Conditions for Entry

	Audio, Photography & Videography Policy
1	No selfie sticks, gimbals, tripods and monopods.
	The following will not be allowed into the venue:
1	No Glass Bottles
2	Bags exceeding the dimension of 35cm x 20cm x 30cm (i.e., too large to be stored under a seat)
3	Noise makers including but not limited to air horn, whistle, etc.
4	Flags, placards with offensive slogans or advertisement
5	Fan boards sized bigger than 42cm x 29.7cm (ie. A3 sized)
	Others
1	Laptops & iPads will be allowed to be brought in
2	Umbrellas will be allowed to be brought in

List of Prohibited Items

1	Firearms/Parts of Firearms, including empty magazines and spent cartridges (with percussion cap attached) etc
2	Live Bullet/Blank
3	Air Pistol/Rifle or parts
4	Spear Gun
5	Explosive/Blasting cap/Dynamite/Corrosive Substance
6	Fireworks/crackers
7	Parang/Machete
8	Bearing scrapper
9	Walking Stick with Dagger
10	Antique Pistol/Gun
11	Stun Gun
12	Baton/T-baton
13	Night Stick
14	Signal Flare and other Flammable materials
15	Handcuff
16	Tear-Gas Spray/Pepper Spray
17	Nunchaku
18	Knuckle Duster
19	Cross Bow
20	Industrial Acid
21	Bullet Proof Vest
22	Key Chain (Bullet/Gun)

23	Wooden/Metal Spear

27	Any sharp items that can be used as a weapon
28	Canned Items – Not allowed to be brought in by individuals
29	Prohibited Tobacco Products, e.g. Electronic Vaporisers
30	Radio transmitting devices and accessories
	Additional list of prohibited items for venues declared under Enhanced Security Special Event (ESSE)
1	Any noxious or offensive substance
2	A marine flare and signal, landing flare, highway fuse, smoke generator, distress signal or other pyrotechnic device intended for signalling, warning, rescue or similar purposes
3	Any petroleum or flammable material within the meaning of the Fire Safety (Petroleum and Flammable Materials) Regulations (Rg 7)
4	An explosive within the meaning of the Arms and Explosives Act 1913
5	Any arms within the meaning of the Arms and Explosives Act 1913
6	An item capable of attaching a person to an object or another person, or preventing removal of any locking or connecting device
7	An aerosol paint container or other implement or substance that is capable of being used to mark graffiti
8	Any sound amplification device, such as a loud hailer
9	Any banner, flag, placard, apparel, umbrella or inflatable object with any message or image that can be used in any assembly or procession that is unlawful
12	Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS) flying or on ground including accessories and payloads
