① Gek Poh-Tawas Bridge



Start at the Gek Poh-Tawas Bridge, near Blk 864A Jurong West Street 81. As Jurong West's first and widest cyclist-friendly bridge, it connects residents across PIE to the green spaces and job opportunities in CleanTech Park. Alongside the upcoming Sky Corridor and Tawas Station, the bridge will enhance accessibility of the area.

② The Potter's Garden



Coming down from the bridge, visitors will be greeted by a view of the lush Potter's Garden (formerly Jurong Eco-Garden). Nestled within the industrial estate, the garden features fitness corners, a playground, as well as a butterfly garden. The bio-swales and detention pond not only manage rainwater naturally, but also attract different species of birds to the garden, making it a suitable place for bird-watching.

③ Thow Kwang Pottery Jungle



Connected to the Potter's Garden is the Thow Kwang Pottery Jungle, home to Singapore's oldest and only operational dragon kiln. Step inside the studio to explore the expansive collection of handmade pottery or attend their occasional ceramics workshops in a rustic, nature-filled setting.



④ JTC CleanTech Three



Located next to Thow Kwang Pottery Jungle, CleanTech Three is the latest addition to CleanTech Park. It features eight lab blocks and one office block with fully customisable spaces for clean tech, urban solutions, and advanced manufacturing. Notable firms like machine tool builder Makino have a presence here. The buildings' earthy tones are also inspired by the traditional pottery heritage of the area.

⑤ Summit Forest



Through a flight of stairs beside CleanTech One, visitors can access the peaceful Summit Forest that features a look out point and a sculpted maze. A little-known fact – the rocks comprising the lookout were dug up from the depths of the Jurong Rock Caverns!

⑥ Surbana Jurong Campus



Across the Summit Forest is Surbana Jurong (SJ) Campus, the global headquarters of the urban solutions and engineering company. Designed as a "campus in nature", the building's use of green technologies and collaborative spaces aligns with JID's goal of building a future-ready ecosystem. The campus also has green indoor spaces open to the public. Step outside from the other end and you will see Tawas MRT Station under construction, which will be a 5-minute walk from the campus when ready in 2027.
