5. President's Challenge

On 1 July 2026, we organised our annual signature Values-in-Action event - Sell and Raise – where our P4 SKLites showcased their entrepreneurial spirit by turning their creative ideas and unique products into sales. They also had the opportunities to pitch their creations to peers and develop confidence and communication skills in an authentic setting. Proceeds raised through their sales were donated to the President's Challenge.

We are pleased to share that we raised a total of \$2,649.40. A heartfelt thank you to all parents, SKLites, staff and visitors for your generous support and purchases. Your kindness and encouragement made this event a meaningful success while inspiring our students to make a positive difference in the community.

6. Learning Progress

Assessment forms an integral part of our teaching and learning journey. Our P1 and P2 SKLites will continue with holistic assessments designed to offer meaningful formative and developmental feedback. Our P3 to P5 SKLites will sit for their End-of-Year Examinations while our P6 SKLites will take their PSLE this term.

We encourage you to guide your child / ward in managing their time effectively as they prepare for these assessments, while ensuring their well-being. They should remain focused on their personal goals and strive to achieve the targets they have set.

7. Home-School Partnership

We would like to thank you for being supportive parents as we continue to work together to develop confidence and resilience in your child / ward. Here are a few tips we would like to share with you to help nurture a growth mindset:

- Acknowledge your child's / ward's hard work and dedication, rather than focusing solely on his / her achievements. Engage him / her in thoughtful self-evaluation, as this approach fosters adaptability, enhances critical thinking skills, and builds essential competencies for his / her future success whilst nurturing a growth mindset.
- Allow your child / ward to experience setbacks during his / her study sessions without intervening immediately. Encountering difficulties and learning from these experiences form an essential component of his / her learning journey and personal development, reinforcing the growth mindset that challenges lead to improvement.

Your child's well-being is also critical during this period. A balance of rest, exercise, healthy eating and positive social interaction need to be in place as well. To help your child / ward get sufficient rest, we strongly recommend sending your child / ward to school no earlier than 6.45 a.m. This would also provide time for your child / ward to have their breakfast at home.

8. Term 4 Check-in Survey

Our Term 4 Check-in Survey will be conducted from Friday, 11 September to Thursday, 17 September 2026. The survey aims to help us better understand our SKLites' well-being. Teachers will assign the survey via Student Learning Space (SLS) for P3 to P6 SKLites and through Parents Gateway for P1 and P2 SKLites. We encourage parents/guardians to remind your child/ward to complete the survey when it is assigned.

9. Partnership in Teaching Responsible Use of Public Spaces

We have received feedback from residents regarding students playing football at the void decks near the school after school hours. While we recognise the importance of students spending time with their friends and engaging in physical activities, we have reminded them that void decks are shared community spaces and that their activities should not cause inconvenience or disturbance to residents.

As part of nurturing our SKLites to be responsible and considerate members of the community, we have reinforced during morning assemblies the importance of showing respect for others and using shared spaces appropriately. We seek parents' support in reminding your child / ward to be mindful of their behaviour after school and to choose appropriate places for recreational activities. We also encourage parents to be aware of and monitor their child's / ward's whereabouts after school, particularly when they are not returning home immediately after dismissal.

10. Road Safety

We are pleased to share that Land Transport Authority (LTA) has recently completed enhancement works along Compassvale Walk to improve safety in the school vicinity. The works include the construction of a kerbless crossing and a centre divider, which will help to better manage traffic flow and create a safer environment for our students, parents, and members of the public travelling along this stretch.

We would like to take this opportunity to express our heartfelt appreciation to our School Advisory Committee member, Mr Sean Tang, for his invaluable efforts in working closely with LTA to bring these improvements to fruition. His dedication to the well-being of our school community has made a meaningful difference, and we are grateful for his continued support.

While these enhancements go a long way in improving road safety, we would like to remind all parents / guardians to exercise caution and slow down when driving in the school vicinity, especially during drop-off and pick-up hours. The safety of our students remains a shared responsibility, and your cooperation in observing safe driving practices is greatly appreciated.

11. Haze Management

We would like to assure parents / guardians that we are closely monitoring the haze situation and have ensured that we have sufficient air purifiers in our classrooms. Should the 24-hr Pollutant Standards Index (PSI) level exceed 100, the following safety measures will be implemented:

- i. Use of air purifiers in classrooms
- ii. Visual checks on well-being of students
- iii. Students with pre-existing lungs or heart conditions will be excused from outdoor activities and physical exercise
- iv. Intensity of physical exercise / activities will be reduced

If your child / ward has pre-existing lung or heart conditions, we seek your cooperation to ensure that your child / ward carries his / her medication to school daily.

12. New Halal Noodle Stall

We are excited to share that a new Halal noodle stall will be opening in our school canteen from 14 September 2026. The stall will offer a variety of noodles dishes, including Tom Yum Noodle Soup, Hor Fun, Fried Kway Teow, and Fishball Noodle Soup. With this new stall, our SKLites can look forward to a wider selection of food options during their recess and lunch.

13. Creating a Conducive School Environment

We are deeply committed to creating a conducive environment where our SKLites can thrive and strive for excellence. To this end, we have embarked on several facilities upgrading projects, and will continue to invest in improvements that directly benefit the learning experience of every SKLite.

To enhance classroom comfort, the school has been installing additional fans and replacing existing lights with LED lighting across all classrooms progressively to ensure a cooler and more comfortable learning environment. The new lightings will provide better illumination. Looking ahead, air-conditioning is scheduled to be installed in the Multi-Purpose Hall later this year, further enhancing the spaces where our SKLites gather, learn and grow.

We are also excited about ongoing efforts to reimagine key communal spaces, including our canteen, foyer and library. These spaces are being thoughtfully refreshed to better serve our SKLites, and we look forward to sharing more details as the works progress. SKLites can look forward to a wide range of engaging activities in these revitalised spaces when they are ready.

14. Opening of The Cosy Cockpit

We are pleased to introduce *The Cosy Cockpit*, a new student lounge that provides a safe and engaging space for SKLites to relax, interact and build positive relationships during recess and after school. *The Cosy Cockpit* supports our school's inaugural rewards-based programme, where SKLites can earn opportunities to access the space by demonstrating positive behaviour, putting in consistent effort and making good choices. Through this initiative, we hope to motivate our SKLites to strive towards positive goals while strengthening their peer relationship and social-emotional competencies in a supportive environment.

15. Post PSLE Activities

Following the PSLE, our Primary 6 SKLites will take part in a range of meaningful and engaging activities designed to enrich their learning and prepare them for the next stage of their educational journey. The programme will provide opportunities for SKLites to explore technology and innovation through activities such as AI for Fun and the Drone Xperience; develop physical and social well-being through SwimSafer, the Sports Education Programme and inter-class games; and strengthen their digital literacy and cyber wellness through ICT and Cyber Wellness programmes. SKLites will also participate in Secondary Schools outreach programme. Through experiences such as the Social Studies Fiesta and Innovation and Advocacy Festival, we hope to provide our SKLites with a meaningful and memorable conclusion to their primary school journey.
