Introduction

The course covers the concepts, principles, and practices of clinical preceptorship in nursing. It provides participants with the essential knowledge, skills and attitude for the role of a clinical preceptor for newly recruited nurses and nursing students from pre-registration or pre-enrolment courses.

Aim

This course aims to prepare and develop nurses for their role in welcoming, integrating, supervising, facilitating and assessing nursing students to the team and place of work.
