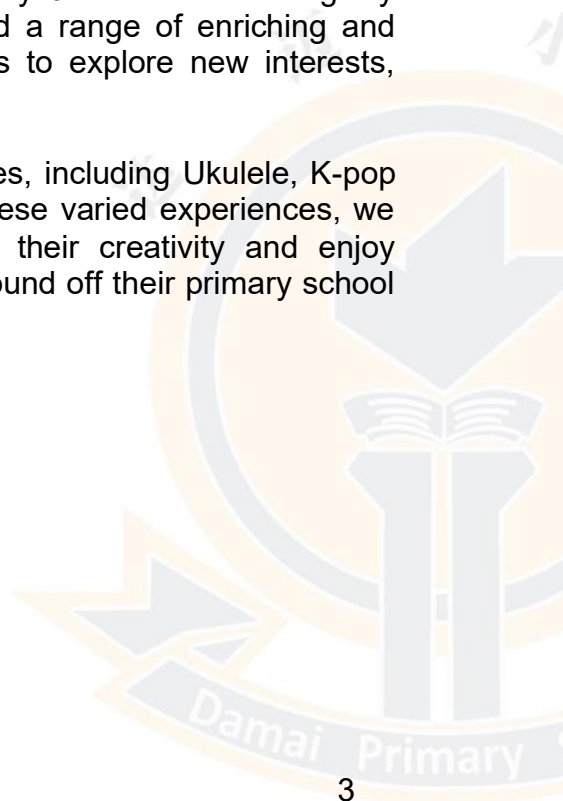
The End-Year Examination Schedules for Primary 3 to 5 have been issued to all parent/guardian. The End-Year Listening Comprehension Examination and Paper 1 for English Language and Mother Tongue Languages will be conducted on **Monday and Tuesday, 5 and 6 October** respectively. Primary 5 Higher Mother Tongue End-Year Examination is scheduled on **Wednesday, 21 October**. The remaining papers are scheduled from **Thursday to Tuesday, 22 October to 27 October**.

Please note that Primary 2 students do not have End-Year Examination.

7. Primary 6 Post-Examination Activities

Learning continues beyond the PSLE! To keep our Primary 6 students meaningfully engaged after their examinations, the school has planned a range of enriching and enjoyable activities that provide opportunities for students to explore new interests, develop new skills and learn beyond the classroom.

Students can look forward to an exciting line-up of activities, including Ukulele, K-pop Dance, Art Programme, AI for Fun, and more. Through these varied experiences, we hope our students will discover new interests, express their creativity and enjoy meaningful learning experiences with their peers as they round off their primary school journey.





8. **Children's Day Celebration and School Holiday**

Children's Day celebration will take place on **Thursday, 1 October**, and students **will be dismissed at 12.00 p.m.**

Students can look forward to a fun and meaningful morning of songs, games, class bonding activities and special treats such as popcorn and candy floss. The celebration is a wonderful opportunity for students to strengthen friendships, create happy memories and showcase skills they have learnt through their school experiences.

Students should report to school in their **PE attire and may wear sports shoes**.

Please note that **Friday, 2 October, is the Children's Day school holiday**, and students do not need to report to school.

9. **PSLE Marking Exercise**

PSLE Marking Exercise will take place from **Monday to Wednesday, 12 October to 14 October**. Students are not required to attend school as it will be closed during that period.

10. **School Admin Day**

All students **will not be required to attend school** on **Friday, 13 November**, as it is a day designated for teachers to complete students-related administrative work.

11. **Parent-Teacher Meeting**

The Term 4 Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM) for selected Primary 2 to 5 students will be held on **Thursday, 19 November**. During the session, Form Teachers will meet with parents to discuss their child's holistic growth and development over the year.

Parents of selected students will be informed by their respective Form Teachers of the scheduled time and mode of discussion.

We hope the PTM will provide meaningful insights into each child's progress and strengthen the partnership between home and school.

Please note that **all students are not required to report to school on Thursday, 19 November**.



12. Celebration of Learning

Following the introduction of our ***Celebration of Learning*** last year, the school will continue with this meaningful way of recognising our students' achievements and growth.

The shift from the former Prize-Giving Day to Celebration of Learning reflects our belief that success extends beyond academic results. While commendable academic performance remains important, we also recognise the Emerging 21st Century Competencies (E21CCs) that our students demonstrate in their learning. These include:

- **Critical, Adaptive and Inventive Thinking**
- **Communication, Collaboration and Information Skills**
- **Civic, Global and Cross-Cultural Literacy**

In line with this holistic approach, our award categories, including the Language Luminary Awards, Young Newton Awards and Resilient Learner Awards, continue to recognise a broader range of student strengths, positive learning dispositions and achievements.

Award recipients are identified based on a holistic consideration of their Conduct Grade, E21CCs and Academic Results. Subject teachers and Form Teachers jointly identify and shortlist potential recipients, with the respective Heads of Department leading the calibration and final selection through consensus discussions. This process helps to ensure that the selection is consistent, objective and reflective of each student's overall development throughout the year.

This year's Celebration of Learning will take place on **Friday, 20 November**. Only award recipients and selected students involved in the event are required to attend school. Award recipients will be notified via Parents Gateway, and their parents are cordially invited to attend the ceremony.

Students selected to perform at the Celebration of Learning concert, as well as student leaders assisting with the event, will also be required to attend. These students should report to school at the stipulated time communicated by their respective teachers.

Parents are kindly requested to make the necessary transport arrangements to ensure that their children have a safe journey home after the event.

13. **Edusave Award for Achievement, Good Leadership & Service (EAGLES)**

The **Edusave Award for Achievement, Good Leadership & Service (EAGLES)** is open to students who are Singapore Citizens.

For **Primary 1 to 3 students**, the award recognises those who have consistently demonstrated **exemplary conduct and 21st Century Competencies**.

For **Primary 4 to 6 students**, the award recognises those who have consistently demonstrated **exemplary conduct** and at least one of the following:

- leadership qualities;
- service to the school or community;
- excellence in non-academic activities; or
- 21st Century Competencies.

The 21st Century Competencies include **Critical, Adaptive and Inventive Thinking; Communication, Collaboration and Information Skills; and Civic, Global and Cross-Cultural Literacy**.

The EAGLES Award is presented at the community level, together with other Edusave awards such as the Edusave Scholarship, Edusave Merit Bursary, Edusave Good Progress Award, Edusave Character Award and Edusave Skills Award.

As we embark on the final term of the school year, we encourage all our students to continue giving their best, embrace every opportunity to learn and grow, and finish the year on a positive note. We look forward to a meaningful and fulfilling Term 4 for all.
