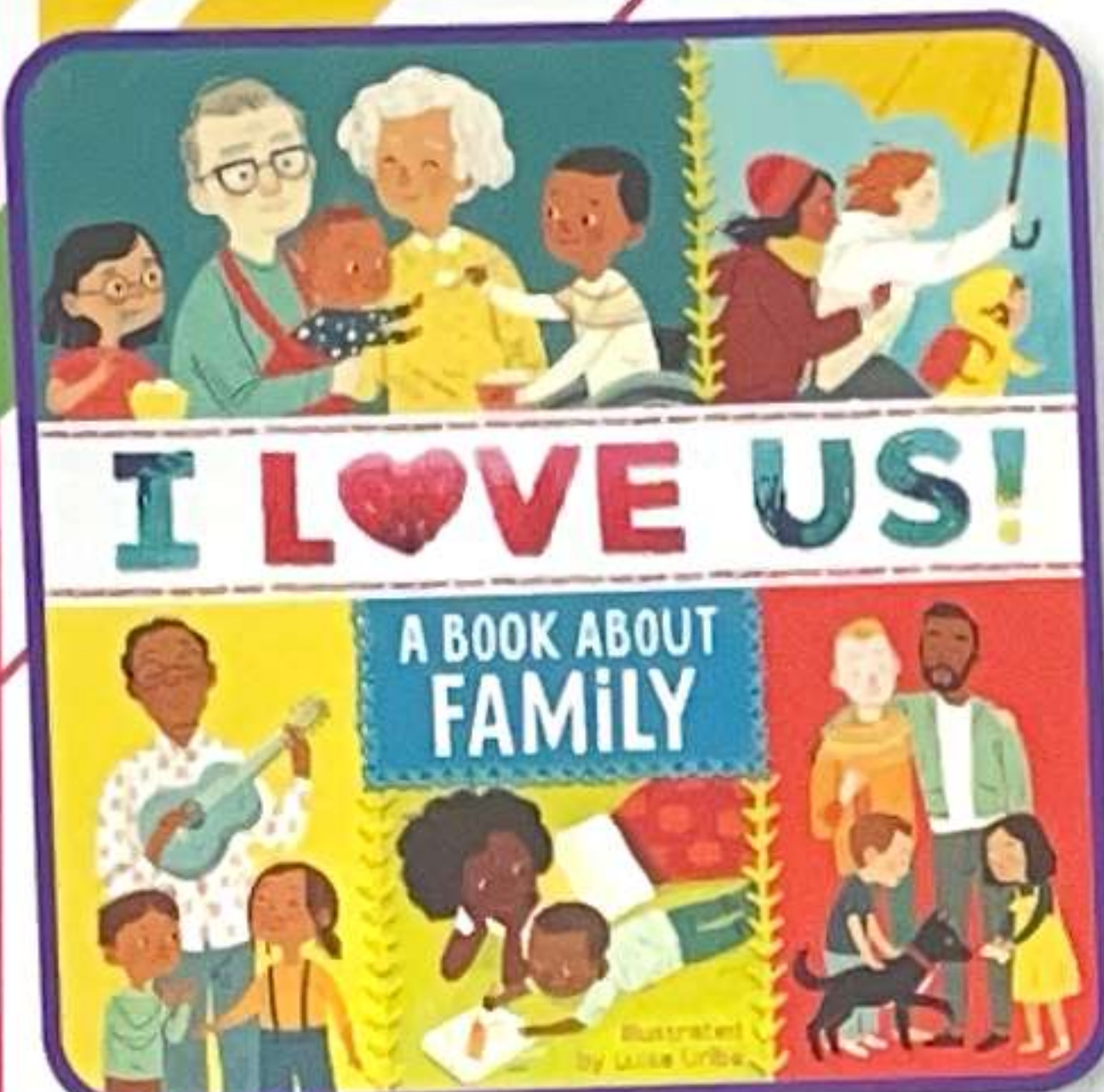

Start Small Dream Big with Kindness

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MK's Family Day: Pass It Forward

Our MK recently held its annual Family Day, coinciding with the finale of the Start Small Dream Big (SSDB) project, 'Pass It Forward'. The event centered around the theme of expressing appreciation through the 5 Love Languages, encouraging children to show appreciation for their families.

Preparation for the event began weeks in advance, with children reflecting on the love and kindness they receive from their families. They then explored various ways to express gratitude, aligning with the 5 Love Languages concept. In anticipation of the event, the children crafted personalised gifts and practised simple hand massage techniques to share with their loved ones.

The event kicked off with a special appreciation session for the Parent Support Group, acknowledging their invaluable contribution to school events throughout the year. Families then embarked on various interactive stations, each designed to highlight a different aspect of love and appreciation.

At the Gifts station, children presented their handmade creations to their parents, alongside goodie bags promoting healthy family habits. The Words of Affirmation area provided a photobooth with props encouraging expressions of gratitude, while families penned heartfelt notes to adorn 'Appreciation Trees'.

The Acts of Service station saw children preparing and serving fruit yogurt parfaits to their parents, while the Physical Touch area transformed into a mini spa. Here, children treated their parents to hand massages and manicures, using provided lotions and nail buffs.

The Quality Time station brought families together for 'A Healthy Meal' relay game, where they collaborated to select and sort ingredients according to the Healthy Plate model, reinforcing both teamwork and nutritional awareness.

This event not only celebrated the completion of the SSDB project but also provided a platform for families to bond, express love, and create lasting memories. Through these engaging activities, MK's Family Day highlighted the importance of gratitude and the various ways we can show appreciation to our loved ones.

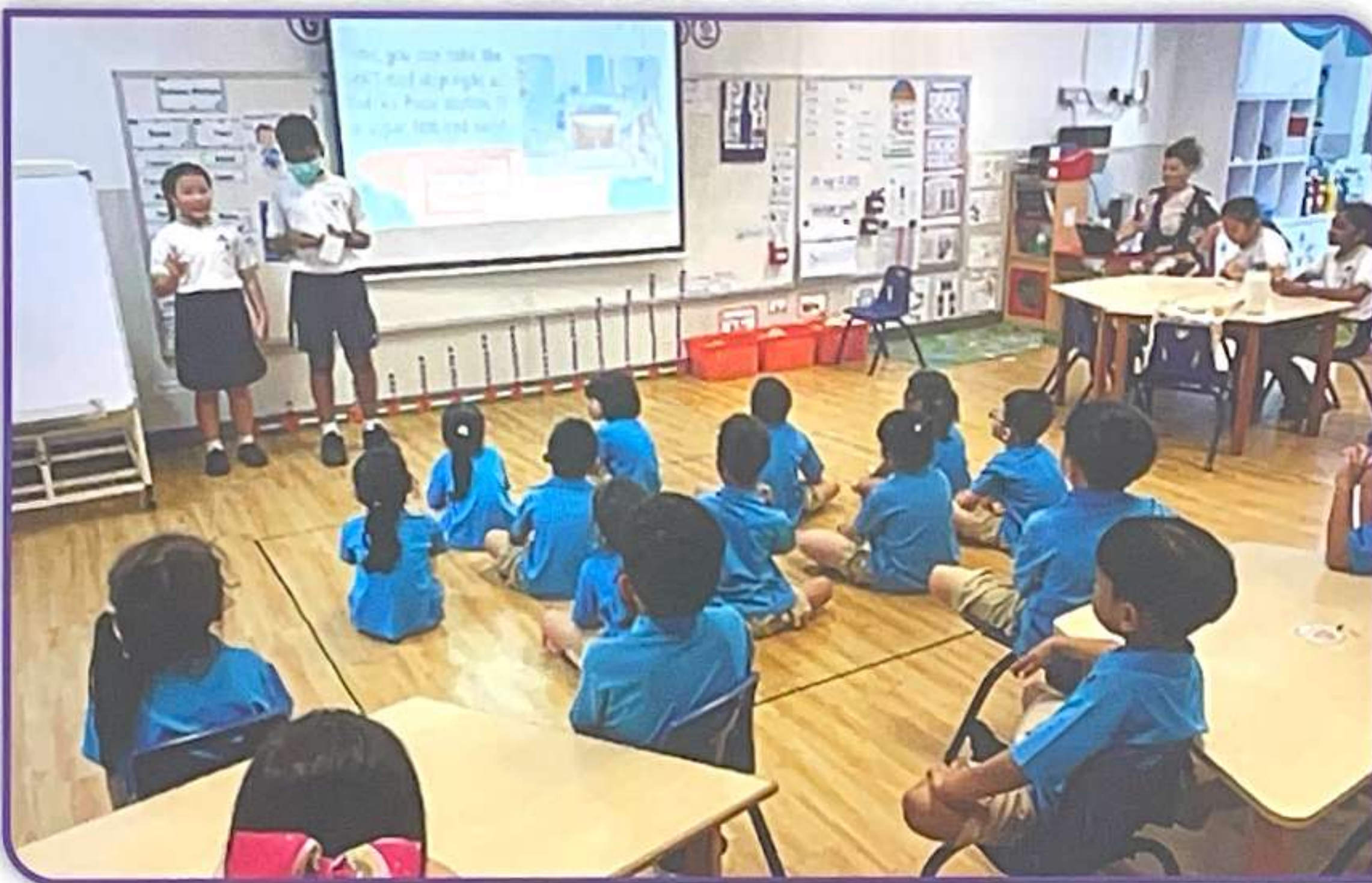

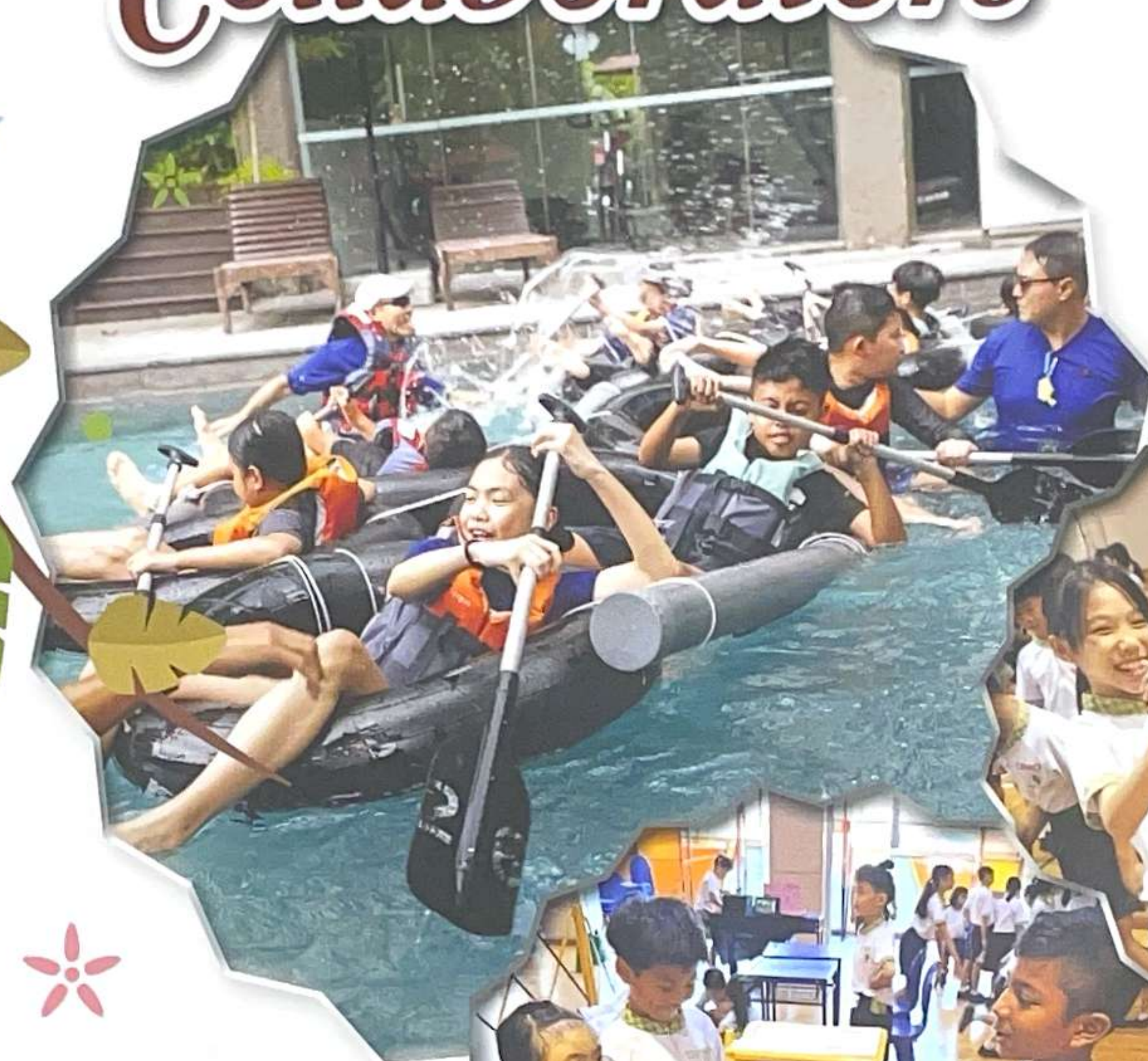

During our Total Defence Day celebration, the children explored the six pillars of Total Defence through hands-on activities, discussions and games, learning that everyone has a part to play in keeping Singapore safe, strong and united.

The celebration featured engaging activities for each pillar of Total Defence. The children created their own obstacle course and went through it to experience the importance of staying fit and ready as part of Military Defence.

For Digital Defence, children explored making smart and safe choices online through picture scenario cards and discussions, learning to be careful, alert and responsible with digital devices.

Economic Defence brought a strong message during snack time, when children experienced resource shortages by washing hands from buckets and eating without fans, helping them appreciate the importance of using resources wisely.

Meanwhile, Civil Defence had children dressing as community helpers, participating in treasure hunts to find profession-linked tools, and exploring an ambulance up close.

Social Defence came alive through the "Cross the River" teamwork game, while Psychological Defence featured a "Blind Walk" activity that helped children build trust and courage together.

Through reflection at the end of the celebration, the children realised that even young learners can defend Singapore by staying fit, being smart online, valuing what they have, and standing united.
