## Course Objectives

- Perform and define key terms related to performing wound assessment
- Differentiate and manage wounds (e.g., pressure injuries, venous, arterial, diabetic) based on clinical presentation.
- Describe the function and appropriate use of different wound dressings and stoma care products.
- Assess the effectiveness of wound care interventions and identify when escalation is required.
- Communicate clearly and compassionately with clients, families, and interdisciplinary care teams to support optimal outcomes and client satisfaction

Lecture, group activities and discussions, practicum demonstration, case study.
