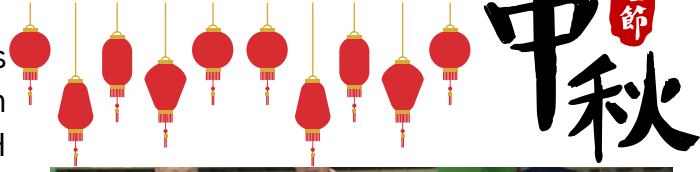
Performance at Singapore Buddhist Lodge (14 Sep 2024)
