



## **CLINICAL INSTRUCTOR COURSE**

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### **Course Description**

The course aims to prepare and develop RNs with the knowledge, skills and attitude for an effective role in clinical supervision and assessment of pre-registration and post-registration nursing students.

### **Learning Outcomes**

Upon completion of this course, the learner will be able to:

1. Describe the roles and responsibilities of a clinical instructor in nursing
2. Discuss the principles of clinical supervision
3. Explore different learning styles and teaching strategies to meet students/learners' needs
4. Apply and facilitate reflective learning in practice
5. Discuss best practices in assessing and verifying students'/learners' clinical learning and achievement of expected competencies
6. Apply assessment methods used by various education institutions to achieve expected learning outcomes
7. Provide constructive feedback and encourage improvements
8. Apply tools to evaluate clinical learning environment
9. Apply best practices in communication skills with students, colleagues and other healthcare staff
10. Conduct clinical supervision of a group of students/learners
11. Manage common student/learner learning issues

### **Target Audience**

Registered nurses working in the clinical setting with a minimum of 3 years' clinical experience and a minimum of 1 year as a clinical preceptor; preferably possess an advanced diploma or post graduate diploma in nursing/equivalent for specialty areas.

Clinical practicum: 80 hours
