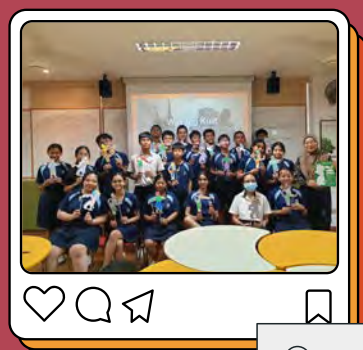
Chinese New Year Celebrations

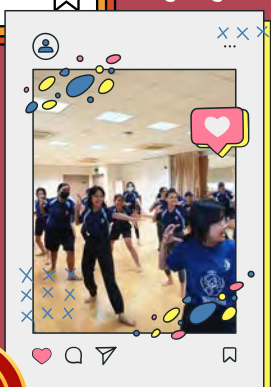

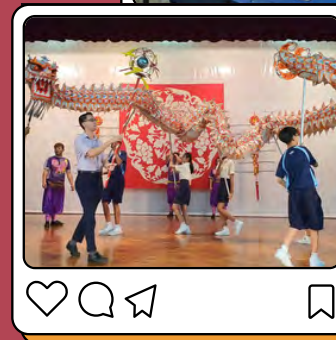


Mother Tongue Fortnight Programme

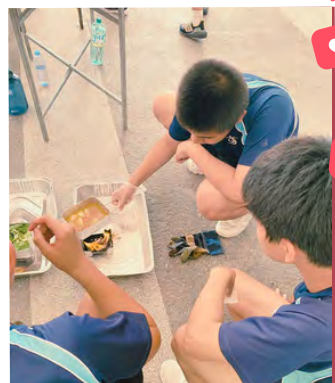
SEC 3 OUTDOOR ADVENTURE LEARNING CAMP

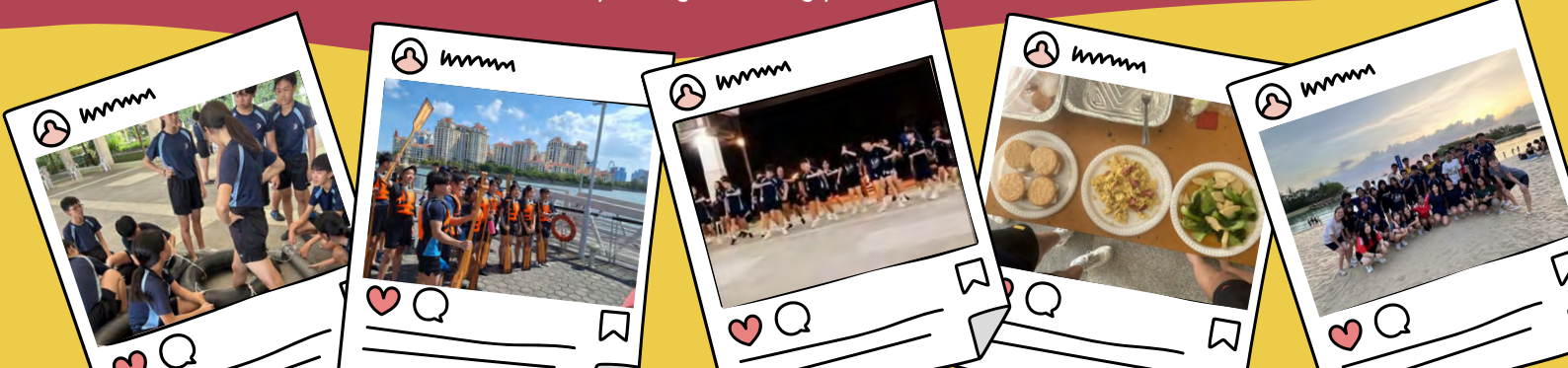

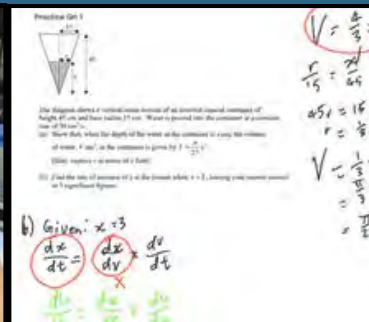


Dynamism and real-time feedback in Math!

To solidify their understanding of mathematical concepts, teachers utilised Kahoot!, an interactive learning platform, to craft quizzes. When the Sec 2 students delved into special algebraic identities, they engaged in a quiz tailored to identify and address any misconceptions they might have had. The gamification aspect not only motivated students but also encouraged healthy competition through the team-play feature, allowing them to collaborate and discuss before submitting their answers.



Furthermore, to enable students to showcase their workings and solutions using stylus pens, teachers embraced the use of Classkick. Through this application, teachers could gain invaluable real-time insights into students' progress, track individual performance, pinpoint areas of difficulty, and promptly intervene by offering immediate and tailored feedback to provide additional support.



Sustainability in Science!

Embracing hands-on learning, the Secondary 1 Hydroponics project offers a unique opportunity for students to explore the world of hydroponics and its potential in bolstering food sustainability in Singapore. Through this initiative, Sec 1 Xinmin students learn about various types of hydroponic systems available and how such technology contributes to Singapore's aim of locally producing 30% of its nutritional needs by 2030.

Students cultivated their own vegetables in dedicated hydroponics greenhouse, gaining firsthand experience in transplanting seedlings and relishing the satisfaction of harvesting their own produce. Beyond acquiring technical skills, the project aimed to instill a deeper appreciation for sustainable practices and inspire students to ponder on how scientific knowledge can be harnessed to shape a more sustainable future for Singapore.
